Already it's time for Dance-O-Rama. I'm sure it will be a great time for all participants. Thanks



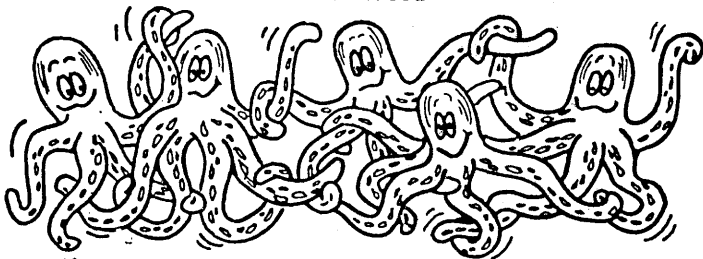
to all those who worked so hard to make it so. A special thanks to Jerry & Joan Sanford and Howie & Gerry Borden, Co-Chairpersons for the event!

I want to thank those of you, and there were many, who sent cards, etc, during my recent illness. It sure feels good to get back to some of the things we all take for granted while we are

healthy. I've checked my records and find that there have been very few recipes for homemade bread. Here is one that has been a favorite in our house. The recipe is for a bread machine, but if you are a purist you may hand knead, let the dough rise and than bake in 2 loaf pans.

ONION DILL BREAD

Mix together, warm and add to pan; 1/4 cup water minus 1-2 tbs - 3/4 cup cottage cheese - 3/4 cup sour cream - 3 tbs sugar - 3 tbs minced dried onions - 2 tbs whole dill seed - 2 tbs caraway seeds - 1 1/2 tbs butter.

Then add to pan 1 unbeaten egg - 1 1/2 tsp salt - 1/4 tsp baking soda - 3 1/3 cups flour - 2 1/2 tsp (active dry) yeast.

Place ingredients in pan according to directions for your machine. Select white bread mode, and push "start". When finished baking, remove from pan and cool on wire rack. Be sure that loaf is completely cooled before slicing. This may be a major test of your will power.

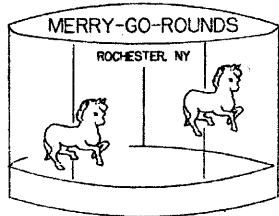

shop from 7:30-8:00 where we learn some of the new Phase 2 dances that are just a little tricky, or a new Phase 3 dance.

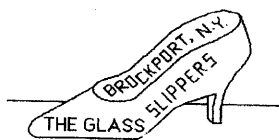

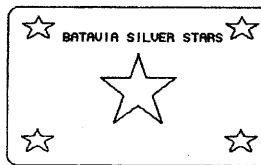

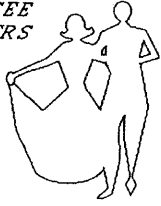

We are trying to turn ourselves to the future - and have some

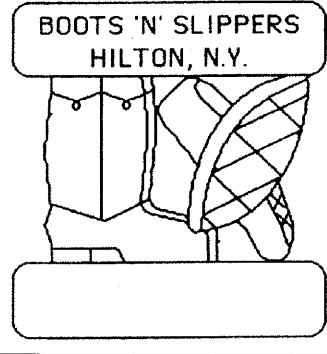
