

CHEF'S CORNER...

With the weather getting crisper, or down right colder, it seems a good time to get back to cooking in the kitchen rather than outdoors on the grill. This recipe was gleaned from the Internet's "Recipe du Jour" site. It can be made to the following recipe for those who cannot eat foods that are too spicy. It can, however, be Cajunized by adding some Cajun spices to the coating mix.

SOUTHERN OVEN-FRIED CATFISH

2 egg whites

1/4 cup malt vinegar

1 cup crushed crispy wheat cereal squares

1/4 cup whole dillweed

1/4 t. seasoned salt

2 lbs. fresh catfish fillets

vegetable cooking spray

lemon wedges (optional)



Combine egg whites and vinegar; stir well and set aside. Combine cereal, dillweed and seasoned salt; toss to mix. Dip fillets into egg white mixture; lightly coat with cereal mixture. Place fillets on a broiler pan lightly coated with cooking spray. Bake at 400°F for 15 minutes or until fish flakes easily when tested with a fork. Garnish with lemon wedges, if desired. Serves 8. Serve with vegetables of your choice.

- 1) Clubs taking part in Banner Stealing must register with the Rochester Area Federation and have at least one "Traveling Banner" to be stolen.
- 2) To steal a banner, the Stealing Club must have at least four couples who pay the visitors' fee. A representative must advise the Host Club's president at least 48 hours in advance. (If more than one club is going to steal a banner the first club to notify the Host Club has preference.) It is the responsibility of the Stealing Club to safeguard the stolen banner and return it only to the owner's club.

stolen banner, you must have at least four paying couples. To steal the Host's banner on the same dance night, you must have an additional four paying

couples and notify the Host Club 48 hours

in advance..

4) If a banner has not been retrieved within a reasonable time (three months of the dancing season), the stealing club is allowed to send no more than four couples, as (non-paying) guests, to return the banner. The owning club shall be notified a week in advance of the plans.

5) Banner stealing and retrieving shall be restricted to regular scheduled dances only. Special dances with a guest caller are subject to approval, in advance, by Host Club's president.

Promote camaraderie. Get them involved and praise them no matter what.


Remind them of the benefits of square dancing and fun yet to be experienced.
