

CHEF'S CORNER...

With many thanks to one of my favorite web sites, "CopyKat Recipes" which enables one to duplicate your favorite restaurant's special dishes. Here is a pasta dish which is a great way to dress up pasta!

PIZZA HUT CAVATINI

1/2 lb. pepperoni, sliced thin

1/4 lb. rotini, (spiral noodles)

1 green pepper, sliced thin

1/4 lb. shell noodles

1 onion, sliced thin

1/4 lb. wheat noodles

mushrooms, (optional) to taste

8 oz. Mozzarella cheese, shredded

1/2 lb. hamburger (browned)

8 oz. parmesan cheese (shredded)

1/2 lb. Italian sausage, removed from casing, browned

2 jars (32 oz.) spaghetti sauce of your choice

Cook noodles according to box directions. Heat sauce and combine with cooked hamburger and cooked sausage. In an 11 x 13-inch pan, sprayed with vegetable spray, layer noodles and sauce. Top layer with pepperoni, onions, green peppers, mushrooms and cheeses. Make about 3 layers and top with cheese. Bake at 350 degrees F. for about 45 minutes or until cheese is melted and ingredients are hot throughout. Serve with warm Italian or French bread.

In Memoriam

The Promenader has received information that on March 19, 1999, Kenneth Anderson passed away at the age of 73.

Ken was the regular caller for EKC-O Squares from 1966 to 1981. In those years, there were big crowds at all the EKC-O dances, with guests from all the Rochester clubs. He devoted 37 years to professional square dance calling. Ken moved to Florida in 1981 and retired in May 1992 at Strawberry Square, in Plant City, Florida.

He is survived by his wife, Jean, four sons, two daughters, 19 grandchildren, and four great-greatgrandchildren. The **Silver Club** is a way of recognizing dancers who have danced to 25 callers/cuers at club dances. These dancers receive the Silver Club badge dangle. At least 15 of the 25 clubs must be affiliated with the Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs. A maximum of 10 non-affiliated clubs can be used, including Dance-O-Rama. The same caller or cuer may be used more than once,

as long as they are calling/cueing at a different club.

When the required number of signatures are collected in a Silver Club booklet, it is shown to the Federation presidents or their reps, who will verity the names and authorize the dancer to wear the special Silver Club badge dangle.

Silver Club booklets will be available at D.O.R. Just ask at the ticket table.
