What happened to this year? Here it is December already and I haven't even thought about gift shopping! Here is a heart healthy recipe for one of the holiday appetizer favorites.

Lo-Fat Spicy Stuffed Eggs

6 hard cooked eggs - 1 green onion, chopped fine with some green tops - 1 T no-fat mayonnaise - 1 T minced parsley - 2 sweet gerkin pickles, chopped fine - 1/2 t dijon mustard - 1/2 t salt (opt) - 1/8 t pepper

Peel the eggs and halve them lengthwise. Place 1 yolk in a small bowl; discard the remaining yolks. With a fork, mash the yolk; then add 4 of the egg white halves and mash them. Mix in the green onion, mayonnaise, parsley, pickles, mustard, salt and pepper to taste.

Mound the mixture into the remaining egg white halves, dividing it evenly. Garnish each half with a parsley sprig, if you like. Cover loosely and refrigerate until ready to serve. Makes 8 stuffed half eggs. When mashing the whites into the 1 yolk, if mixture is not sufficiently colored, add a drop or two of yellow food coloring.



THE DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD

At last May's Dance-O-Rama, you may have noticed something missing – there was no new recipient for the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award. In accordance with the process guidelines established by the award's originators, the Selection Committee chose not to present the award for 1997. This decision caused a mild controversy and generated a new interest in the award. In retrospect, this renewed interest is perhaps the best thing that could have happened.

THE ORIGINAL AWARD GUIDELINES

The leadership award was established in 1977 by Frank Salvagio and John Fink in honor of their wives, Norma and Daphne. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation for EXTENSIVE AND SUSTAINED LEADERSHIP OVER AN EXTENDED PERIOD OF YEARS in square, round or contra dancing. Leadership, service and motivation are considered when evaluating candidates for this award. A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may include (but are not limited to) years of dancing or calling; membership, committee service or officer role in any of the following: Square, Round or Contra club; Rochester Area Federation; Promenader; Dance-O-Rama; NYS Association or National Associations; promoting the activity through calling or teaching, and other leadership roles which benefit the community through the dance activity; and finally, the candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the dancing community. An individual or couple may win the award only once. The award may not be given if the Selection Committee unanimously agrees no one met the criteria. Anyone in the dancing community is welcome to nominate people for the Leadership Award.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

The above guidelines contain the criteria for the award, but do not answer all the questions surrounding the selection process. Hopefully, many of these questions are answered here:

Q: How long has the Federation been giving out this award?

Although presented at Dance-O-Rama, the Leadership award is not governed by or given by the Federation. It was originated in 1977 by Frank Salvagio and John Fink in honor of their wives. It is governed by and presented by the Selection Committee.

Q: Who is the Selection Committee?

The award originators are permanent Selection Committee members. The most recent three recipients form the remainder of the committee. Currently, the members are: John & Daphne Fink, Frank & Norma Salvagio, Walt & Sally Baechle, Chip Kellogg & Sue Yara, and Bob & Nora Slomcenski.

Q: How do people get nominated?

Anyone in the dance community can nominate a candidate. This is done by sending information about the candidate's qualifications to the Selection Committee. The information should address as many as possible of the qualification areas outlined in the guidelines above. There is a nomination form available for listing this information.

Q: What information should a nomination include?

You don't have to use an 'official' nomination form, just include as much as possible of the following information in a letter or outline format (A nominee does not have to have entries in all the catagories).

Nominator Information

Name, address, phone.

Nominee Information

- 1. Name
- 2. Years of dancing and/or calling
- 3. Club organizations & participation
- 4. Local organizations & participation
- 5. State organizations & participation (both dance and other)
- 6. National organizations & participation (both dance and other)
- 7. Other leadership roles (not only dancing. eg: community service)
- 8. Miscellaneous information (anything else that might be relevant)

Q: What is the status of people previously nominated, but not selected?

In general, once nominated, a candidate's name stays in consideration for all future years. Some older nominations are 'retired' after several years only if they are no longer associated with the dance activity or are deemed no longer qualified. Of course, any new or updated information about previous nominees is valuable to keep their records up to date. If you have nominated someone in the past, consider sending in an update to add new information.


death of Charlene Fagan, one of our class members from last year and extend our sympathy to her husband Bernie.

The holiday season is upon us again. Enjoy it but don't forget dancing and your square dance club Christmas parties.


The Circul-8-tors Christmas dance and party will be on December 21, at the Green
