

CHEF'S CORNER...

This is an easy appetizer that can be prepared ahead of time to serve when having a BBQ this summer. It also allows you to enjoy the time with your guests rather than frantically fussing in the kitchen. It is also acceptable for those on low-fat diets!

EAT ALL YOU WANT CRAB DIP

8 oz. low-fat cream cheese, soften 1 to 2 minutes in microwave

1 teaspoon Old Bay seasoning

1/2 lb. crab meat

1 cup dry sherry

1/2 teaspoon garlic powder

1/2 cup no-fat mayonnaise

1/2 teaspoon dry mustard

Blend all but the crab meat until smooth. Mix in crab. Heat until warm in microwave (1 to 2 minutes, or so) or serve chilled with crackers, toasted rye bread squares (1/4 slices) or with celery shovels (1/4 of celery stick), or hot Italian or French bread slices. Enjoy your summer. See you in the fall!!

Georgers Receive Norma-Daphne Award at D.O.R.

On May 1, at ceremonies at the 1999 Dance-O-Rama, held at Churchville-Chili Middle School, Ken and Kay Georger received the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award. The award highlights extensive and sustained leadership over an extended period of years in square, round, or contra dancing. It was established in 1977 by Frank Salvagio and John Fink in honor of their wives, Norma and Daphne. Candidates are evaluated on the basis of leadership, service, and motivation.

The Georgers started square dancing in 1969. They joined the Country Twirlers upon graduation, and have served as officers for 16 of the years since, including social chairmen, publicity, vice presidents, federation reps, and presidents.


On the Federation level, they have participated on many committees, have set up and maintain the "master calendar," and have served as corresponding secretaries, vice presidents, and currently as presidents.

The Georgers are very busy people in the area of community involvement, also. Their volunteer commitments include Festival and Bingo work at St. Helen's Church, ushering at Geva, the Broadway Theatre League, and the Downstairs Cabaret; helping out at the Zoo, transporting the elderly for Gates Recreation, repairing books at the Gates Library, and donating blood. They have also helped with the concession stands at LPGA events, as well as the PGA Ryder Cup; and when their boys were in the Boy Scouts, Ken and Kay served as Scout Master and Den Mother.

What Happened to Grace and Styling in Square 'Dancing'?

There were, at one point in time, several accepted points of courtesy and styling. Where did they go? When did the "Grand Square" stop having 32 beats of music? When did a "weave the ring" become a bump and grind display of twirls and kicks and patty cakes? When did "promenade halfway around" involve either the designated couples rushing headlong through the middle or the other couples doing some sort of highland fling? When did "do-sa-do" become a swing? When did "circle to a line" change to what is done today? Every time I hear dancers complain about the condition of the activity, it makes me wonder what is missing.

The older dancers remember the times when courtesy and grace were as much a part of the activity as the socializing. They remember when a courtesy turn was just that, not a crack-the-whip. When a square thru was done by letting go of hands. The dancers of today have little idea what a grand square feels like to be danced in time with the music. They are too busy twirling and swinging and so many other things that can't be defined, to even consider being in step with the music. It's as if they need to hurry and get back to where they started before anyone else does. It really is not a race.

I know. I've heard the arguments. "Most of the dancing is

boring." "Everyone else is doing it. I don't want to look like a geek." "It's more fun this way." And on and on and on ad nauseum.



Perhaps we should try putting the grace and the styling back into square "dancing." After all, isn't dancing supposed to be graceful? Instead of rushing into the middle and throwing the timing of the figure off, maybe we could try promenading half-way around the outside. Instead of trying to tie each other in knots and using several more beats, maybe we should try doing a square thru in ten beats (that would mean letting go of the hands). I'll bet if we all made an effort to practice the styling that we were all taught, we could put the grace and styling back into square dancing. I'll bet that if we really did this, we would have enough energy to go out after the dance and socialize with our friends and fellow dancers.

But that's just my opinion. I could be wrong.
