APPROACHING SQUARE DANCING

FROM THE OUTSIDE

It's been said the term "class" turns the prospective square dancer off. How true! This term conveys visions of: studying (often uninteresting) subject matter, tests, grades, and passing or failing. Square dance classes are nothing like that!! Studying isn't required, - just practice - fun practice, no tests, grades, or passing and failing. Why do we insist on giving this false image?

We, as square dancers, wouldn't consider going to a class, why do we ask it of others? We do go to workshops. May I suggest the terms "Basic Workshop" and "Mainstream Workshop" instead of the word "class"?

Callerlab has already established the terminology. We're all familiar with Plus, Advanced, and Challenge Workshops. The new square dancer should acquire knowledge of the various Callerlab programs during the Basic Workshop. With this information, he can quickly identify his place in the square dance picture and acquire a feeling of belonging. He now can easily understand why he isn't ready for a Mainstream or Plus Dance, and can also assume the responsibility (as we all do) to determine when he desires and is ready to pursue an additional Callerlab Program.

Requirements for club membership are another turnoff. When invited to our Open House, the prospective square dancer may very well assume we are offering club membership. Wouldn't that be a natural assumption? Are we obliged to say, "No, you cannot become a member until you complete a Mainstream or Plus Workshop?" Can't we offer immediate membership, upon purchase of a badge and/or payment of dues?

Presently, Plus clubs (in this area) require "class gradation" and "summer school" before the new dancer is "good enough" to dance with the club. What a turnoff!! No wonder we're losing new dancers! (These clubs completely ignore Callerlab's recommendation to dance two years in the Mainstream Program before starting a Plus Workshop.)

Can we say, "We would love to have you as a member of our club", and have a place for him? Most Mainstream Clubs have a Basic Workshop each fall --perfect for this brand-new club member. The Mainstream Workshop usually starts sometime after Christmas. At this time, the new member can choose to continue in either the Basic Program, in the Mainstream Workshop, or both.

Let's stop discouraging prospective square dancers. Let's stop treating them like children and outsiders - i.e. classes for a year then summer school before membership.

Instead let's welcome them into our clubs immediately as equals, giving them: 1) the privileges and responsibilities of club membership and 2) credit for knowing which square dance program they wish to pursue.

<u>Caution</u> - I have presented two apparently simple changes to make square dancing more accessible to the beginner. As with any change, we must carefully consider the implications, advantages, and disadvantages.

Our Halloween party was fun. There were many interesting and unique costumes. We even had a Doctor in the house. The sweet cider and doughnuts were good too,.


We were honored to be guests of Belles 'n Beaus on November 7. Art Harris will always make it a lively and enjoyable evening.
