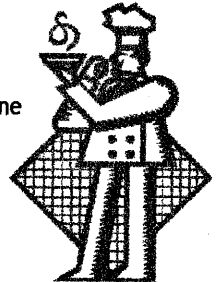

CHEF'S CORNER...

I know many of us, including myself, are having to be quite conscious of the fat content of our daily food intake. The following recipe is not only low fat but it is also delicious. I have to give credit to Wegmans for their in-store recipes. This dish is quick to prepare and has a tasty tang to it.

COUSCOUS ALLA TRAPANESE

- 2 T olive oil
- 1 small onion, minced
- 1 cup matchstick carrots
- 1 small to medium small zucchini cut in julienne strips
- 1/2 lb. cooked shrimp, peeled and deveined
- 6 oz. couscous, (I use couscous with garlic flavor)
- 2 cups clam juice or chicken broth
- 1/2 cup canned roma tomatoes, chopped



Directions:

1. Heat oil in a large non-stick skillet on medium heat. Add onions and cook 1 minute, stirring often.
2. Add carrots; cook 2 minutes longer, add zucchini; cook 2 minutes longer. Add couscous and shrimp; cook 1 minute longer, (each addition should be stirred continuously).
3. Stir in broth and season with salt and pepper if desired. Bring to a boil then move skillet off burner.
4. Top with chopped tomato and let sit, covered, for 6 minutes. Fluff with fork and serve.
5. Serve with warm Italian or French bread.

President's Corner

Why do we have a "Federation"?

Where does the Federation get its money?

What does the Federation do with the money?

I'm sure many of you have asked yourself these questions, as we did before we became involved with the Federation. We hope this answers some of your questions.

As we mentioned in our Sept. '98 article "the Federation is for YOUR benefit to:

1. provide information and promote interest in Round & Square Dancing and
2. to operate as a service organization to coordinate Club activities".

Meetings provide a means of exchanging ideas with other clubs to find out what experience they have had, what works and what doesn't work. It's a good place to promote your club activities and save postage expense by distributing flyers. The Federation also enables your club to obtain the necessary liability insurance at reasonable rates.

FEDERATION INCOME is primarily from Dance-O-Rama profits and club dues (\$10 per club). DOR profits of \$1275 ('96), \$1853 ('97) and \$1389 ('98) have resulted in a May 31, 1999 balance of \$3656.93. Last months article explains the reasons why the profit for DOR '99 was only \$8.31.

THE DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD

We would like your assistance in selecting a person or couple for the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award. The Award is presented at Dance-O-Rama. However, even though Dance-O-Rama is sponsored by the Rochester Area Federation, it does not govern, sponsor or present the Award. It is governed by and presented by the Selection Committee. We need you to nominate people you feel meet the criteria for The Award.

The Original Award Guidelines

The leadership award was established in 1977 by John Fink and Frank Salvagio in honor of their wives, Daphne and Norma. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation for **EXTENSIVE AND SUSTAINED LEADERSHIP OVER AN EXTENDED PERIOD OF YEARS** in square, round or contra dancing. Leadership, service and motivation are considered when evaluating candidates for this award. A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may include (but are not limited to) years of dancing, cueing or calling; membership; committee service or officer role in any of the following: Square, Round or Contra club; Rochester Area Federation; Promenader; Dance-O-Rama; NYS Association or National Associations; promoting the activity through calling, cueing or teaching, and other leadership roles which benefit the community through the dance activity; and finally, the candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the dancing community. An individual or couple may win the award only once. The award may not be given if the Selection Committee unanimously agrees no one met the criteria. Anyone in the dancing community is welcome to nominate people for the Leadership Award.

Questions and Answers

We have tried to think of some of the questions you may have. Hopefully, we have answered at least some of them:

Q: Who is the Selection Committee? The award originators are permanent Selection committee members. Being that Salvagios are not active in the dance community anymore, Frank has asked Walt and Sally Baechle to be permanent members on the committee. The most recent three recipients form the remainder of the committee. So currently, the members are John & Daphne Fink, Walt & Sally

Baechle, Bob & Nora Slomcenski, Carl & Elaine Mallaber and Ken & Kay Georger.

Q: How do people get nominated? Anyone in the dance community can nominate a candidate. This is done by sending information about the candidate's qualifications to the Selection Committee, in care of Ken & Kay Georger, 44 Kernwood Drive, Rochester, NY 14624, by the end of February.

Q: What is the status of people previously nominated, but not selected? Candidates previously nominated generally stay in consideration for all future years. However, new or updated information should be sent. There is nothing wrong with sending in another nomination with current info.

- 8) Miscellaneous information (anything else that might be relevant)

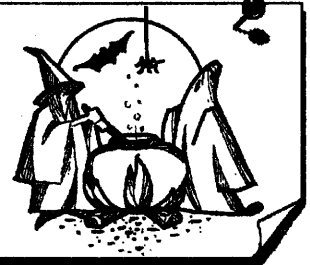

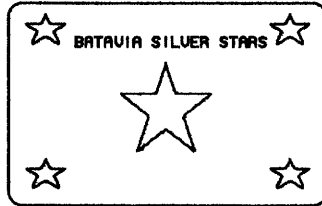

On October 27 come and enjoy HoBo Night with guest caller and cuer Phil Eno of Martsville, New York. This is sure to be another fun thrilling night.

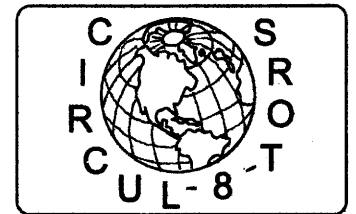

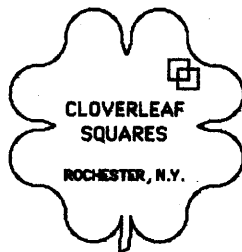

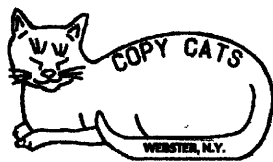
October 16 is our Halloween Dance. Although it's a bit early for Halloween, come dressed in costume, if you wish — fancy, scary, creative, ugly — whatever.

We end our month with **Tim Crawford** and **Brian Adams** doing our Halloween Party on October 30. Costumes are optional. Always great dancing with Tim.

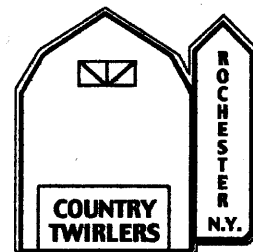
