As I search for ideas to write these monthly articles, I look at different publications and even things not related to Square Dancing to zero in on a subject. As I look around we are in direct competition with many activities for new customers time and commitment. If we are to attract a large amount of people in to Square Dancing (or any amount), we need to look at ourselves honestly to come up with a truthful observation. I've discussed over and over again image and perception. It is very important when trying to sell outsiders on something. Think of yourself in regards to someone selling you over the phone, or in person on a new product or something. You may be like me, immediately turn them off with "I'm not interested". The window of opportunity on something is only 15 seconds! That's right 15 seconds for you or anybody else to form an opinion about someone or something. In the December issue of American Square Dance Magazine, Jack Murtha's article discusses some interesting ideas on how to attract new dancers and talks about image and making a first impression. If you haven't seen it you should. If you don't get ASD let me know and I'll send you a copy of the article. One of his points is, make SQ. Dancing look easy to learn, fun to do and inexpensive. You should be thinking about ideas of how to recruit new dancers now for next year, so now is a great time to explore other ideas that you may have not done before. In doing demos, don't dress up, wear western but not all the traditional outfits. Make it fun looking by smiling. Dance to easy material so the dancers can relax and enjoy themselves dancing. You're under enough pressure dancing in front of a crowd. That's what it is all about isn't it? Be friendly with the crowd watching, don't just mingle with your fellow dancers at the demo, talk to the people and talk Sq. Dancing. Have a entry level tip for them so they so they can see how much fun and how easy it is. One more point, we may need to restructure our class system and entry level of dancing to our graduates. Instead of rushing them to Plus, why not take longer, teach them the basics and mainstream and allow them time during the year to just dance what they have learned before moving on with the list of calls. To do this it might require clubs working together to stagger the classes. One does the intro., another does the second part of the list and the first club start a new class with the intro. calls again. There are many possibilities. If you have any ideas talk to your Club Presidents, Federation Reps, or Callers. We will be holding a joint meeting to discuss all ideas on many subjects concerning our activity and we need your thoughts and ideas. Thanks.

### DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD

The Leadership Award was established in 1977 by Frank Salvagio and John Fink in honor of their wives, Norma and Daphne. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation for EXTENSIVE AND SUSTAINED LEADERSHIP OVER AN **EXTENDED PERIOD OF YEARS** in square, round, or contra dancing. Leadership, service, and motivation are considered when evaluating candidates for this award. A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area necessarily given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may include, but are not limited to, years of dancing or calling, membership, committee service, or officer role in any of the following: Square, Round or Contra Club, Rochester Area Federation, Promenader, Dance-O-Rama, NYS Association or National Associations, promoting the activity through calling or teaching, and other leadership roles which benefit the community through the square dance activity. Finally, consideration is given to the candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the square dance community.

An individual or couple may win the award only once. The award may not be given if the Selection Committee unanimously agrees no one met the criteria.

Anyone in the square dance community is welcome to nominate people for the Leadership Award. The Rochester area is blessed with many fine leaders and it would be helpful to those on the Selection Committee to receive input from the square dance community. If you know of someone you feel should be considered, please send a note identifying the individual or couple and their qualifications. Bob and Nora will be serving on the Selection Committee for three years and would be happy to present candidates and their qualifications to the committee for consideration.
