



CHEF'S CORNER...

The calendar says that spring is just around the corner. But there is always a chance of a left over flake or two of snow and a few of the lower degrees still on the thermometer. So I guess it will have to be a real body and soul warmer of a recipe for this issue of the *Prome* - nader. This recipe is one that my daughter got from her mother-in-law

KAPOSZTAS GALUSKA

(Hungarian Cabbage and Noodles)

- 1 cabbage (approx. 2 lbs.), cored, chopped very fine
- 1 tablespoon salt
- 3 slices bacon or 4 tablespoons butter
- 1 12oz. pkg. wide egg noodles
- 1 tablespoon poppy seeds

Freshly ground pepper

Put cabbage in a colander and sprinkle with salt; let stand about 30 minutes. Squeeze dry; blot on paper towels. Cook noodles according to package directions. In a heavy, deep skillet fry bacon until crisp. Remove bacon and leave 4 tablespoons of fat in the pan. Over medium heat, add cabbage to the skillet and sprinkle with a pinch of pepper, or to taste. Saute, stirring until lightly golden. Put cabbage in a large bowl; add cooked noodles, sugar and poppy seeds. Blend together. Serve with warm, crusty, French or Italian bread.







Do you have your Silver Club dangle?

The Silver Club is a way of recognizing dancers who have danced to 25 callers/cuers at club dances. These dancers receive the Silver Club badge dangle. At least 15 of the 25 clubs must be affiliated with the Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs. A maximum of 10 non-affiliated clubs can be used, including Dance-O-Rama.

The same caller or cuer may be used more than once, as long as they are calling/cueing at a different club.

When the required number of signatures are collected in a Silver Club

booklet, it is shown to the Federation presidents or their reps, who will verify the names and authorize the dancer to wear the special Silver Club badge dangle.

Silver Club booklets will be available at D.O.R. Just ask at the ticket table.





The square dance community wishes to note the passing of Ralph F. Dell, who died on January 19, 2001. He was predeceased by his wife of 47 years, Katherine. They had been members of the Country Twirlers, serving in various offices, and were also active as Federation officers. Ralph worked for many years with the Boy Scouts, and also was very involved with the Teen Twirler's Square Dance Group when their children were growing up.

The Dells served as publicity chairmen for both the Country Twirlers and the Federation. Ralph had a special flair for fixing things, making many little inventions over the years, and building computers from scratch. The year before he died, he even fixed up a motorcycle.
