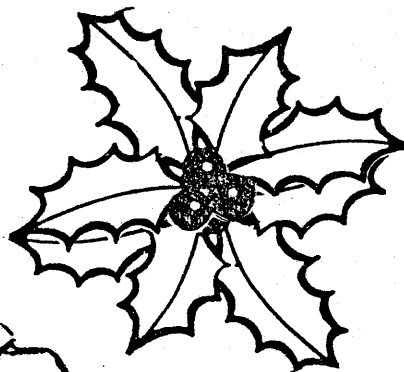
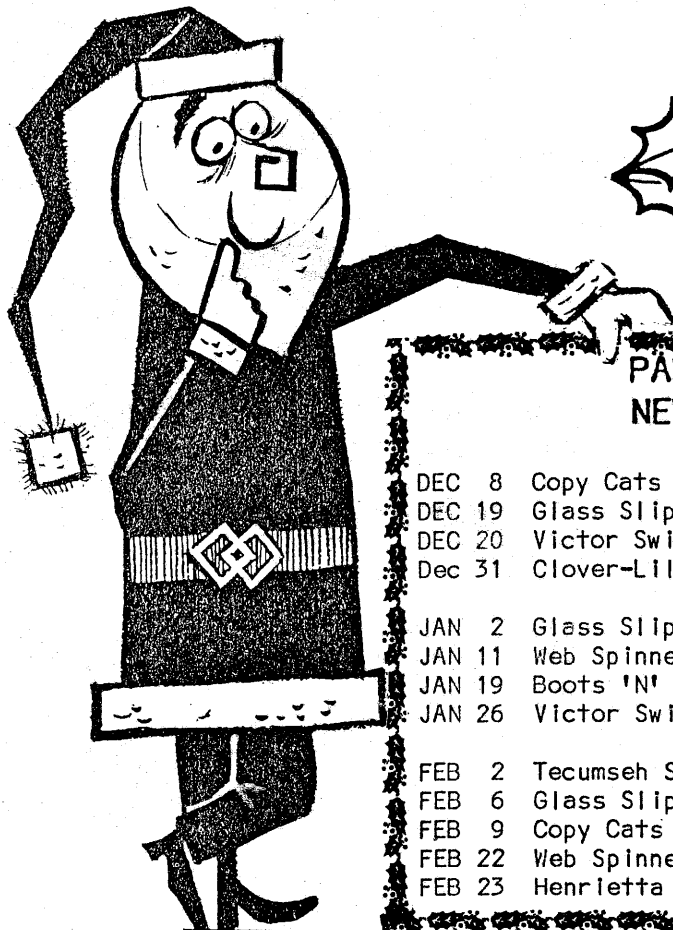

CLASS-LEVEL DANCES

Now is the time to start thinking about dances we invite our and other classes to participate in. Usually the club worries about date, hall, decorations and refreshments and leaves all the rest up to the caller. In most cases, this is fine, but all your planning and decorations can go down the drain if the caller does not provide a danceable evening for all those new dancers who hope to have fun and exhibit their new skills. This is a crucial event for many dancers and will often help determine whether they continue or drop out, so it is especially important that club and caller alike pay attention to the dancing part of the evening. As food for thought, here are a few guidelines established by the CCR some years ago. If the committee in charge of your class level dance has any doubt that the caller will adhere to these guidelines, they should discuss them with the caller as tactfully as possible for reassurances that they will be followed.

1. Use the **CALLERLAB** recommended teaching order as much as possible to help provide a standard milepost for all class dances at any given time. If we were only calling to our own group, sequence would not be that important. It helps both us and the dancers if we stay together in our teaching progression.

2. Check with other class instructors to see what they have done - especially with those of the classes you know are going to attend your dance.

3. No workshoping of any calls new to them. They are there to practice and have a good time. Leave the teaching for their class instructor. A capable caller should be able to use the dancers' current repertoire without having to resort to new material for an interesting dance.

4. Keep everything "standard position" as much as possible. Otherwise be prepared to walk them through. The idea is to keep everyone dancing.

5. **No club tips** during the dance. Isn't this a **class level** dance? Everyone should be able to dance every tip during the evening if they want to. A "club tip" forces the greater part of the attendance to sit out. This only provides an opportunity to show off and it has been noted to be discouraging if the dancing is badly done. Some callers provide a club tip or two at the end of the evening after the scheduled dance is over.

Don't be afraid to approach the caller during the evening if you feel there is too much confusion and people are getting discouraged. Often callers will watch a particular group or area of the floor and not realize there is a problem. Good luck and happy dancing.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

We were greeted at the door by dear, prized friends, Chuck and Gerri Prister and Curley's lovely wife. We missed regular caller, Jack Barnes but will catch him some Saturday night at the Washington Irving School.

We enjoyed Ed and Millie Briggs' smiles and good humor. Lend your thoughts and prayers to Millie and Ed. They love you all. Your moral support means so much to them.

Sid and Rena Galinsky, Presidents, and the whole crew at the Boots 'n Slippers made us feel like we were part of their club. Or taking clients out to lunch.

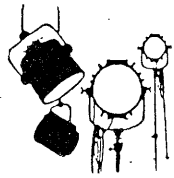

Country Twirlers

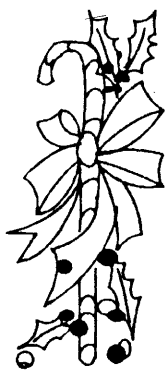

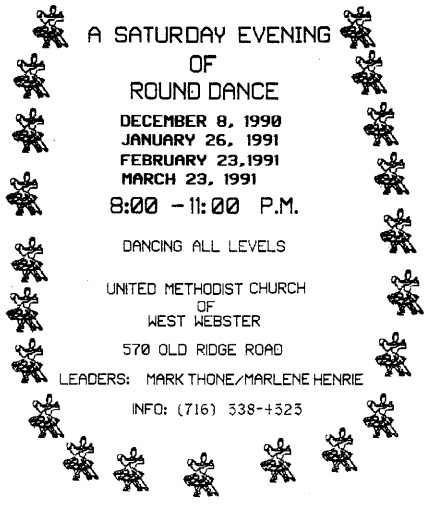
Which Way Whirlers
