Callers & Cuers are not cheap and hall costs are also going up. Let's all cooperate!

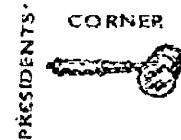

Here is a quick and tasty dinner for those soon to be frosty evenings.

AMARETTO CHICKEN BREASTS

6 boneless, skinless chicken breast halves--flour--salt & pepper--garlic powder--curry powder--1/4 cup butter--1/2 lb. fresh mushrooms, sliced thick--1/4 cup Amaretto--grated rind and juice of 1 lemon--1 1/2 cups chicken broth--1 tbspcornstarch--cooked rice.

Cut chicken into 1" strips. Sprinkle with seasonings. Roll in flour. Heat butter in large skillet; brown pieces on all sides over medium heat. Add mushrooms, Amaretto, lemon rind & juice. Simmer 5 minutes. Mix broth and cornstarch; stir mixture into skillet. Stir over low heat until mixture bubbles & thickens. Serve over hot cooked rice. Enjoy!

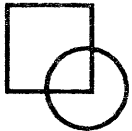

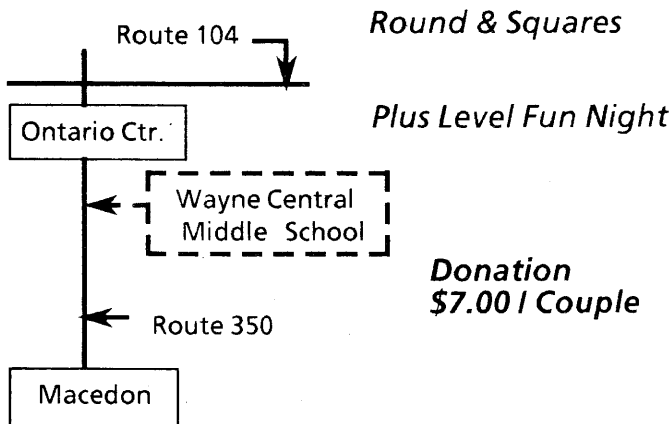

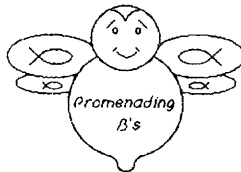
In Nov., we will be back in Rochester at the Covenant United Methodist Church. The date will be Nov. 19th. So put that on your calendar so that you don't forget.

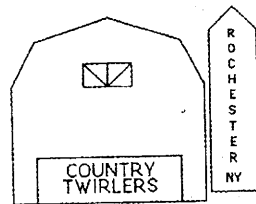

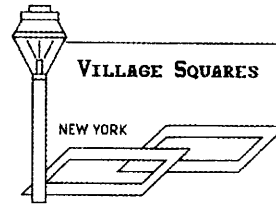
We will not be dancing Oct. 7th so our members can dance with Richard Lane of California at the Victor Swing-A-Longs.
