





new recipes for the column. Try this one. It's really tasty.

PORK CHOPS MARSALA

4 loin pork chops, 1/2" to 3/4" thick -- salt & pepper -- 1/2 tsp (or more) -- minced garlic -- 1/2 tsp crushed sage -- 1/2 tbsp olive oil -- 1/2 cup water (or chicken bouillon) -- 1 1/2 tbs marsala wine -- 4 pineapple slices, sauteed in butter until hot -- 1/2 tsp flour -- 1/2 tbsp water.

Season the chops to taste with salt & pepper; rub with sage and garlic. Heat oil in a large heavy skillet over medium heat until hot, but not smoking. Brown chops on both sides. Stir in water/bouillon and marsala, cover and simmer 30 to 40 minutes until chops are tender. Place sauteed pineapple slices on serving platter. Top each slice with a pork chop and keep warm. At this point you might want to add about 1/2 lb sliced Italian brown mushrooms to the pan; saute until tender. Blend flour and 1/2 tbsp water and stir until smooth. Add to pan drippings and mushroom mix. Bring to boil and cook, stirring until thickened. Add more water or marsala to increase quantity of sauce. When thickened, spoon sauce over chops and serve immediately accompanied by your favorite vegetables. Enjoy!
