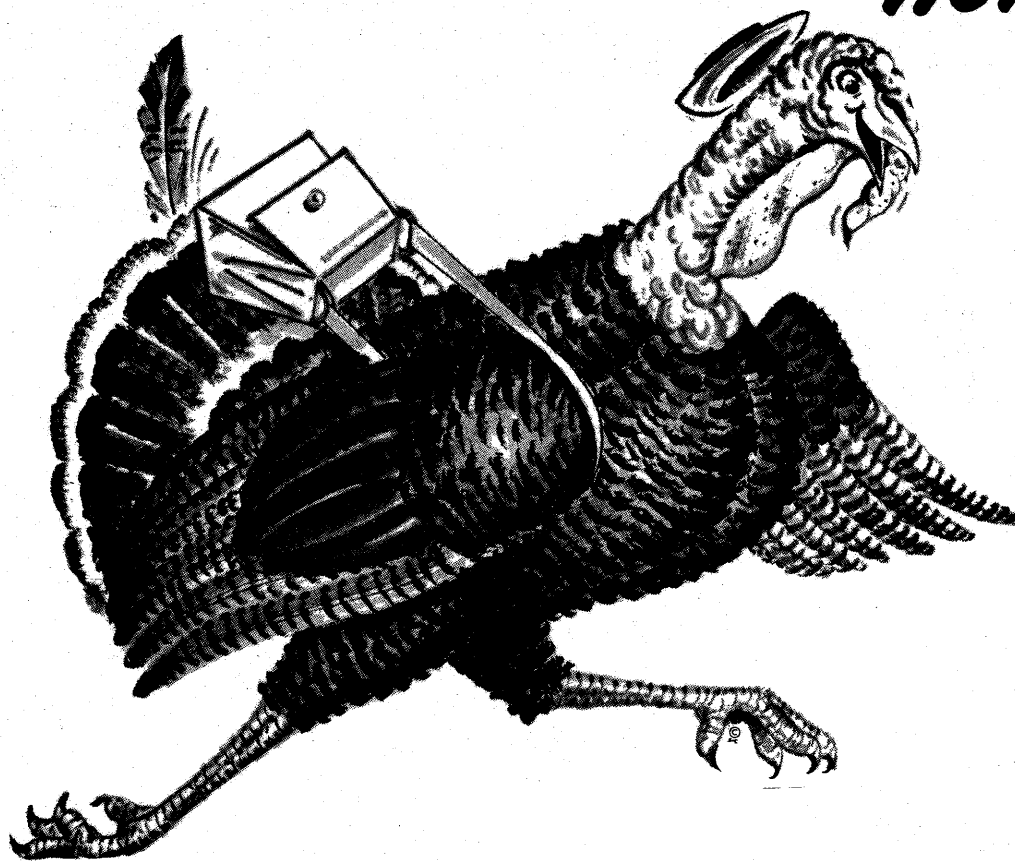

This is the first issue of the Promenader's 28th year. May your subscription afford you enjoyment and information.

When typing the club news for one month, it's not uncommon to note particular points are mentioned by more than one club. Following are a few I noted this month. I'm mentioning them to you on the chance that you can pick out a trend and see a solution, or take advantage of the situation for the betterment of square dancing.

1. Many club memberships have a larger percentage of people with over five years square dance experience than ever before.

2. Number of people enrolled in classes declined generally.

3. Clubs desire more men to enroll in club and class.

4. Very few Round Dance Basics Classes being taught.

5. Enthusiasm and anticipation for special club events are apparent.

6. Noticeable absence of volunteers willing to assume club duties.

These observations, some good some bad, are probably unrelated. How can we: emphasize and use our good points, and reverse our problems to work to our advantage?

We must think like the individual that couldn't sell his beautiful, large, Florida estate because no-one could afford it. He divided it into condominiums and made a fortune.

PRESIDENTS'

CORNER

I should like to take the opportunity to thank last year's officers for their well wishes and support in my new position as president of Rochester Area Federation Of Square and Round Dancers.

First, to you fill you in on a little background. My wife Katherine and I graduated from the Class of 1964 at EKC-0 Squares and were active in promoting teen-age square dancing and served as officers for the Country Twirlers. Because of Katherine's ill health we had to drop out of square dancing approximately 10 years ago. After Katherine passed away in April, 1986 I joined the Cloverleaf Squares as a single.

After becoming active again in square dancing and starting to dance at different clubs, I found some aspects had changed. I had to notice a decrease in enrollment of many of our clubs. The size of graduating classes seems to be much smaller in most of the clubs, and in some cases no class at all. I also found, we had no active teenage club.

The expression of these concerns apparently put me in line for the position of President of the Federation.

As I looked things over and compared with what we were doing then and what is taking place today I realized more publicity was needed, especially on-going week-in and week-out.

As of now, Jerry and Joan Sanford and Ed Nyszczyc are looking at larger aspects of the printing and distribution of pamphlets and other forms of advertisement where there would be an outlay of money. Shirley Spitz has volunteered to head up a committee to take care of the little things such as getting notices in the local papers and on T.V. when possible, of special events in the Square Dance Community. These notices are not intended to increase the attendance at these functions but rather to keep our name in front of the public as much as possible. Also her committee would look into setting up a central clearing house where people can call to get information about square dancing.

It has been suggested, and I like the idea, that each club adopt a local library and see to it that it carries the National Square Dance Directory, edited by Gordon Goss of Jackson, Mississippi, as a reference book and the **Promenader** on the magazine rack. For information on how this can be done, call Shirley Spitz at 235-8112 after 4:30 p.m.

It is understood that each of the above items standing alone will not make much of impact on the public but I hope that all of them, plus some others that are being considered, should increase the size of the classes next fall.

I am still looking for some volunteers who would be interested in forming a discussion group to explore and determine feasibility of different formats for classes and clubs, how to appeal to different age groups, all designed to attract more people into square and round dancing. Bear in mind, these would be discussion groups rather than action committees.

LINDA and MIKE LIBERTI
of Linda's Western Wear

When Mike and Linda married in 1979, their dream was to own a dance hall with a square dance shop in it. They came back from a dance weekend in September 1982 and found themselves looking for rental space for a shop. By October they found a place, and opened Linda's Western Wear in December 1982. By July 1984 expansion was necessary, so they relocated within the same building. Business continued to grow, and in March 1987 they moved to their present storefront location at 1480 Buffalo Road. Since the move, business has again increased and includes many non-square and round dancers. Their inventory now includes prairie skirts and ladies western shirts to accommodate those who like the western look.

Several fashion shows a year are put on by Linda's and they are always willing to do more. The shop usually travels to the show but it can be taken to a dance by itself, as has been the case with Dance-O-Rama and recently the National Singles Convention held in Rochester. Since Mike and Linda both cue rounds five or six times a week, it is not uncommon for them to bring merchandise with them that someone has ordered.

Linda's Western Wear is located in the center of Monroe County in the town of Gates and is easily accessible to all areas. Customers regularly come from Livonia, Canandaigua, Batavia, Buffalo, and Canada, as well as other outlying areas.

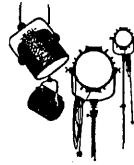

FRIENDSHIP SQUARES OF GENEVA

Way back in 1965, Don Pratt organized three square dance clubs and called them Friendship Squares. They were formed in Geneva, Penn Yan, and Henrietta. More than twenty years later two of the clubs are still going strong. Friendship Squares of Geneva has two charter couples still actively involved. The club as a whole has been very active during the fall season, when it sponsors and plans the "Sampson Fall Fest". That has been one of the most successful and popular camp and dance weekends in Upstate New York for the past fifteen years. This weekend is always held at Sampson State Park. The members have done a fantastic job of decorating the dance and dining halls, originating ideas carrying out a different theme each year.

In 1981 Don Pratt became terminally ill and Charlie started calling for us. For many years we enjoyed Don's calling and friendly atmosphere which prevailed, and Charlie has carried on the tradition of "Friendliness".

Our club sponsors three special dances a year, held on Sunday afternoons at the North Street Elementary School, the same place as we hold our regular club dances.

The 1988-89 season has scheduled: November 20 Anne Uebelacker, March 12 Mike Callahan, and May 21 Carl Hanks.

Our membership includes between thirty-five and forty couples, all participating dancers. The regular club caller is Charlie Valent, and the cuer is Al Overslaugh.

and home-made pie to eat!

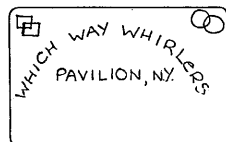

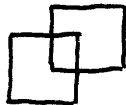

Jerry's Funshop

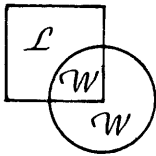
If you read Peter Taub's column in the Times Union, you have probably noted that he often refers to "names that work" (people whose names reflect what they do). We have an example in our club. The following article was written by Kathy Rosler of Lima Grand Squares for the **Lima Recorder**. I've included it as an outstanding article that offers the public a different view of our modern western dancing.

SQUARE DANCING NOT OLD-FASHIONED. SEE HOW IT'S CHANGED!

Across the country and around the world, thousands of people will be introduced to Modern Western Square Dancing this year. They will discover what fun it is, and that **anyone** can learn. You may be saying, "Oh, that old stuff. "You have to be a farmer or a square to do that" or "I used to do that in gym class." Well you're in for a real treat.

Modern Western Square Dancing is not like Eastern Square Dancing or an old fashioned "barn dance". Although it evolved from the simple calls, Western Square Dancing is smoother, rhythmic and more graceful. Frequent dancers found that the simple patterns of the barn dance calls became monotonous. Clubs were formed so that new and more interesting calls could be learned and shared with friends. Western Square Dancing doesn't use just Country and Western Music anymore. Now you can dance to any kind of music, including pop, rock-n-roll, oldies and classical music. Modern western calls have been standardized so that once you learn the basics you can dance anywhere in the nation or world-wide. The calls are always done in English. If you prefer a challenge, there are several programs of dancing from basic through advanced and beyond.

Square dancing appeals to a wide range of people for a number of reasons. Dancers come from as diverse backgrounds as corporate leaders and business owners to farmers and factory workers, from ages 5-85. Almost any one can become a dancers. It's about as strenuous as a brisk walk. One needs average good health, reasonably free use of arms and legs and the ability to hear the caller.

Dancing is fun. It's a great way to ease loneliness, depression, cabin fever or just plain boredom. When you hear the music and start to dance, you have no choice but to leave the cares of the world behind you. It keeps you mentally involved as well as physically active. How much does entertainment cost today? A movie \$10-\$12 per couple, dining out \$20-\$45. Other entertainment is often quite expensive and often a lonely activity. Square dancers can spend an entire evening dancing with friends and enjoying coffee and refreshments for \$4-\$6 per couple.

There are 30 to 35 Modern Western Square Dancer Clubs in the Rochester area offering dancing seven nights a week. The range from preteen, teen, senior citizen and singles clubs to clubs that are open to any one who can dance. The main dancing season is September-June, with some of the clubs dancing year-around. Classes for new dancers are organized in September, usually right after open houses. Your local club, The Lima Grand Squares, is sponsoring two free open houses on September 16 and 23, fro 8 to 10:30 pm. at the Lima Town Hall. No experience is necessary, come on in and give us a "test drive", or you're welcome "just come and watch". We'll give you a night of dancing, add pep to your step, and put joy in your heart.
