CHEF'S CORNER...

The seasons go by quite quickly when the issues are bi-monthly. Looking at the calendar I see that Christmas and the New Year/millennium will be upon us before we know it. Here is a different biscuit recipe to perk up your holiday meals.

JUST LIKE RED LOBSTER CHEESE GARLIC BISCUITS

2 cups biscuit baking mix (I use Bisquick low fat)

2/3 cup milk

1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese

1/4 cup melted butter or margarine

1/4 teaspoon garlic powder

- Preheat oven to 450°F.
- Stir together baking mix, milk and cheese to get a soft dough. Beat vigorously with a wooden spoon about 30 seconds.
- Drop dough by spoonfuls onto ungreased baking sheet.
- Bake 8 to 10 minutes or until golden brown.
- Meanwhile, stir together melted margarine and garlic powder.
 Brush over biscuits as soon as they are done.
- Serve warm.

Makes 10 to 12 biscuits.





Dancers: It sometimes happens that while dancing, a situation arises where someone collapses or faints, and it may be difficult for the caller to see what has occurred. IT IS IMPORTANT, therefore, that all dancers familiarize themselves with the square dance method of dealing with this kind of situation. This method is called E.C.M.A.



ECMA

Emergency Call for Medical Aid

E.C.M.A. is the abbreviation for Emergency Call for Medical Aid. This signal is designed for use by dancers to notify the caller of a medical problem in their square. When such a problem occurs, important minutes are often lost in the frenzy of waving arms and explanations which cannot be heard or understood across a crowded dance floor. The method of an ARCHED CIRCLE will assure the fastest possible response time by medical personnel to an emergency on the dance floor. In this way, precious, perhaps lifesaving minutes, can be saved.

STEP ONE: When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends him/her.

STEP TWO: Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This allows the injured person and attendant air and room.

STEP THREE: Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.

STEP FOUR: On seeing this signal, the caller or club representative will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.

This system was, to our knowledge, first introduced at the 33rd National Square Dance Convention in Atlantic City, New Jersey, in 1977. It was their hope that callers across the country would take the time to explain the arched circle ECMA signal to their dancers and familiarize them with both the procedure and its purpose. This is not being done and we feel that this is an important part of our being prepared in the event of an emergency.

Clubs — please familiarize your callers, members, and guests with this procedure.

Dip 'n Twist

As snowflakes fall and the air turns brisk, we launch into the holiday festivities and look for-
