In 2 quart shallow baking dish mix soup, water, rice, paprika and pepper. Place chicken on rice mixture, sprinkle with additional paprika and pepper.

Cover. Bake at 375F for 45 minutes or until done. Serves 4.

Note that there is no dance March 28. Bob & Carol will be in Colorado visiting and sightseeing. (Lucky them!)

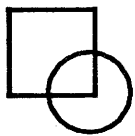

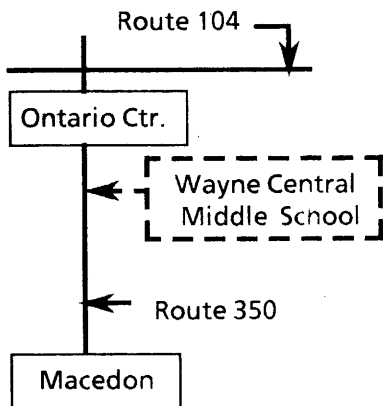

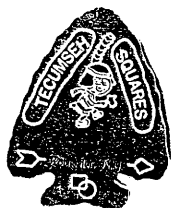

DANCING FOR FUN AND EXERCISE

According to a recent survey, a half-hour of high-intensity dancing offers the same aerobic benefits as jogging for 30 minutes at 5+ MPH or playing basketball or handball for 30 minutes. College researchers have determined that people can lose more than two pounds a week if they dance vigorously for 30 minutes, three times a week for 12 weeks. Dancing works your lower body muscles, plus it is weight-bearing exercise which builds strong bones. It improves your cardiovascular fitness and increases the ability to recover from mental and physical stress. Staying fit helps you adapt to heat and cold, burns off fat, slows down aging, helps fight depression--the benefits of dancing are endless--best of all, it revs up your energy.
