



CHEF'S CORNER...

It is about that time to get out the shoe polish and touch up those dancing shoes. Also it might be a good time to check out the skirts and shirts in case they might need a touch-up with the old steam iron!

As it is the time that many clubs are coming out of their summer hiatus which means we might start thinking about the refreshment tables and what to bring when it is our turn. Here is a recipe that I picked up from the internet that might be what

you are looking for.

RUSSIAN BALLS

- 1 cup butter/margarine
- 4 tablespoons sugar
- 2 cups flour
- 2 teaspoons vanilla
- 2 cups walnuts, chopped
- 1/4 cup powdered sugar



Cream butter and sugar. Add in flour and vanilla. Finely chop walnuts and add to batter. Pinch off pieces of dough and roll between hands into small bite-size balls.

Bake on an ungreased cookie sheet in a 350°F. oven for 30 to 40 minutes

Remove from oven. Cool slightly and roll in powdered sugar. Yield: 48 cookies.

An avid dancer since the late 1970s, Bill became a member of numerous local square and round dance clubs. He continued dancing until his legs would no longer allow it.

Shortly after he gave up dancing he was honored at a surprise 90th birthday party at the home of his daughter, Sue Masters. Many of his square dance friends attended.

Says daughter Sue about Bill, "He was my hero, a patient, gentle giant and my best friend. He was always a gentleman." These qualities endeared him to his friends wherever he went.

Bill's other interests included roller skating, golf, biking, bowling, fishing and photography. He especially enjoyed family gatherings at his summer home on Conesus Lake.

Volunteering also absorbed much of Bill's time. He was a volunteer with Kodak's Youth Bowling League, and later at the Irondequoit Senior Center for 25 years. In 1998 he was named Volunteer of the Year by the Center. Says Irondequoit Parks Commissioner Michael Spang, Bill and his wife Mildred were "exceptionally valued participants in the senior program."

Bill was also a valued participant in area dance clubs and is missed by his many friends.


Upcoming Federation meetings: Oct. 8 and Nov. 7, at 7:30 p.m., at the Brighton Town Hall
