The theme reflects the discovery many dancers have made that problems disappear on the dance floor, having a beneficial effect on the well-being and fitness of the dancer.

For the month of September, here is a recipe which first appeared in the Tecumseh Squares newsletter. It is a perfect accompaniment to an Italian or French meal.

BUNDT GARLIC BREAD

2 loaves frozen white bread dough, thawed 1/3 cup melted butter, lukewarm 1/4 tsp. dry basil, crushed 2 tsp. chopped parsley 5 cloves garlic, minced 1 small chopped onion

Cut or snip off pieces of dough about the size of a walnut. Place half in a greased 10" bundt pan. Combine the melted butter, basil, parsley, onion and garlic. Pour half over dough in pan. Add remaining dough pieces on top and drizzle rest of the butter mixture over top of all. Cover and let rise until double in size, about 1-1/2 hours. Bake at 350F for 30 to 35 minutes, until golden brown. Cool in pan before unmolding. Bread can be eaten by breaking off pieces, or sliced. Bread may also be baked in two 9"x5" loaf pans. Enjoy! Chef Z.



ARE YOU READY FOR SOME DANCIN!? All the clubs are back in full swing and it's time to get sewing for the fun times ahead. But before you begin, take a look at your sewing tools. There are some on the market that make square dance sewing so much easier.

First and foremost is the serger. This is a small machine that sews and overcasts a seam in one step. It is very fast, can do things a conventional machine cannot and is fun to use. Buy the best machine you can afford but be sure it has at least, (1) a 3/4 thread—this will give you a wide enough seam even on filmy fabric, (2) differential feed—this will allow you to ruffle or gather very quickly, (3) a good (try before you buy) and easy rolled hem capability. Most ready—to—wear squaredance dresses and corresponding men's ties have hems and ruffles that are edge—finished with a rolled hem, and the serger allows you to duplicate that look.

Take a look at the marking pens available. The ones that fade in 48 hours or disappear with a damp cloth are great. Have you tried invisible elastic? It is perfect in short puffed sleeves—doesn't bind, has excellent stretch, and is easy to apply.

Also consider the American Home Sewers Guild (227-0198 for info) and the magazine Sew News, available at most newsstands. Both have lots of sewing tips and problem solvers and both put you in touch with others who share your love of sewing.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

The following is a partial reprint from June/July 1993 URDC Newsletter:

"LOOKING CIRCLES"

A Looking Circle is a very important function at all Round Dance events, be they large or small.

Regardless of dancing level or capability, EVERY Round Dancer should know what to do when a Looking Circle is called for—or when one is needed, even if not called for.

The basic fundamentals of a Looking Circle can be taught along with the basic fundamentals of Round Dancing. In small clubs and groups the need may not be there, but teaching how to form a Looking Circle in the basic or early classes prepares the dancers for their first venture to a weekend festival or larger event where one might be called for.

The clinician or teacher should not have to take valuable time away from the dance instructional period to tell those in attendance how to form a proper Looking Circle.

The necessity of a Looking Circle is not difficult to comprehend. If everyone in the room is to be able to see, a big, open circle—with no one person or couple blocking someone else's view——is the only way.

When forming a Looking Circle, if each individual forms up standing side-by-side and shoulder-to-shoulder to the next individual in a crowded hall, a huge circle will be needed and it just may not fit

will be needed and it just may not fit.

If the two persons in each couple will stand one in front of the other, the shortest in front, and then stand side-by-side with the next couple--WAM--the circle is now only half as big. Now there is room for twice as many couples to have a good view of center hall.

When it is time to resume dancing, the circle opens, the couples space themselves out, and away everyone can go. OK, so now you know what a Looking Circle is.
