

Here is a quick, hot meal for those cool November evenings.

GARLIC POTATO-TOPPED BEEF CACCIATORE

Cacciatore: 1 lb boneless beef sirloin cut into 1 1/2 x 1/2 inch strips -- 1 tbsp oil -- 1 cup sliced onion -- 1 medium green bell pepper cut into strips -- 1 jar cacciatore simmer sauce.

Potatoes: 1 1/2 cups water -- 3 thsp butter -- 2 garlic cloves, minced -- 3/4 cup milk -- 2 1/4 cups mashed potato flakes -- 1/2 cup parmesan cheese, grated -- 1 egg slightly beaten.

Heat oven to 325F. In large skillet, cook beef in oil over medium high heat until lightly browned. Add onion & bell pepper; cook and stir 4 to 5 minutes until vegetables are crisp-tender and beef is no longer pink. Stir in sauce. Cook until thoroughly heated. Spoon into ungreased 12 x 8 inch baking dish.

In medium saucepan, bring water, butter and garlic to a boil. Remove from heat; add milk. Stir in potato flakes and cheese. Add egg; blend well. Spoon or pipe potatoes around edges of dish over hot beef mixture. Bake for 25 to 35 minutes or until potatoes are set and light golden brown. Serves four polite people or two really hungry ones.

This month I will recap the survey from last May's issue. Only 25 responses were received. The average time dancing was 19.7 yrs, with a high of 42 yrs & low of 3. Those responding average 2 nights a week dancing. 56% dance plus, 32% advance, 12% challenge. 56% enjoy plus best, with 28% prefer advance and 8% enjoying challenge best. The dance format preferred the most is Square/Rounds-60%, Square only 32%, 8% preferred Square/Round/Cw. 68% did prefer theme dances 2-3 times per year. 92% of them held some office, some 3-4 times and 72% would not run again. 64% of the clubs are shrinking, 28% even, with 8% growing. 2% of the clubs are board run which is the most preferred. 64% prefer round dancing to line, 16% line over round, with 20% asking to alternate between the two. 32% would support a teen club. 32% did not respond. 52% would prefer to dance the entire year, while 40 prefer September thru May.

What would they like to see from the callers? Use all the calls, smoother dancing, do good mainstream. More dancing, less talk and drop the quarterlies.

What could the Federation do? More promotions, better marketing, get TV coverage, give more guidance to the clubs, have more joint dances with one area dance per month. Make new dancers feel more welcome into the dance community, don't push new dancers onto the next level, combine all classes into one.

Although it was a small response there are many good ideas and some interesting breakdowns of % for us to think about. We welcome your response.

Dear Editor:

Once again this year, basics classes are under way with an enthusiastic group of beginners anxious to take part in the square dance activity. Also, again this year, the class situation is inconsistent with some clubs reporting very small classes or none at all. Clearly with long time club members leaving the activity and fewer newcomers, the overall situation is not encouraging.

This past summer, I had the opportunity to call several Federation sponsored Community Square Dances at Ontario Beach Park. These dances were moderately successful with about three (3) squares of non-dancers participating each time. Hopefully, many of these people are now in basics classes and will bolster area club membership next year.

In addition to the visitors, a sizable group of experienced mainstream and plus level dancers turned out to "angel" and assist with the various dance details and chores. The committee requested a varied dance program, so not only did we square dance, but also danced mixers, lines, quadrilles, reels, contras, eastern or traditional squares and party-type dances, all of which are part of a true community dance program.

As hoped for, the non-dancers seemed to have a good time and enjoyed a fun evening out. But surprisingly, the experienced dancers also appeared to be thoroughly enjoying themselves and enthusiastically took to the floor for each dance, and for the most part, stayed right to the end. From the smiling faces, the whoops and hollers, and the many dancers who personally thanked the caller at the end of the evening, it was clear that the dances were a rousing success!

Perhaps there is a message here. If experienced dancers can have a good time at this type of dance, and if newcomers are hesitant to make a long-term commitment, then maybe the time is right for local clubs to take a look at a true "Community Dance Program". Callerlab, the international callers association, has a program that involves dancing about 25 basic square dance figures and includes a number of different dances that were danced at Ontario Beach. This is a low intensity program and people can drop in and out any time without tying themselves down for the long term. The program can also feed dancers into the structured basic-mainstream-plus programs, although that is not its primary intent. If both experienced and non-dancers can have a fun time without feeling like they are back in the classroom, maybe it's worth a try! After all, isn't "fun" what this activity is all about? Food for thought.




