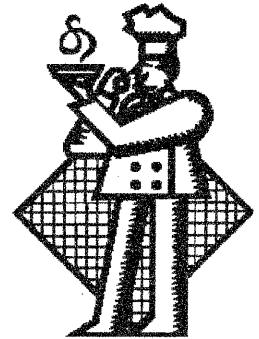

CHEF'S CORNER...

It's hard to believe that the summer is officially over. It's especially hard since as I am writing this column, the temperature outside is in the upper 80's. I hope you all had a nice summer and were able to stay cool during the, so called, Dog Days of August. But since this is the September issue of the *Promenader*, I guess we are all looking forward to the new dance season. The following recipe should perk up a few of the refreshment tables at the various clubs.

PUFFY ORANGE FRITTERS

2 eggs
1/2 cup sugar
2 T butter/margarine, melted
1 T grated orange rind
2 cups flour
2 t baking powder
1/2 t salt
1/2 cup orange juice
hot vegetable oil
powdered sugar



Beat eggs in large bowl; gradually add sugar, mixing well. Stir in butter and orange rind. Combine flour, baking powder, and salt; mix well. Add to the egg mixture alternating with orange juice, beginning and ending with flour mixture. Let batter stand 15 minutes. Drop mixture by rounded teaspoonfuls into hot vegetable oil (350°F); cook fritters until golden, turning once. Drain well on paper towels. Sprinkle with powdered sugar. Yields about 3 dozen.

We only received 2 responses from the 18 letters that were sent to all club presidents asking for nominees for officers.

Attendance DOR '99 = 316 (down 168 (35%) from DOR '98 (484)

Income DOR '98 = \$5860; DOR '99 = \$3416 (-\$2444)

Expenses DOR '98 = \$3408; DOR '99 = \$3770 (-\$362)

In spite of a great job done by the Sieberts, Feinbergs and Sanfords, the community support was lacking both in attendance and volunteer support (50% of clubs). Maybe it's time to re-think this event. Should we downsize on the number of halls, levels and callers; make it an evening event only (+61% buy all-day); change location??? We need to know what the dancers want! Let's discuss it!

3. Open house schedules — Will every club try again to run a class with 2 or 3 couples or can we try to combine classes resulting in more fun with less expense?
4. Publicity — Advertise at the movies!! Mike Herne will introduce a representative who will discuss the possibility of advertising Square Dancing at Movie theaters throughout the area.
5. Dine-A-Mate books will be available for those who ordered and others on a limited basis. Books can be ordered at the meeting.

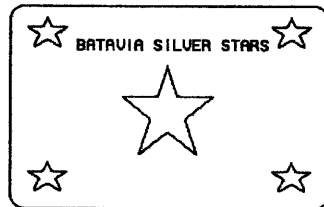

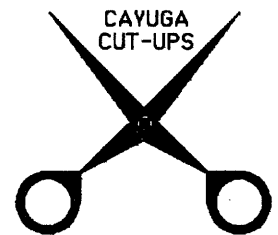

All dances in September and the first dance of every month will be a dress-down night. It will be noted in the *Promenader* as casual attire.

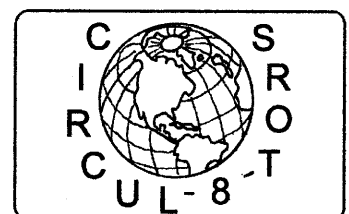
