There are still many last-minute details to be attended to, of course, but with the help of many volunteers, we will be ready. We will have done our part!


Now it remains for the rest of the dancers in the Federation to do their parts:

The sun is out...it must be Spring..and time to think of a new square dance outfit! For something a little different consider a border print fabric. A border print has the design running the LENGTH of fabric. It can be a light and airy polyester, a polycotton eyelet with a finished border, or a printed poly-cotton. This is one of the easiest dresses to make because expensive trim and time-consuming ruffles do not have to be added.

You don't need a special pattern; choose a bodice you like from a square dance pattern or any conventional dress pattern. You will need 6 yards of fabric.

Cut the bodice and sleeves and facings first. Experiment a little with the design to use the "border" part of the fabric to best advantage. One easy way is to use the border part to make a decorative sleeve but it can also be used to outline your waist or highlight the shoulder area.

The remaining fabric (about 5 yds.) is hemmed if necessary, cut so the skirt is the right length (don't forget to add the seam allowance) and gathered onto the bodice. If you have a heavy fabric you can eliminate some of the bulk at the waist by taking 3" darts around the waistline edge before gathering it. Make the darts about 5" deep and space them evenly around the waist. This will not be necessary for most fabrics. Add a zipper and it's finished!

If you are short on sewing time but long on creativity, designing a border print dress is for you!

This is the last part of a three part series.

ASSOCIATION

It is difficult to dance in an area for long without the area's square dance magazine. So one of the first things we did was to get a copy of *FOOTNOTES*. This led us to some information about the area's association, MASDA. (Here it's called association instead of federation.) A person cannot subscribe to *FOOTNOTES* directly, as you subscribe to the *Promenader*. If you choose to join MASDA, then you'll receive the *FOOTNOTES* each month by mail. Membership is \$25 a year for couples or singles. It includes six free dances (four dances with Atlanta area callers and two dances with out-of-town callers).

The FOOTNOTES has a very different format than the Promenader. It is made of only ads, no club news (which I miss). So if you're club reporter, as we are for Dixie Twirlers (figures), you make up an ad each month.

The free dances that accompany membership are exciting and similar to Dance-O-Rama. They are on the fifth Saturday of the month. They are in one—huge hall, in downtown Atlanta. These dances are MASDA's way of promoting square dancing. (I didn't see how that promoted square dancing until we attended one.) They bring all the square dancers from various clubs together in one place, and that promotes a good exchange of ideas and information. By having out-of-town callers, the local area stays in touch with the rest of the nation.

These dances are big events. The smallest that we've attended had 300 in attendance, which only used 1/2 the hall when squared up. I don't know how many were at the largest, as it wasn't announced, but the hall was full. The costuming is fabulous. Advanced dancing is from 7:00 to 8:00, and alternating mainstream and plus dancing with rounds is from 8:00 to 11:00. They definitely are fun dances, and most dancers make every effort to attend.

GENERAL OBSERVATIONS

Visiting other clubs (either individually, or as a club) and combination dances is/are very frequent here. Perhaps this is because most clubs only dance twice a month. Friendships

develop from these visits, cutting across club lines, making a wider variety of close friendships. There is a lot of enthusiasm, and most dancers dance very well.

Getting into advanced dancing has been difficult for us. Very few dancers are interested in it. Advanced clubs are very scarce, and those few seem to be a long way away.

I would expect to see a bit more clogging in this area, but there isn't. They have banner stealing here that operates in the same fashion as there.

MASDA promotes club to club visitation, by recognizing those clubs that do the most visiting during the year. These awards are based on a percentage of club membership.

I know very little about the caller's association other than there is one, and they kindly donate their talents to the MASDA dances. Once a year they hold a benefit dance for various charities.

As you can detect, we have only scratched the surface of how it all works here. You must understand there was a bit of a language barrier at first. We had to learn southern! ("Ball" is what you do to water to make tea, "all" is what you put in the car (or makes "you" plural), and a "tar" is also used on a car. "Cheers" is what you sit in.) You see we're getting it, but still can't speak it correctly.

We extend our best to you all.



CHEF'S CORNER by John Zierie

Let's welcome the Easter Bunny this month of April with a festive bread wreath:

<u>Easter Egg Bread</u>

2 pkg. active dry yeast

1/2 cup warm water

1 cup flour

1/3 cup water

1/4 cup margarine

1 tablespoon grated lemon peel

1-1/2 tablespoons lemon juice

3/4 cup sugar

1 teaspoon salt

2 eggs, well beaten 3-3/4 to 4-1/4 cup flour

6 colored eggs (uncooked)

Soften yeast in the 1/2 cup warm water in a bowl. Mix in the 1 cup flour, then the 1/2 cup water. Beat until smooth. Cover; let rise in warm place until doubled (about 1 hr.)

Cream margarine with lemon peel & juice. Add beaten eggs in halves, beating thoroughly after each addition.

Add yeast mixture and beat until blended. Add about half the remaining flour and beat thoroughly. Beat in enough flour to make a soft dough.


Knead on a floured surface until smooth. Put into a greased deep bowl; turn dough to bring greased surface to top. Cover; let rise in a warm place until doubled.

Punch down dough; divide into thirds. Cover; let rest about ten min.

With hands, roll & stretch each piece into a rope about 26" long & 3/4 thick. Loosely braid rolls together. On a lightly greased baking sheet shape into a ring, pressing ends together. At even intervals, gently spread dough apart and tuck in a colored egg. Cover; let rise again until doubled.

Bake at 375F about 30 min. During baking check bread for browning, and when browned enough, cover loosely with aluminum foil.

Transfer bread to wire rack to cool. If desired, spread a confectioner's sugar icing over top. Enjoy!

Betsy Gotta of North Brunswick, NJ has been square dancing for 40 years and calling for 31 of them. She learned to dance as a youth, took up the microphone as a teenager and currently calls regularly for 5 square dance clubs (Basic through C-1), a Plus DBD workshop, a set of beginner lessons, an Advanced lesson series, a C-1 class, and a 12-week callers' school. She calls all programs from Contra through C-3 and is an accredited Callerlab Caller Coach.
