SHRIMP & LOBSTER LOUIS SALAD

4 oz uncooked rainbow rotini -- 1/3 cup mayonnaise or salad dressing (I use no-fat mayo) -- 2 the chopped green onions -- 3 the chili sauce -- 1 tsp lemon juice -- 1/4 lb flaked cooked lobster or crabmeat (I use imitation crabmeat) -- 2 to 4 leaves of leaf lettuce.

- 1) Cook rotini to desired doneness as directed on package.
- 2) Meanwhile, in medium bowl, combine mayonnaise, onions, chili sauce and lemon juice; mix well.
- 3) Drain rotini; rinse with cold water to cool. Add cooked rotini, shrimp and lobster/crab to mixture in bowl; toss gently to mix and coat the pasta. Serve on lettuce lined plates.

NOTE: MAKE IT SPECIAL!

Add the traditional "Louis" garnish of tomato and hard cooked egg wedges.

To take as a dish to pass for a picnic, this recipe doubles or even quadruples very easily. Enjoy! Chef Z.
