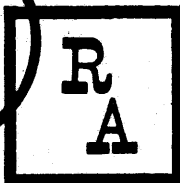

A View From the Square

One important reason for attendance at Dance-O-Rama is to experience dancing with different callers and dancers. But DOR should not be your only venture away from your home club. You become a better dancer by repeated exposure to a variety of callers, no matter what program you dance.

Even if you attended only local Federation dances, you could dance at a different club twice a month for a year, and never hit the same dance twice. Within a ninety minute radius of Rochester, your dance opportunities increase almost geometrically. Try a dance with Larry Dunn or Jim Wheeler in Buffalo, for a real treat. Team up with another couple to alternate the driving chores and to save on gas. Loyalty to one specific club is a positive philosophy, but should not be at the top of your list of dance goals.

Within a three hour drive, there is a super dance convention in Hamilton annually: enjoy three days of dancing in May at McMaster University. You don't have to be a camper or pay a fortune for motels to participate in most out of town events. In June, you might travel a little farther to Cincinnati and take in the 41st National Square Dance convention, which features squares, rounds, clogging, live music, panel discussions and other attractions. Later in the year, the Empire State Square and Round Dance Festival is offered. If you like to travel in this country or abroad, take along a copy of the National Square Dance Directory, listing over ten thousand clubs around the world. This book also contains dates of festivals and conventions. To get your copy, call 1-800-542-4010.

One nice thing about conventions are the multiple program halls. If the Advanced hall is too rough for you, you simply take a short walk to the Plus room. If the Mainstream dance isn't all that exciting, try a tip or two of the Plus. For the more opulent among us, there are square dance cruises to Bermuda, square dance tours to Russia (or whatever they are calling it these days) and New Zealand, and dance conventions in Hawaii and Alaska. The Cherry Ridge Campground near Scranton, less than five hours from here by car, features square and round dancing from early May to late September, with national callers. Cherry Ridge has camp sites, motel rooms for couples, and furnished cabins for groups of six. There are two conventions this year at Myrtle Beach on your way to or from Florida.

Square and round dance resorts may be found in the Smoky Mountains at English Mountain Retreat, in the Rocky Mountains at Vallecito Resort in Durango, or at the Western Squares Dance Ranch in Baton Rouge. The important point in all of this is not how far you wander from home to get your dancing experiences, but to increase your dancing enjoyment by going to as many different events that you can, as often as you are able.

CARMEN'S COLUMN

STYLING TIPS FOR NEW DANCERS

Caller Ed Foote has a lot of good ideas when it comes to dancing tips. Here are some styling hints gleaned from one of his handouts. The information given here seems to be either never told to new dancers or only briefly mentioned. Yet, often it is the difference between succeeding or breaking down on a call. You will find you will be a better dancer if you follow these tips.

1. **Anytime you are turning with someone else**, always *offer resistance with your turning arm* - stiffen it slightly. This smooths out the move and also enables one person to exercise control if the other person is unsure of how to do the call. Many squares break down without anyone knowing why merely because people have used limp arms and therefore have lost their positioning.

On the other hand, new men dancers sometimes are too rough in using arm turns with the ladies, but they never seem to be aware of this. Men - make an effort to analyze whether you are being too strong in arm turns or hand grips with the ladies.

Star Thru. Girls, do not raise your left hand up too high; bring it straight out from the side of your head. Also, offer some resistance with your arm - stiffen it a little. These things will enable you to do a much smoother and more precise star thru.

Right and Left Grand, Right and Left Thru. New dancers tend to hold on too long to each person they pull by with. This annoying to other dancers and makes for jerky execution of the calls. A quick snappy pull by is all that is needed.

Promenade. If you are near or at home when promenade is called, continue all the way around. Stopping suddenly or backing up causes confusion and disarray, ruins the flow of the dance, and does not look good. You will also not be ready for the next call if it is from a promenade position.

2. **Be bold in executing calls.** If you are going to make a mistake, *make a big one!* This way someone will see your mistake, be able to explain what you did wrong, and you will probably not make that mistake again.

Many new dancers hold back on all calls, even ones they know, for fear of making a mistake. This results in the square being slow in getting thru calls and possibly breaking down as a result. In addition, it hides mistakes people are making, and these mistakes could go on for months or years before being detected; then they have become a habit and are much harder to break.

3. **Posture is important.** There is a tendency for new dancers, especially the men, to lean forward excessively when doing calls. This looks bad and it will also tire a person out quickly. Try to stand erect or even lean back a little while dancing - it makes you look so much better.
4. **Be a dancer, not a walker.** Some people walk all the calls rather than dance them. This looks bad, throws a person's timing off and quite likely throws off the timing of the entire set; result is an uncomfortable dance feeling and the square is more likely to break down.
5. **Shuffle your feet.** Lifting your feet will tire you much more rapidly and will break up the dance rhythm.
6. **Compromise** if you miss part of a call. Don't try and catch up by racing thru all the missed parts. The odds are you won't make it and the set will break down. Instead, forget the part you missed and try to pick up the action where everyone else is - this will keep the set dancing.
7. **Keep your set tight**, not spread out. New dancers tend to form large squares and then not understand why they always seem to be slow in executing calls. The reason is they are forcing themselves to cover much more ground when doing the calls by having a large set, and this takes more time.

Experienced dancers keep their sets small and have ample time to do the calls. Then, if you start out with a tight set, it can expand as you do a variety of calls. Be aware that this will happen and always work to close in the set if it gets too large. You can do this while you are dancing.

8. **Don't hold back.** New dancers tend to hold back getting in squares, perhaps waiting to be asked. Other dancers may think you want to sit out and that this is why you do not get up - therefore they will not ask you to dance.

If you want to dance, be on the floor within 15 seconds after the music goes on. If you stall around, the sets will be filled and you could be left out. This is especially important when visiting other clubs. While clubs enjoy having visitors, they will not pamper their guests. If you want to dance, get on the floor right away.

9. **Dance to as many different callers as you can.** Regrettably, some callers advise new dancers not to visit other clubs and not to dance to other callers; this can only hinder the progress of new dancers. By dancing to different styles of calling, you will improve your knowledge and understanding of square dancing and your ability to do the various calls.

Note: Your caller may advise you against going to a particular club or caller, because the level may be too high for you. This is all right and you should follow his advice. But - if your caller advises against visiting *any* clubs, then do not follow his advice.

10. **Don't knock your club.** Help it by being friendly and kind to all. If you are asked to help on a committee or a job, try and do so. If everyone refused to do any work, there would be no club.

The following Letter to the Editor was submitted by Marje Aude of Friendship Squares of Geneva. Marje suggested it might be something you readers might be interested in.

The 50/50 Split-the-Pot Drawings
by Arthur Hagy, Jr.

I would like to raise some questions about the rather common practice of having 50/50 drawings at most of our square dances. I have no idea when this practice began but it seems as if it has been common for as long as I have been in square dancing, about 16 years.

A lot has changed in the past 16 years concerning the use and acceptance of various forms of gambling. In fact, many social scientists and economists are beginning to raise serious questions about the advisability of having so many government-sponsored lotteries. This in itself is enough to support us questioning the 50/50 games at our dance.

However, I also question what connection there is between square dancing and lotteries. They just don't seem to have anything in common. We go to a dance and there is a 50/50 drawing and we applaud the "winner". The unspoken fact is that there are, at the same instant, a multitude of "losers". They may be friendly losers but they are losers just the same. And our club treasuries make money on these 50/50 games and the actual truth is that the only way we make money is by making losers. The more losers, the more money we make. This just does not seem to fit with the general image of square dancing. I think our clubs exist to make winners out of everyone. We spend a lot of time and energy developing dances that will be great fun and provide excellent recreation for everyone. That's the way it ought to be and I just have a feeling that maybe we ought to question any activity which is aimed at making losers out of our dancers.

I appreciate the fact that we may need additional revenue. No problem with understanding that fact. If this is true, then let's just charge an extra dollar per couple and have it over with. That way we all pay the same amount. The way it is now, I don't believe in the 50/50, so I never buy any tickets. This means I don't spend as much as others may at the dance, which may not be fair either.

I would like to see us eliminate the 50/50, pay an honest and full price for our tickets and concentrate on just one thing at our dances, having a good time doing the best dancing possible.

We're glad you were able to join us for our ice cream social and "SOUTH MEETS NORTH" dance. If you were unable to attend, you missed quite a party.

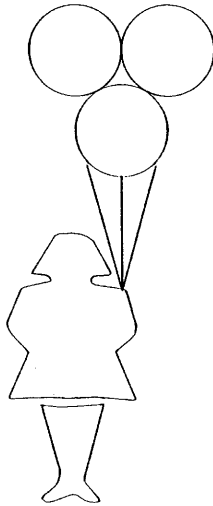

This sounds pretty one-sided, but one wonders just how many hitch hikers there are in a square dance club.

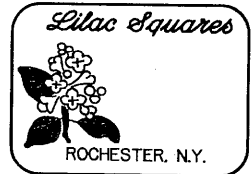
