

CARMEN'S COLUMN

SEXIST CALLS

Callers like to say you should learn to execute calls from all positions and formations, and some even attempt to teach that way. So we say, don't think of a man's or lady's part, but rather think of a right or leftside, center or end dancer part. Now this is true of most all calls that have been "invented" in the past 20 years, and virtually all that are being conceived now. In the early days, square dancing differentiated between men and women and gave them specific parts. So, surviving in our basics lists are many calls which harken back to the golden age of square dancing when these differences were recognized. The following is a list of calls in which the definition of them require the man to do one part and the lady another. For example, star thru requires the man to be facing a lady and to use a specific hand, slide thru requires the men to turn 1/4 right and the ladies 1/4 left after a pass thru; california twirl specifically requires the lady to be to the man's right for execution. Anything else is considered "gimmicky" or illegal, and doesn't conform to the accepted definition of the call. CALLERLAB has recognized this and has attempted without much success - to replace the term APD (allposition dancing) with DBD (dancing by definition).

These are all I could come up with in current use. You studious types might find more! Whatever you do, remember our goal is to have FUN!

This being said, do not berate your caller for throwing in "two men chain" or "ladies california twirl the men". He knows he is not being technically correct and is just trying to add a little fun to the evening. Whoever said square dancing was an exact science, anyway?

I would like make some criticisms and suggestions that may help people who make up flyers. I hope some of my personal experiences will help others advertise more effectively. What their clubs are offering.


Last year I saw one flyer promoting a dance at the "town hall" but there was no clue what town. The club's name wasn't descriptive enough to help me out. The dance schedule in the back of the Promenader didn't specify either! Many flyers fail to mention on what day of the week the dance is being held. So if the dance is a month or more away I don't know whether the dance is on a free night or a busy night. I hate to take home flyers and then discover I have wasted someone's flyer just because the dance is being held on a night I am always busy.

My chief suggestion is: anyone who regularly makes flyers, should make a master list of things that need to be included (or at least considered) every time. Then type up the list with lots of space to fill in the specifics for a particular dance and make copies of this master list. When you have included all the items for a particular dance, you should have all the needed information in your flyer. Other folks can tell you how to make your flyer neat, attractive, catchy etc., but first, let the flyer be complete!

Such a list snould include these items: correct name of club, date including year, day of week, time of day the dance begins and ends, half-hour of founds first perhaps, place of dance including name or type of building, address, and city or town, how to get there, perhaps including a map, caller's name and where from if not local, same for cuer, price per couple or single (specify which), designated dance program, phone number for information, special shoe requirement if applicable, other special features such as St. Patrick's, Pie Night, Black Cat, finger foods or special attire desired, or casual dress.

Hope the master list idea is as helpful to others as it has been to me. I have already revised my list several times!
