

SPOTLIGHT



In the fall of 1957, three couples: Ed and Doris Haddleton, Fred and Dot Retailick, and Bernie and Jean Boulet, who had been enjoying Western Square Dancing with the Genesee Dancers, decided to start a local group in Greece. They recruited new members mostly from Rye Road, Holmes Road, and The Greece Baptist Church (where they held their first dances). Bernie Boulet was instrumental in organizing, instructing, and calling for the new club.

In January 1958 the new Belles & Beaus club was formally organized with elected officers. The first Presidents were Fred and Dot Retallick, who served for two years. "Tink" Tinkler called alternately with Joe Riley on Monday nights. They had six squares in the beginning, teaching a new class every six weeks. Special dances with guest callers were the fourth Friday each month for a couple of years, some of whom were: Mike Stark, Frank Gillig, Al Brundage, and Herb Suedmeyer. Later their special dances occurred 4 or 5 times a year with national callers Gloria Roth, Marshall Flippo, "Singing Sam" Mitchell, or Curley Custer.

Art Harris began to call in 1959 alternating with "Tink". Soon Art became our regular caller for Monday nights, and instructed new classes in both rounds and squares. He's called for us 30 years and been a very popular caller for many area clubs, including the Genesee Dancers and EKCO Squares. At one time he was calling seven nights a week. Last year his son, Mike, took over the Wednesday night class instruction. Mike is an excellent caller.

Over the years there have been many changes. The six week classes soon reached thirty weeks as more basics were added. The location changed from the Greece Baptist Church to West Ridge School and then to Holmes Road School Instead of national callers, popular local callers were invited as guest callers.

In addition to dancing, other special events have become annual events, increasing the sociability. These include Scotch Golf, Friday Night Golf League, Steak Roast, Halloween Party, Car Rally, Christmas Party, Valentine's Day Class/Club Pot Luck Supper, and the Trail End Dance.

One thing that has never changed is the continuing emphasis on <u>fun</u> rather than perfection. We dance on Monday nights from early in September to Trail End in May. We dance the Mainstream program with many Plus calls. We have Guest Nights four times a year with four area clubs invited to join us for free dancing. Our members have the unusual privilege of paying an annual fee and then dancing free all year. We maintain an average of eighty couples as members each year.

Ed and Doris Haddleton are charter members and are currently serving their second term of office as presidents. Harold Abberger is the Club Historian. He and his wife Frances, John and Marian Butler, Don and Mary Waterman, and John and Ruth Gosling have all been continous members for over 25 years and all have served as officers. Joe and Marge Hurley, Sep and Mert DiLauro, John and Barbara Down, Chet and Betty Selbert, and Bill and Marilyn Walker have been continuous members for over 20 years and also have held office. It is a healthy club that has many loyal workers.

In addition to calling, I also enjoy playing the bagpipes with the Rochester Scottish Bagpipe Band.

We live in Chili with our children, Erica - 12, and David - 9.

I work full time for Eastman Kodak, and Shirley is employed part-time by Rochester Community Savings Bank. Our phone number is 889-3011.

ROUND DANCING HAS COME A LONG WAY

Back in 1972, Nora and I first got interested in Round Dancing. Although Round Dancing was "born" long before we became involved, I truly feel that we have seen it "grow up" during the past fifteen years. Most of the Square Dance world doesn't really know much about Round Dancing beyond what they see at a Square Dance club. In this article, I hope to provide some additional insight into the world of Round Dancing.

So often, what one dancer calls "easy" another dancer thinks is "intermediate" or even "advanced". Below, I will try to explain the various levels of Round Dancing in general, and how the level of a specific dance is determined. I will also propose a means of labeling that I would like to see used on flyers, in schedules, and for discussion to describe the level of

dancing for any Round Dance event.

In general, we have used the terms "easy" (or Square-Dancer's Rounds), "Intermediate, and "advanced" for a number of years to describe the difficulty of any specific Round Dance routine. There are, however, a few problems with this approach. To begin with, these terms are subjective in nature. What is easy to one couple is Intermediate to another. What was intermediate ten years ago may now be considered easy. What is intermediate in Toronto may be advanced in Rochester. We need a better and more standard way of talking about the level of the dances.

Within the last several years, two international organizations have emerged in the world of Round Dance. They are the U.R.D.C. (Universal Round Dance Council), and ROUNDALAB (The International Association of Round Dance Teachers). Each of these organizations has made an attempt to categorize Round Dancing by level. Even though their methods originally differed, the results are roughly equivalent, and provide a yardstick by which dancers can evaluate their own abilities, and determine if a given Round Dance event is appropriate for them.

The U.R.D.C. method breaks dance levels into five general categories. These categories are not exact in their boundaries, and are meant as a way to gauge an evening of dancing rather than a specific dance. They are

1. Rounds between tips at Square Dances,

2. Easy level Round Dance Clubs,

3. Intermediate level Round Dance Clubs,

4. High Intermediate and some Advanced,

5. More Advanced and Challenge level.

The ROUNDALAB method uses a scheme called "Phase Rating". Each phase contains a vocabulary or set of Round Dance figures, and a dance is rated according to how many figures from a given level occur in it. This system is similiar to the Square Dance rating system with which most of you are already familiar. In Square Dancing, a dance is Mainstream, Plus, A-1, etc. based on what calls are allowed and which are avoided. In Round Dancing, a dance is Phase II, Phase III, Phase IV, etc. based on what figures it contains. Recently, the U.R.D.C. categories still have the problem of subjectivity and interpretation. The ROUNDALAB system, in my opinion, comes closer to eliminating subjectivity, but even though It uses very specific criteria for each level, one Phase III dance can seem a lot harder or easier than another Phase III dance or even a Phase II dance. This is due primarily to rhythm variations in the dance, which the phase rating does not take into account.

In any event, these systems are the best we have to work with today. The ROUNDALAB phase rating system in particular provides the ability to identify a given dance (or an evening of dancing) in terms that mean the same thing to all of us. Here is a breakdown of the various phase levels with some examples of each:

Phase I - very simple dances, limited basic figures: Left-Footer's One Step, most "line" dances;

Phase II - easy or Square-Dancer's rounds:

Tips of My Fingers, New York - New York, Very Smooth, Could I Have This Dance;

Phase III - the easier-intermediate level:

Folsom Prison Blues, Roses for Elizabeth, Spaghetti Rag, Alice Blue Gown;

Phase IV - the middle-intermediate level:

Desert Song, Elaine, Marilyn - Marilyn, Pcp Goes the Movies;

Phase V - the high-intermediate level:

Maria Elena, Waltz Tramonte, Lovely Lady, Autumn Leaves;

Phase VI - the advanced level:

The Apartment, Someone Like You, Rainbow Connection, Dancing in the Dark.

Using this phase rating system plus the usual terms "easy", "intermediate", and "advanced", we can build a scale very much like a thermometer. The scale shows what kind of dances you can expect during any Round Dance event. I would like to see such a scale on flyers advertising Round Dancing, on festival schedules (Dance-O-Rama, for example), and anywhere else where it can help dancers judge the level of a dance.

Here is an example of such a scale applied to a dance event (in this case, it describes the level of dances that we use at our Starduster's Round Dance Club):

This indicates that we do primarily Phase IV to Phase V dances, with some easier ones and some harder ones thrown in. Similarly, the schedule for Dance-O-Rama could advertise a Phase II (Easy) teach at 2:00, a Phase IV (Intermediate) teach at 3:00, Phase II-III dancing from 7:00 to 8:00, Phase IV-V dancing from 8:00 to 9:00, etc.

We could even indicate a "Workshop" teach. This would be similiar to a workshop in Square Dancing. For example, a Phase III workshop would mean the Phase II dancers could attend and learn a dance that was mostly Phase II with some Phase III figures included, allowing them to expand their abilities without getting in over their heads.

There are as many different levels in Round Dancing as there are in Square Dancing, and only the easier levels are usually seen by most Square Dancers. Rochester is very fortunate to be one of the areas that have Round Dancing available at virtually all of these levels. I hope that, whether you Round Dance or not, you found this article interesting. I would like to hear what you think of using the phase level indicators and the "Thermometer" for Round Dance events.

There are many more aspects of Round Dancing that I would love to ramble on about: how Round Dancing has evolved over the last ten years, how international Ballroom dancing has influenced Round Dancing (and is it good or bad), and many others - perhaps in a future article. I love Round Dancing, and I firmly believe that Squares and Rounds are complementary activities and truly belong together.

ECMA is the abbreviation for Emergency Call for Medical Aid. This signal is for use by the DANCERS to notify the caller of a medical problem in their square. Important minutes are frequently lost in the frenzy of waving arms and explanations that cannot be heard or understood across a crowded dance floor. The 33rd National Square Dance Convention in Baltimore employed this method of an arched circle to assure fastest response time of the medical team. In this way, it was hoped precious time could be saved-perhaps life-saving minutes.

The illustrations show three steps involved in this process. With the large numbers of dancers attending NSDC, there is every probability that emergencies will occur. It is hoped that the arched circle (ECMA) will become an accepted practice wherever square dancers



When a dancer goes down, a second dancer

gather-at every dance, festival and convention around the world. Callers could take time to explain the arched circle signal to their dancers to familiarize them with the procedure and its purpose.



Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This allows the injured person and



Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle. Caller or hall monitor, seeing this signal will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.
