



Heads Part: Face your partner, back awaythree steps and turn on the fourth step to face the Head position, walk forward to meet the dancer coming at you with a Dosado (back to back) and then a Star Thru. Now do the Heads Part. Repeat both parts to end at Home.

Action: Centers Lock It as Outsides Single or Partner Hinge, all finish with a Fan The Top.

Ending formation: For Advanced: Will always be parallel waves. When 1/4 or 3/4 Lines are used, ending formation will be parallelograms.

Timing: 6 to 8 beats

We hope you will visit us. We keep our bandits in line at the club, so you can feel free to come and enjoy a great evening of dancing.


