Fall is upon us and the yard chores are taking a lot of our spare time. Here is a recipe that can be made in advance and frozen to be reheated when time is of the essence! This recipe is for 8

servings, but may be adjusted for more or less servings.

AMARETTO CHICKEN

5 boned skinless chicken breasts - 3 tb flour - 1 ½ ts garlic salt - 1 ½ ts ground pepper - 2 ts paprika - 1 tb vegetable oil - 3 tb margarine - 1 ½ tb dijon mustard - 1 can 6 1/4 oz. frozen orange juice - 1 cup amaretto.

Mix the can of frozen orange juice with half a can of water. Preheat oven to 350F. Combine flour, salt, pepper, paprika and garlic salt. Coat chicken with this mixture. Heat oil and margarine in skillet and saute chicken until browned all over. Remove and place in casserole. To skillet, add mustard, orange juice and amaretto. Increase heat and boil, stirring constantly until thick. Pour sauce over chicken and bake, covered, for 45 minutes. This can be frozen and reheated later. Serve with cooked rice and vegetable of choice.

BANNER STEALING RULES

Condensed or revised 9/8/96

- 1) Clubs taking part in Banner Stealing must register with the Rochester Area Federation and have at least one "Traveling Banner" to be stolen.
- 2) To steal a banner, the Stealing Club must have at least four couples who pay the visitors fee. A representative must advise the Host Club's President at least 48 hours in advance. (If more than one club is going to steal a banner - the first club to notify the Host Club has preference.) It is the responsibility of the Stealing Club to safeguard the stolen banner and return it only to the owner's club.
- 3) To retrieve your stolen banner, you must have at least four paying couples. To steal the Host's banner on the same dance night, you must have an additional four paying couples and notify the Host Club 48 hours in advance..
- 4) If a banner has not been retrieved within a reasonable time (three months of the dancing season), the stealing club is allowed to send no more than four couples, as guests, to return the banner. The owning club shall be notified a week in advance of the plans.
- 5) Banner stealing and retrieving shall be restricted to regular scheduled dances only. Special dances with a guest caller is subject to approval, in advance, by Host Club's President.

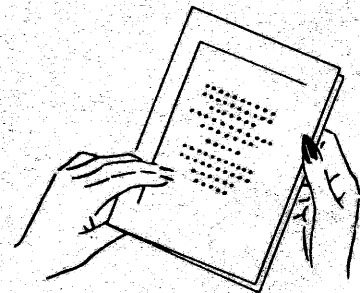
