



Emergency Call for Medical Aid

1. When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends to him/her.

2. Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This will allow the injured person and attendant air and room.

3. Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.

On seeing this signal, the caller or Hall monitor will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.

The following is the third part of a partial reprint from June/July 1993 URDC Newsletter:

"LOOKING CIRCLES"

Now let's talk about courtesies. We have already spoken of one-staying in your own dancing circle. There are times when a couple may have to move to another circle because they find they out-step the couple in front of them, but for the most part--honor your own dancing circles and keep them ROUND.

Another courtesy is remaining still while standing in a Looking Circle. As much as you might like to try to do a figure or a movement along with the clinician, in addition to being very distracting to those around you, your moving about may also block someone behind you from seeing.

you from seeing.

In a Looking Circle, or even during a teach at your club meetings, please don't talk or "discuss" things with your partner—or try to further explain what has been or is being said. Those around you want to hear the instructor, not you. Save your talk until you and your partner are alone and you will not disturb anyone else.

If there are not enough chairs in the room for everyone, which is often the case, and you choose to sit when a Looking Circle is called for, this is your prerogative, but don't then expect those in the Looking Circle to part, move or get "down in front" just so you can see what is going on. Remember, the instructors never have the opportunity to sit during a session and if they can be on their feet all that time—need more be said?

And finally, though the purpose of the Looking Circle is to give all an unobstructed view looking forward to center hall, there is one other direction of which everyone should be aware—looking BEHIND! Take a quick peek over your shoulder and make sure you're not blocking the view of others. This is a courtesy that should come naturally. Remember, other couples want to learn the dance, too!

DO be quiet and attentive to the caller when he's teaching something, especially if you know what he's trying to explain. Someone else in your set may really need the information. It's even possible that you might hear something that you never heard before, or had forgotten.

FROM THE CASEBOOK OF THE PROMENADER'S ROVING REPORTER:

Recent news has reached my desk regarding the demolition of the old square dance hall located in the path of the new expressway in Rochester. The wrecking ball fell on the old hall, site of many wonderful square dances in years past, with many of our senior dancers on hand to witness the sad passing. As one section of the west wall collapsed in a cloud of dust, one of the dancers wheeled his chair up to the rubble and shouted that an old wooden chest had been uncovered. The group crowded around to see what it contained.

The chest when opened disclosed the history of the Rochester Whirling Dervishes which one old timer remembered as the premier club of that era. They pondered with sadness how the best club in the area had fallen on hard times and ultimately disbanded. As they rummaged through the old trunk they found flyers touting the original Dance-O-Rama held in the old West High, Mike Callahan's original microphone autographed by Thomas Edison, four pairs of pettipants with the old Sibley's labels still intact, and three bandanas with the National Clothing emblem on them. Under it all was the last letter from the leader of the club. The dancers read the letter with an occasional tear. It said:

Dear Whirling Dee's:

As your president I am sad to announce the closing of our club. I guess it all started when no one wanted to take over an office. We all want to dance but someone has to be in charge and make things happen. I don't really blame you for coming to the dance ten minutes late and leaving fifteen minutes early--no one likes to set out the pitchers, flyers, and collect the money but there is no one left willing to do it. When I have had to make last minute decisions, all the other officers seem to question my judgment and go in the back room to talk about me. That is hard to take. Also I see that many members are going to other clubs for their once a week night out to dance. I can't understand why. Some of you say that the caller calls too fast, others say too slow--he isn't sure what to do now. Our decision not to have a class this year will probably result in fewer dancers too as our club is getting older with more dancers moving away or retiring from dancing.

As I look back over the many fine dances we have enjoyed together I find it hard to understand why so few of us have to do the work of running the club for so many. Lots of you have been in this club for years and have yet to volunteer for anything. You are asked to bring a plate of cookies and that is too much or you won't be here that night—yet there you are doing "Relay the Deucey" on that night—without the cookies. Just a few weeks ago I spent four nights on the phone trying to get a chairman to run the annual Dinner Dance and not one couple was willing to do it.

So it is with great reluctance that we close our doors, tender our resignation, close the chapter of the Rochester Whirling Dervishes and join the crowd doing the jitterbug to the Glenn Miller band downtown.

Hey-it's cold out there-winter must be coming. And we have that old winter problem of trying to get a slim-cut coat over a full-cut square dance dress. Why not think about making yourself a coat so you'll be warm, comfortable, and look put-together.

Authentic Pattern Co. has a full length coat pattern with a very full skirt, an elasticized waistline and ragian sleeves. Consider making it in a heavy twill. It is unlined but with a sweater, should do for much of the cold weather.

McCall's 5645 is a loose fitting, flared, lined coat or unlined cape with different options for lengths and collars. Try it in Polar fleece, mohair, or wool

And while you're in the McCall's book look at #6774, a simple classic cape, or #6717, a short swing coat.

Butterick #5652 is a good choice in a baseball style jacket. It is easy to sew and quite short so it doesn't interfere with the skirts. Think about making it in your club color--or making the sleeves a different color from the body of the jacket. It would work in Polar fleece, blanket cloth, heavy sweatshirt fleece or even quilted fabric.

Don't be afraid to tackle these coats/jackets. They don't call for tailoring--only basic sewing skills.



Chef's Corner

This is the pumpkin season and it's probably the only time of the year to make this delicious, warming stew for a cold night

- ARGENTINIAN STEW IN A PUMPKIN SHELL

 2 lb cubed beef------3 potatoes, diced

 1 lrg chopped onion----3 swt potatoe, diced

 2 cloves minced garlic---3 swt potatoe, diced

 3 tbsp vegetable oil-----2 cups beef broth

 2 lrg chopped tomatoes-------1 med pumpkin
 - 1 lrg chopped green pepper----1/4 cup sherry salt & pepper to taste---1 lb cn kernel corn 1 tsp sugar-----melted butter/margarine

Trim excess fat from beef, brown in oil with onion & garlic. Add tomatoes, pepper, 1 tbsp salt, 1/2 tsp pepper, sugar, apricots,


salt, 1/2 tsp pepper, sugar, apricots, potatoes & broth. Cover and simmer 1 hr.

Meanwhile, cut top off pumpkin and discard. Scoop out seeds & stringy membrane. Brush inside of pumpkin with melted butter/marg. & sprinkle lightly with salt & pepper. Stir sherry & corn into stew and spoon into pumpkin shell. Place shell in shallow pan and bake in 325F oven for 1 hr, or until pumpkin meat is tender.

Place pumpkin in large bowl and ladle out stew, scooping out some of the pumpkin with each serving. Serves 6. Enjoy! Chef Z.
