

CHEF'S CORNER...

Summer is going to start winding down soon and we will soon be raking leaves and preparing the garden for the cold months ahead. But don't despair. There will probably be enough warm weather to get in that last boat trip or days at the beach. Here is a meal that is not only very easy to prepare, it is also very light in the cholesterol and sodium content. Perfect for a warm, end of summer, patio dinner.

CAPELLINI WITH SCALLOPS

16 ounces Capellini, cooked and drained

1/3 cup extra virgin olive oil

2 teaspoons of minced garlic, or more to taste

1/4 cup flat leaf parsley, chopped

1/3 cup sun-dried tomatoes, packed in oil, drained and chopped

2 tablespoons fresh basil, chopped

1/4 teaspoon red pepper flakes (optional)

2 packages (12 oz. each) frozen bay scallops.

Saute garlic in olive oil in a large skillet.

- Stir in parsley, tomatoes, basil, red pepper flakes (if used) and scallops.
- Simmer 3 to 4 minutes, until scallops are cooked. Be careful not to cook scallops too much.
- Toss with hot cooked pasta. Serve with warm crusty Italian or French bread. A nice bottle of cold white wine would top off the meal.



Dancing is alive and kicking in Auburn. Please join us on any Thursday night for dancing and fellowship.



A Brief History of Square Dancing

It is difficult to trace the roots of modern square and round dancing. Certainly, the history goes back to our English and French ancestors, but there are traces of Scottish, Scandinavian, Spanish and other elements.

As the early pioneers moved west to settle this great country their dances went with them. In the first part of the 20th century, American dancing suffered a great decline. Quadrilles and Contras died. A rowdy form of dancing called the barn dance set a precedence square dancers

have sought to overcome.

It took a great industrialist and superintendent from a small school in Colorado to lift the great American folk activity out of the doldrums.

Mr. Henry Ford used to vacation at the Wayside Inn in Sudbury, Massachusetts. There he became interested in the dance program conducted by a dancing master named Benjamin Lovett. The program included the gavotte, mazurkas, the schottische, the minuet, the Virginia reel and other squares and rounds. Mr. Ford tried to hire Mr. Lovett, who declined, pointing out that he had a firm contract with the Inn. Ford bought the Inn

and Mr. Lovette's contract and took Mr. Lovette back to Detroit. In Detroit Ford established a broad program for

teaching squares and rounds, including radio broadcasts and programs for schools. He built a beautiful dance hall in Greenfield Village (Dearborn, MI) which is still in use today.

Ford and Lovette published a book called "Good Morning" which was purchased by a school, superintendent from Colorado Springs, Colorado named Lloyd Shaw. The book only scratched the surface of American dancing so Lloyd Shaw set out to interview people across the country collecting dances in his travels. In 1939 he published the first definitive work on Western Square Dancing "Cowboy Dancing." He later published a round dance book He trained dancers in his Cheyenne Mountain School and took them around the country demonstrating and teaching Western Square Dancing. He trained new leaders and the activity exploded throughout the country.

The art of moving people grew as the Callers' experience grew. The electronic amplifier made it easy for the Caller (no pun intended). Recordings (45 RPM) replaced live bands and lowered cost of doing dances and provided greater variety and flexibility in the music used. Today, the use of CD's has further enhanced the caller's repertoire.

In 1974 an International Callers organization known as Callerlab was formed to unify square dance programs being taught throughout the world. The Callerlab program is now taught throughout the world and Square Dances are called in English no matter what country you visit.

There is a move underway to make Square Dancing the official dance of New York State and the United States.






