


An Update on the PANDACOLA and the

At the June Federation meeting we gave a report on the status of the China trip for the Pensacola Special Steppers. Later that month, at the National Square Dance Convention in Oklahoma City, Mac MacKenzie reported that the trip was postponed indefinitely because of the political situation in China. Mac is the chairman of the Handicapable Committee of the United Square Dancers of America (of which the Rochester Area Federation is a member). Plans of the Special Steppers were put on hold and all donations were placed in escrow. If the China trip should be definitely canceled, the money already collected would be used to finance trips to areas in the U.S. that had asked for demonstrations.

That much we came away with at the end of June. Then, in early August, we received correspondence from Mac saying that the Special Steppers have been invited to a cultural demonstration of Handicapable square dancing in Russia. Needless to say, the kids were very disappointed to have the China trip canceled, but their spirits are riding high on the idea of going to Russia. If it is to be, they need our continued help. It is wonderful to see those little "Pandacolas" on so many badges. Thank you again for your help and support. We can get more of them if needed.

- Attitude: evaluation of a candidate's continuing willingness to act as a positive force in furthering the square dance activity.

SQUARE DANCING IS LIKE A RAILROAD CROSSING: STOP . . . LOOK . . . and LISTEN

- STOP -- When the music starts, STOP talking, whether you are in a square or sitting out a tip and are along the sideline of the dance. The ears can only absorb so much. The motto is Z.T.L. ("ZIP THY LIP")!
- LOOK -- In the square, look to see if you are a side or head couple. LOOK and identify your corner . . he or she is there to work with you, not to think for you. Everyone has to think for themselves.
- LISTEN -- LISTEN to the caller at the front of the room. He has worked very hard and spent countless hours to make your dance enjoyable. Ignore the occasional self-appointed caller in a square . . . he or she may or may not know what they are talking about. When in doubt, after the tip, talk to the caller. He or she is willing to answer questions or walk through a call. Everyone can make mistakes . . .

But, above all, ENJOY!


