THE SQUARE DANCE COMMUNITY AND THE OBLIGATIONS THAT GO WITH IT

The reasons for square dancing are as many and varied almost as much as the individuals involved. Mostly, I think, we are looking for something to do and want to experience the fun and friendship that was touted when we were recruited. Notice, there is no mention of dancing proficiency in the previous sentence. If dancing is the MEANS by which we can experience these things, why, then, does the number of calls we can execute and the proficiency by which we do it become so important. That's because somewhere along the process of getting involved, too many of us seem to be putting the emphasis on the means instead of the goals.

In any organization there are people with various abilities, dedications and interests. To enable the organization to function, there must be loyalty, tolerance, willingness to compromise, a dedication to achieving the common goals, a way of integrating its neophytes, and cooperation in following the guidelines set down by its representatives. If all these things are not there, the organization falls apart or shrinks and disappears.

The square dance community is not unlike any other organization. In that it needs all these things to survive. If we focus narrowly on the goals and concern ourselves only on what OUR fun is and be selective to whom we will be friendly, we are doing the club to which we belong a great disservice. It is each individual's desire to be accepted as a part of the group regardless of his or her ability. Do we not suggest ability as unimportant at our demos, open houses and fun nights? Don't we attempt to present square dancing as something most all can learn and be successful at?

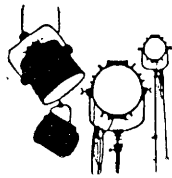

SPOTLIGHT ON CLUB PRESIDENTS



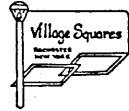
Copy Cats

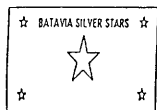

Batavia Silver Stars

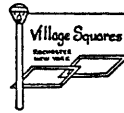
The fall season is upon us, and what better way to warm up those chilly evenings than by dancing with the Batavia Silver Stars. Dances are being held every Monday night.

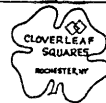
We were all sorry to hear of El Pankratz's foot injury, and are anxious to see El and Dotty square up with us again.

LOYALTY. Regularly attend all club dances and special club activities. Support your club even if a competing "big dance" is in the area. Never knock down the club, its officers or callers to non-members.

TOLERANCE. Constantly praise, encourage, and dance with those who are not as proficient as you, realizing they want to be accepted as a part of the group and are doing their best.

DEDICATION. A job needs to be done? Volunteer - or at least, accept when asked. You are needed. Your enthusiasm and willingness to contribute will earn the praise and admiration of others. Volunteer for an office.

WILLINGNESS TO COMPROMISE. The caller and board occasionally experiment with different things. Some of these you may not care for, but others do. Go along with these little episodes to help contribute to others' enjoyment.

SUPPORT OF NEW DANCERS. Your club cannot survive without them. You can make the difference when they are deciding to stay or leave. Get to know them by attending occasional classes as an angel. Attend class level dances and be ready to encourage and lend support when the going gets tough. After they graduate, invite them into our square or seek out squares they are in. Make certain they are included in after-parties and other social events.

COOPERATION. Help on special events and be one of the "workers". These offer opportunities to get to know others that are not possible on the dance floor. The caller or board wants to try a new way of mixing dancers or serving refreshments? Nothing will work unless you go along and do your share to help make it succeed.

The list is by no means complete and I'm certain you can add to it. Feel free.

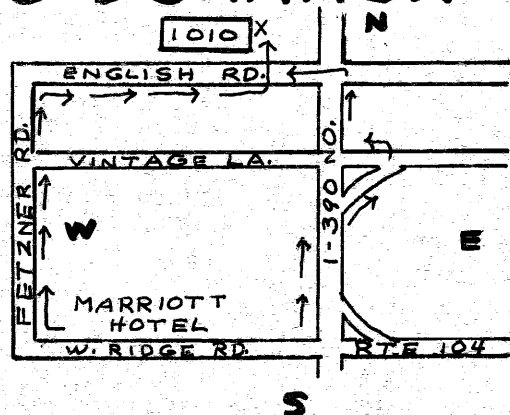
