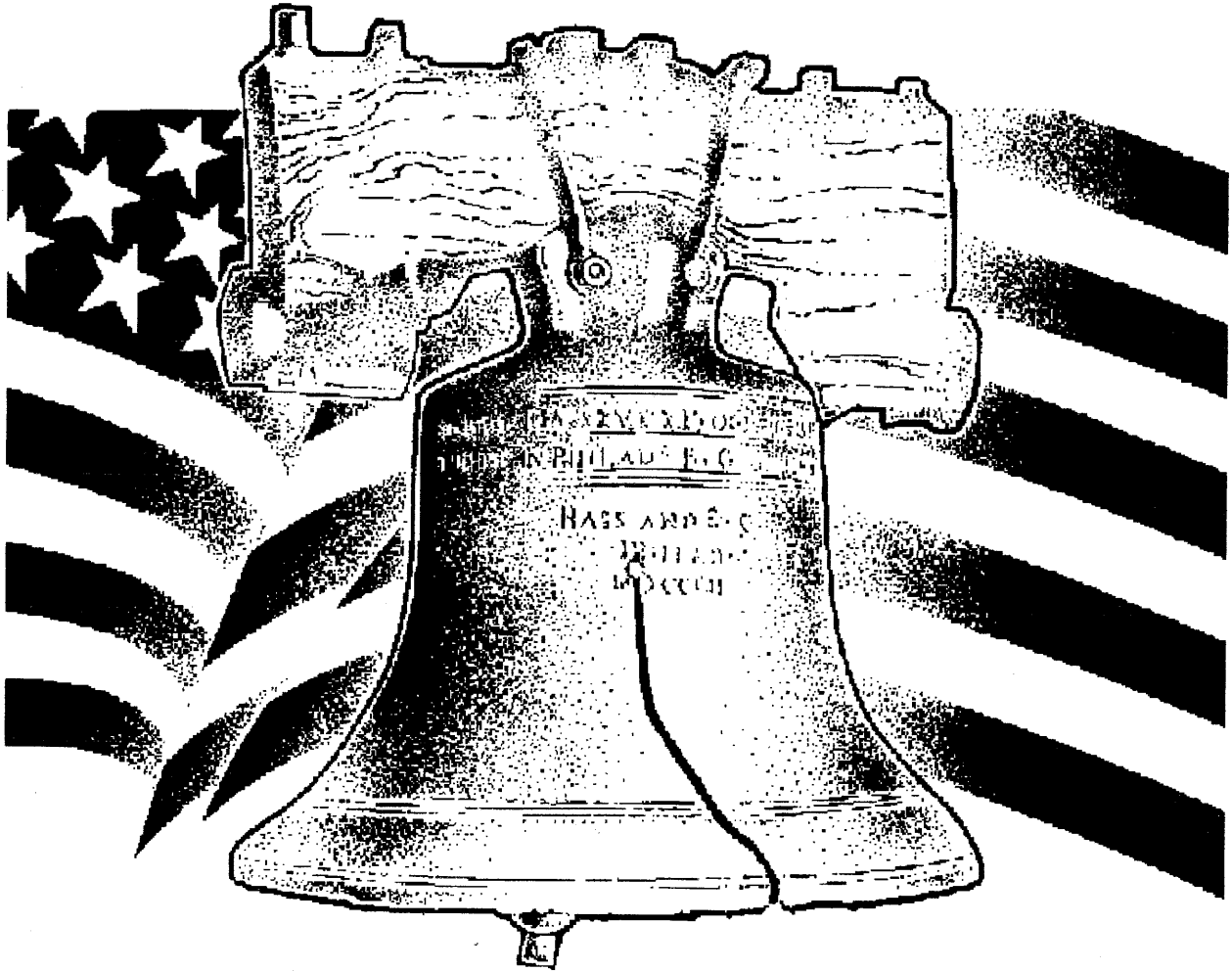

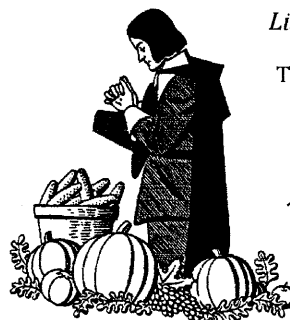

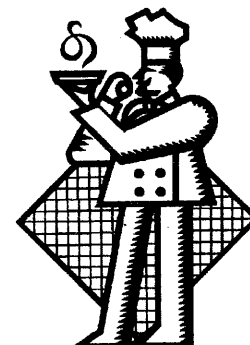

CHEF'S CORNER...

Summer is "officially" over, yet there is still time for some indoor prep and outdoor cooking, or if you have an indoor electric grill, you could enjoy a cocktail while preparing this different but quite tasty fall dinner.

HAWAIIAN GRILLED PORK CHOPS

- 1 can (20 oz.) pineapple slices
- 6 one-inch-thick trimmed pork chops
- 1/2 cup soy sauce
- 1/3 cup vegetable oil
- 1/4 cup onion, minced
- 1 clove or more to taste, garlic, minced
- 1 tablespoon brown sugar.



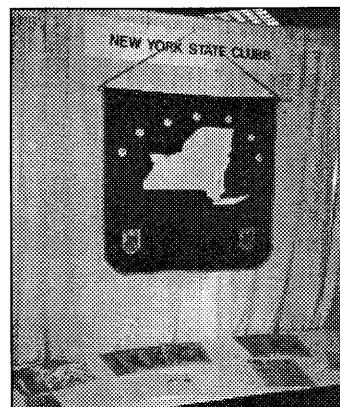
Drain pineapple, reserving 1/4 cup of the juice.

Set pineapple aside. Place chops in a large shallow dish. combine reserved pineapple juice, soy sauce, oil, onion, garlic, and brown sugar, mixing well. Pour over the chops; cover and marinate in refrigerator 2 hours or more.

Remove chops, reserving marinade. Grill over medium coals 40 to 45 minutes, turning frequently and basting with marinade. Place a pineapple slice on each chop during the last few minutes of cooking time.

There was also a United Square Dancers of America meeting, where Rochester Federation was represented.

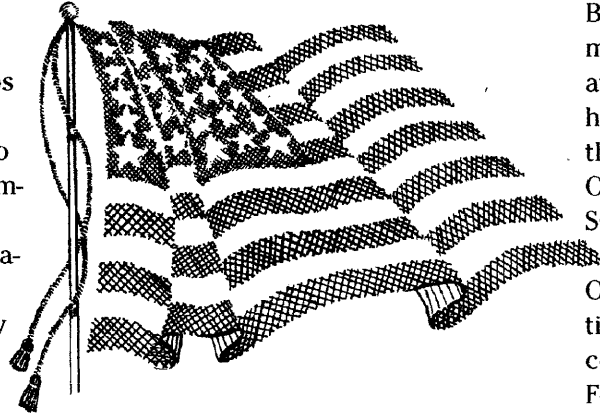

Federation Raises Funds for Disaster Relief Effort

Within days after the Attack on America on 09/11/01, the Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs announced that it had established a Disaster Relief Fund to collect donations from our community of dancers.

Proceeds will go to the Salvation Army, which within two days of the attack, had already fed more than 100,000 people, and set up crisis centers and canteens in the disaster area.

Dancers are being asked to bring their donations to their



club dances, or to the *Promenader* Benefit Dance on Sept. 29. Clubs may send monies raised to Federation treasurer Mary Ann Lane at her address listed on page 7 of this issue. CHECKS CAN BE MADE OUT TO THE ROCHESTER SQUARE DANCE FEDERATION.

The fund drive will run until Oct. 9, the date of the next Federation meeting. At that meeting, all contributions collected by the Federation will be presented to Salvation Army Major Robert Reel and his wife, Lynette, who will be in attendance.

USDA DISCOUNT PRESCRIPTION CARD

At their annual meeting, the Board of Directors of United Square Dancers of America approved participation in a discount prescription card service where **you can obtain savings on the average of about 20 to 25 per cent off the retail price.**

In addition, USDA will receive a royalty of 25 cents on each prescription filled. This royalty will be used **to promote square dancing.** The cards are available not only to square dancers but to your friends and family also.

Contact your Federation rep or any of the Federation officers listed on page 7 of this issue for more information and for your SCRIP Pharmacy Solutions card.

If you already have health coverage that includes prescriptions, you can use this card to save money when your plan does not cover a particular medication.

Most of the pharmacies in the country are on this program. Included on the extensive list are local pharmacies like Fisker's, K-Mart, Rite Aid, Sam's Club, Target, Tops, Wal-Mart, Wegmans, and so many more that we couldn't list them all here. For a complete list, go to www.findrx2go2.com.

Whether you use **one or a hundred** different pharmacies in this program, your prescription will always be checked for drug interaction with everything you have filled to date. This has become a valuable tool for safeguarding people against this serious problem.

How The SCRIP Discount Program Works

This is what an individual experiences when he uses the card:

- The individual presents his/her card and the original prescription to the pharmacist.
- The pharmacist then accesses the proper screen for the discount program. If the individual has not yet been registered, the pharmacist will then enter necessary identifying information (name, date of birth, social security) to permanently register them as a participant.
- At that point, the prescription information is entered into the pharmacy computer system along with the street price for that drug (street price being what he would charge anyone off the street who walked in).
- The computer compares the submitted pharmacy price with the discounted price*, determines which is lower and sends that price back to the pharmacy to be charged to the individual. This program has a very unique feature of allowing "less of the two," which means if the store "sale price" is lower than the discount price, the individual will get the lowest possible price for that drug, on that day, in that pharmacy.

*When arriving at the discounted price, the program will consider the "maximum allowable cost" of the federal HCFA-MAC and will use that pricing if it is lower than what the contracted discount would have produced.

- There is a pharmacy desk toll-free number available (shown on the member's ID card) to assist both members and pharmacists.

PLEASE NOTE: Timing is just as important in Discount Prescription Cards as it is in square dancing. Get the **free USDA** cards out to everyone who needs them **right away.** The government is going to offer senior citizens a discount card very similar to this program by the beginning of 2002. The big difference is it will probably have some drugs omitted and it will cost \$25 per year!

Why would people pay \$25 when they can get a better card from the USDA for free? Because if people do not know about the USDA card, they will gladly buy the government discount card because it represents a great value. All you have to do is get your card to them first!

Presidents' Corner...

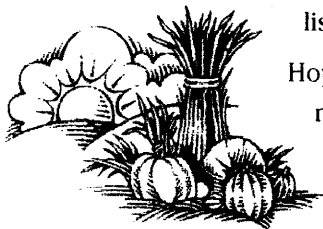
Sure is a great time of the year – beautiful fall season,

headed by Hazel Moses put on a Vaudeville

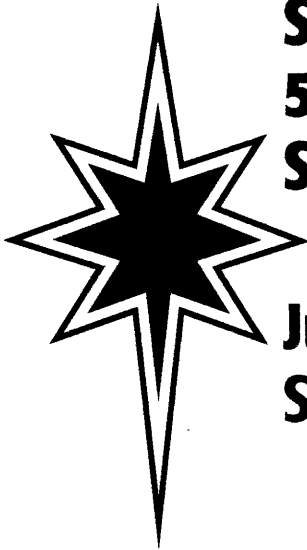
Show. Phil and Elaine Eno joined the group

TRIBUTE TO THE UNITED STATES

This editorial, given renewed news coverage in light of the recent events, was originally written in 1976 by Gordon Sinclair, a Toronto-based columnist and author, who died in 1984. What follows is the full text of his trenchant remarks as printed in the *Congressional Record*:

"America: The Good Neighbor"

"This Canadian thinks it is time to speak up for the Americans as the most generous and possibly the least appreciated people on all the earth.

Germany, Japan and, to a lesser extent, Britain and Italy were lifted out of the debris of war by the Americans who poured in billions of dollars and forgave other billions in debts. None of these countries is today paying even the interest on its remaining debts to the United States.

When France was in danger of collapsing in 1956, it was the Americans who propped it up, and their reward was to be insulted and swindled on the streets of Paris. I was there. I saw it.

When earthquakes hit distant cities, it is the United States that hurries in to help. This spring, 59 American communities were flattened by tornadoes. Nobody helped.

The Marshall Plan and the Truman Policy pumped billions of dollars into discouraged countries. Now newspapers in those countries are writing about the decadent, warmongering Americans.

I'd like to see just one of those countries that is gloating over the erosion of the United States dollar build its own airplane. Does any other country in the world have

a plane to equal the Boeing Jumbo Jet, the Lockheed Tri-Star, or the Douglas DC10? If so, why don't they fly them? Why do all the International lines except Russia fly American Planes?

Why does no other land on earth even consider putting a man or woman on the moon? You talk about Japanese technocracy, and you get radios. You talk about German technocracy, and you get automobiles. You talk about American technocracy, and you find men on the moon - not once, but several times and safely home again.

You talk about scandals, and the Americans put theirs right in the store window for everybody to look at. Even their draft-dodgers are not pursued and hounded. They are here on our streets, and most of them, unless they are breaking Canadian laws, are getting American dollars from ma and pa at home to spend here.

When the railways of France, Germany and India were breaking down through age, it was the Americans who rebuilt them. When the Pennsylvania Railroad and the New York Central went broke, nobody loaned them an old caboose. Both are still broke.

I can name you 5000 times when the Americans raced to the help of other people in trouble. Can you name me even one time when someone else raced to the Americans in trouble? I don't think there was outside help even during the San Francisco earthquake.

Our neighbors have faced it alone, and I'm one Canadian who is damned tired of hearing them get kicked around. They will come out of this thing with their flag high. And when they do, they are entitled to thumb their nose at the lands that are gloating over their present troubles. I hope Canada is not one of those."

Stand proud, America!

God Bless America!
