CHEF'S CORNER...

If the weather man ever cooperates, the backyard food fests are just around the corner. This would be a good time to clean up the grill and prepare for the summer burned offerings to the gods. The following recipe is just a little new and different than the usual tomato-based basting sauce for these succulent ribs that most of us really enjoy each year. This recipe is for a larger crowd than you might normally invite over for

CHERRY DELICIOUS RIBS

you intend serving.

8 pounds pork spareribs

the feast. It may be adjusted for the numbers

1 can of cherry pie filling (21-ounce), check cherries for pits before pureeing

1/2 cup chopped onion

2 tbs. Olive oil

1/4 cup soy sauce

2 tsp. spicy brown mustard

1 tsp. ground ginger

1 tsp Worcestershire sauce

Cut ribs into serving portions of 2 or 3 ribs each. In a large saucepan or Dutch oven, Simmer ribs, covered, in salted water 45 to 50 minutes or until tender; drain in an electric blender or food processor, puree cherry filling, until smooth. In a large saucepan, cook onion in olive oil until tender. Add pureed cherry filling, soy sauce, mustard, ginger and Worcestershire sauce; mix well. Simmer, uncovered, 10 to 15 minutes, stirring occasionally. Place ribs on gas grill over low heat or on charcoal grill 4 to 6 inches from slow coals. Turn ribs 3 or 4 times and brush frequently with sauce. Cook 25 minutes, or until done discard any remaining sauce. Serve with plenty of napkins and supply your guests with bibs.

NUTTY CRACKER DELIGHTS

42 Club crackers

1-1/2 sticks of butter, melted

1/2 cup sugar

1 tsp. vanilla extract

1 cup slivered almonds or nuts of your choice, chopped

Place crackers in a single layer in a foil-lined 15" x 10" baking pan. Cover crackers with almonds or other chopped nuts. In a saucepan over medium heat, melt butter then add sugar and bring to a boil to melt sugar, stirring constantly. Remove from heat, add vanilla. Pour evenly over crackers. Bake at 325 degrees for 10 minutes or until lightly browned. Immediately remove from the pan, cutting between the crackers if necessary and cool on wire rack. Store in airtight container.

We hope we haven't forgotten anyone, but if so, we apologize and say once again a heartfelt thanks to all those that helped make this event such a tremendous success.



committee could have awarded multiple awards this year. If you have nominated someone, don't give up on them — nominate them again. Even though all nominations are maintained from year to year, it helps to remind the committee again.

This year's winners, Don and Marian Ellinwood, have been dancing for over 30 years; they have served their club as federation reps, vice-presidents and presidents. They have chaired the club's weekend events; they have been instrumental in promoting square dancing in their area thru store displays, demos and parade floats.

In the community they are active sponsors of the county nursing home, providing over 100 gift baskets, and they initiated the annual Christmas party at the nursing home.

Don holds many offices in many civic organizations, including local, state and national levels. He wears some 25 to 30 hats and has progressed thru the chairs in the Masons. He is presently working to establish an Air Force museum at Sampson.

Marian is trained in tax preparation and spends time attending IRS workshops so she can offer free assistance to some 50 clients.

The Ellinwoods have been staunch supporters of the federation, serving in various offices, and also special activities, such as the Alzheimer Association fund raiser and the DOR committee. They have promoted DOR by bringing their club to DOR by the busload, and in years past by supplying food for the out-of-town callers.

Some Guidelines for New Dancers

- DANCE AT OTHER CLUBS: Your home club needs your support and there should always be a special place for the club where you learned to dance, but you are missing one of the great things about square dancing if you only dance with your home club.
- DANCE TO OTHER CALLERS: During lessons you tuned in to the caller who taught you, and you're probably most comfortable dancing to him. But every caller has a different style, that's part of the fun. Try others.
- 3. DANCE IN THE FRONT OF THE HALL: The tendency for the newer dancers is to hide in the back of the hall where they think the caller can't see their square break down. A good caller watches the whole floor, including the back square. Don't be afraid to dance in the front square.
- 4. DANCE WITH EXPERIENCED DANCERS: Sometimes an outreached hand from a more experienced dancer is all your square needs to keep going. Everyone dancing today was a new dancer at one time and can remember how it felt.
- 5. TOUCH HANDS AFTER EVERY MOVE: Establish your position by touching hands after every move. If you are

- lost, at least you'll have company.
- 6. KEEP DANCING: To use all the information you have learned and to make it become second nature, it's important to practice, practice, practice.
- 7. BE AWARE OF YOUR LEVEL. Look for dances advertised at the level you know — mainstream. Make a special effort to attend Class-Club dances. Even when you move on into plus calls, look for opportunities to practice mainstream and refine your style, perhaps by helping out with the next new class.
- 8. SQUARE DANCE FOR FUN: The odds are pretty good that someone is going to make a mistake (even a caller makes one sometimes). Don't worry about whose fault it was, it doesn't matter. Regroup and KEEP SMILING!
- FINALLY: Jump right up when the music starts; get in the first open square, do not pass one up, introduce yourself, smile and have fun. Thank everyone when the tip is over.

When submitting material by e-mail, please send your information right in the body of the e-mail message rather than going the attachment route. That saves us from having to scan for viruses, download the file, and open the an extra application to see it. And the end result is the same.


Also, because we use a MAC computer, and many of you have PC's, we often get a lot of gibberish when Microsoft word files come across the platforms. (We work mostly in Quark Xpress and Photoshop.)

For artwork, if you have the ability to make PDF documents, that usually works well. EPS files are also good for image quality, but be careful that they don't become too large (it's best not to send anything electronically that is more than 1MB in size). Photographs that are TIFs or good quality JPEGs are usable in ads.



October 4, 2002 Apple Harvest Dance May/June 2003 Apple Blossom Dance




