



<u>H E L P !!!</u>

This word probably has different meanings to everyone that reads it. Many people are looking for work or looking for workers. Some are having financial problems and could use all they can get. There are dance clubs that are facing problems and can use it too. This is the point of this message.

The *Promenader* exists thru the auspices of the Rochester Federation of Western Round and Square Dance Clubs which in turn guides all of the clubs that belongs to this organization. The *Promenader's* primary goal is to bring to print, all of the club's schedules of their regular and special dances for the benefit of all other clubs and other dance subscribers.

Many of the clubs in our Federation are experiencing financial hardships that in turn affects the *Promenader's* income. The number of ads that this publication prints has substantially decreased in last two years as well as the decreased number of subscribers, to the point that we are also having difficulty meeting the basic expenses. The cost to the *Promenader* of printing from Fink's Engraving has remained stable and is more than a fair price. We have checked other printers and know this to be true.

The problem is the lack of the club's being able to afford to advertise in this publication. Many times we've seen that when a company starts to have financial problems, the first place they want to cut is in advertising, when advertising is where the emphasis should be placed for others to know what you have to offer.

We are looking for ideas from all of you out there in ways to increase advertising. It may again come from our clubs or from you and the business that you are in. We can advertise non square or round dance ads as long as the product advertised meets the standards that our clubs have. The other cause for additional costs, comes from the lengthy news articles that we get from our clubs with information that is not necessarily newsworthy to the goal of getting information to other clubs. Many times the fewer the words printed, the more your news will be read. The established length of 250 words allows space for our 1/4 or 1/2 page ads. When there are more than that, we can not use that remaining space for ads and have to use some sort of fill. The Federation Officers have suggested putting in business card ads for \$5, Happy Ads for \$2 and increasing the subscription price. Please mail, call or fax your ideas to us as we need to find ways to increase our advertising dollars very soon.

We just received a FLADA FLYER publication and the Editors article states the summer issue will be their last because of lost subscriptions. We would hate to see this happen to the Promenader!

Just as a reminder, the fax, software and phone line we use are our own and not the Promenader's. The only additional expense since Elaine and I started as editors, was an inexpensive computer desk and the latest version of the software used to put the issue together.



For those of you who keep Lent here is a change of pace recipe to take the place of tuna noodle casserole and/or



fish fry's during the last few weeks of lent. For those who do not, this is a great, tasty way of serving swordfish.

SWORDFISH DIJON

Marinade:

2 tbsp dijon mustard 1/2 cup dry white wine 1/4 cup lemon juice 1/4 cup olive oil

1 clove garlic, minced

3/4 cup fresh basil, shredded or 2 tbsp dried basil 1 Swordfish steak, 6 oz. 1" thick per person. **Preparation:**

1. Whisk together mustard, wine, lemon juice, and oil in a small bowl until well blended. Add garlic and basil.

- 2. Arrange fish in a shallow baking dish large enough to hold steaks in one layer. Pour marinade over fish. Turn once to coat both sides. Refrigerate one hour, turning once more.
- 3. Preheat broiler. remove fish from marinade to broiler rack.
- 4. Broil steaks 7" from heat source for 5 to 6 minutes on each side.
- 5. To make sauce: Bring marinade to a boil. Heat 5 minutes, serve over swordfish.

many advantages. The sum total of this new location is that it's just really comfortable.




