IN MEMORIAM

Leland (Lee) Zilker, caller for The Dalton Gang, passed away on October 12, 1992. He was 58 years old. Lee had been a round and square dancer for 27 years. He was a member of the Friendship Swingers Club in Wellsville. Lee called for The Dalton Gang and the Cloverleaf Swingers 4H clubs for approximately four years. He was always willing to call for demonstrations at nursing homes, parades, campgrounds, and any occasion that kept people dancing and laughing. Lee will be missed by his many friends, multiplied by his dancing and calling activities. He always said that to make friends with a square dancer was to have a friend for life. How true.

Our condolences to the family of Bill Klein, former member of the Swingin' Eights. Bill passed away in October.

A View From the Square

When a dance ad states, "For Couples", this announces, pure and simple, "Stay away from this dance unless you bring a partner." I can see no other reasonable interpretation. If it is the policy of clubs in this area to confine dancers without partners to the three singles clubs, then let that be stated outright. This would mean that if a dancer lost their partner because of death, divorce, temporary or permanent disability, or whatever the circumstance, that dancer would be banished to the singles clubs.

Certainly, a dancer without a partner takes a chance that there will be exactly an even number of dancers in attendance. But then folks take turns dancing with this person, or the caller's spouse needs a partner, or dancers take turns sitting out tips. On myriad occasions, my wife and I have split up at a dance to accommodate a single. Callahan and Carmen state that, "square dancing is regarded as a couples activity." Horse feathers! Square dancing is an activity for sets of eight human beings, regardless of sex, race, color, belief, or sexual preference. The Great Orlo declares that a lone single at a dance is resented, that the club should not be expected to provide partners for singles. What is intrinsically wrong with dancers volunteering to pair off with a single who walks in off the street, unannounced? What do clubs fear, when they restrict membership to couples?

More than a dozen times, I have seen a man or woman who has lost their mate, be drawn out of a prolonged bereavement by attendance at square dancing at their original club: at the first several dances, they are understandably quiet, just testing the waters. Then they might stay home for several weeks. Then they start showing up on a more regular basis, perhaps smiling a little more, talking a little more. Eventually they realize that though life will never be the same, companionship is still enjoyable. It's none of my business why a person shows up at a dance without a partner; I will be more than happy to dance with any man, woman, or child that shows up at any dance.

Callerlab has struck again. The terms APD and DBD are now out of vogue. Callerlab has published a list of "Standard Positions" for every call. If the calls are given from any other position, then that dance is considered to be more difficult and is discouraged for normal Mainstream events. For example, a *swing thru* should be called only with men on the end of the wave and ladies in the center. This is really an intelligence - insulting policy. How many of you, class or club, would have problems with this: heads pass the ocean, heads swing thru, extend, all swing thru.

To repeat what has been said many times in this column: at each different dance callers should have the leeway to adjust dance degree of difficulty, up or down, based on observed competence of the dancers in that hall on that particular evening, so that the dancers are neither bored nor frustrated. Diane and I wish everyone a fantastic, healthy holiday season.—Ron Ehrlich

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Again I have to take issue with Ron Ehrlich in his reference to the call RIGHT & LEFT THRU and "better callers". He states that "better callers" will tell the dancers to back away after calling RIGHT & LEFT THRU from a static square. Well, Ron, I hate to disappoint you, but "better callers" are those who give their dancers a better evening of fun than the next guy. This is determined by more than just precision of terminology. sion of terminology. On the other hand, "better dancers" should know that in the case of calls like RIGHT & LEFT THRU and LADIES CHAIN, the call ends in the formation it started from UNLESS the next call dictates otherwise. Thus, HEADS RIGHT & LEFT THRU or HEADS TO THE RIGHT, RIGHT & LEFT THRU should always end in a squared up set. From facing lines of four, HEADS DIAGONALLY RIGHT & LEFT THRU will end in facing lines of four. Likewise, CONCENTRIC RIGHT & LEFT THRU will end in lines if started from lines and a starting double pass thru position if started that way. As a dancer, if I hear HEADS RIGHT & LEFT THRU, SIDES STAR THRU, as a head couple I will automatically back away. The problem Ron describes is inattentiveness and anticipation of the next call.

Having read Ron Ehrlich's comments in "A View From the Square" for several months, not to mention the responses, I am convinced that he is providing a disservice to square dancing. Square dance leaders throughout the country work hard to promote this activity in a positive and constructive manner.

In my opinion, his remarks last Spring concerning a class that had learned some Plus calls prior to their graduation was out of line. I believe his remark about the caller being under house arrest and the students' diplomas confiscated, whether it was his idea of humor or not, was a totally inappropriate comment and not a proper forum for that complaint. Any new graduate reading this column might think that he/she had done something wrong. Several of the topics he has discussed in past columns are in my opinion, so inaccurate that he is guaranteed responses refuting his position.

I sincerely hope that Ron Ehrlich would concentrate on topics that promote square dancing without polarizing the square dance community. If his articles are intended to be controversial, let's make them constructive

Lighten up Ron, and get with the program--think positive and promote the activity, don't drag it down.

Chats on Square Dancing - PART 2 Excerpts from a letter to a new dancer.

COMMENTS ON SOME OF YOUR PET PEEVES:

Apparent lack of uniform instruction program: CALLERLAB, again, issues lists of the various "programs" (lists of calls in each level) and a recommended teaching order. We, members of CCR, have agreed to follow the CALLERLAB recommended teaching order and each month we would do as you have suggested - inform the other members where we are with our classes. The problem is there are many "mavericks" around. That is, callers who are not members of the CCR and those who want to beat their own drum regardless of what others are doing. So any coordination that could exist is destroyed by other callers who want to do their own thing. In addition the CCR as a group has agreed that the class level dances should be used for dancers TO PRACTICE WHAT THEY HAVE LEARNED - not as a platform for callers to impress the dancers by introducing or using calls they haven't yet had. The teaching is supposed to be left to the dancers' own instructors, yet many callers, for some reason, feel they have to teach plus calls at a class dance.

Calls you learn but never hear again: It's true there are several calls or variations of calls that are rarely or never called by most callers. That is the choice each individual caller consciously or unconsciously makes in his programming. You probably have by now noticed that calls you never hear from one caller you hear quite frequently from another. The point I'm trying to make, is while not all callers use all the calls available to them, all calls are used (on a nationwide basis) when you consider callers as a group. This is the advantage of branching out and dancing to different callers when you have the opportunity. You get variety in the way the calls are used as well as exposure to calls you do not hear frequently from your club caller. As a rule, no caller uses all the calls available at each dance, but all callers should, I believe, use them during the course of the dance season. In spite of what I have just said, I know I am guilty of neglecting some calls, and that is an oversight in my programming. All the lists of calls are subject to revision every few years, and eventually, some calls which are not used for whatever reason get deleted and new ones added. Once again, I repeat, to get variety you should dance to different callers.

Recovering from breakdowns: There is a standard way suggested by CALLERLAB to teach dancers how to recover from breakdowns. I include it in my program, but apparently other callers do not, or use a different method. This is at each individual callers discretion as is evidenced by your experiences. Callers have a wide range of freedom in deciding what they will and will not include in the class programs. Most, I believe, will change their programs to accommodate what the board of directors wants included or deleted.


About Quarterly Selections such as CLOVERFLOW, GRAND Every three months a CALLERLAB committee of callers nationwide vote on and choose calls that are RECOMMENDED to be workshopped at club dances. The purpose is to provide dancers to exposure to the same calls in the same time frame to provide uniformity as to which new calls the dancers are exposed to. These calls can be used at each caller's discretion, but are supposed to be reviewed and walked through at EACH DANCE before they are used. It is not the intent to add them to the dancer's repertoire. Consequently, you may dance the call for an evening and not hear it again. However, if the callers decides to use it another evening, there should be a walk-thru first.

Changing terminology from caller to caller such as STEP TO A WAVE before SWING THRU: Again, each caller has his own way of presenting calls and the way he uses them. It may be done subconsciously (habit), to help in timing, or an attempt to help the dancers get through the pattern. Some uses, like the example you mentioned, are redundant because the definition requires you to make a right-handed wave first if the call is given when two couples are facing. Then again, the uses reflect back to the callers education and his individual knowledge of the calls and how they are used. Like a dancer, if the caller has never heard it any other way, he may not be aware how else it can be used. In the case of Jon, I suspect it is a combination of habit and his desire to help the dancer execute the pattern. This is another case for dancing to different callers.

Well, Will, I've been long-winded enough and I hope I have replied satisfactorily to your queries and concerns. I wish you a long, fun-filled experience in square dancing. I also hope you keep your eye on the main goal of the square dance experience and that's FUN & FRIENDSHIP. Always try to help your neighbor, be sympathetic to those less accomplished than yourself, get the team spirit, and never, never place perfect execution of the square above the feelings of your fellow dancers. The spirit in which we dance should be more important than what we dance.
