Editor's Note: At a recent D.O.R. Committee meeting, the following treat made a big hit. We asked Mary Ann Lane to share it with our readers.

BLUEBERRY CRUNCH

- 1 can (20 oz.) crushed pineapple in its own juice
- 3 cups fresh or frozen blueberries
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 box yellow cake mix
- 1/2 cup margarine cut into pieces
- 1 cup chopped nuts (optional)
- 1/4 cup sugar

Preheat oven to 350°F. Pour crushed pineapple, including juice, over the bottom of a 9"x13" baking dish. Place blueberries over pineapple and sprinkle with the sugar.

Pour cake mix into a medium bowl. Cut the margarine into the mix until it resembles coarse meal. Sprinkle the cake mixture over the fruit. Top with nuts. Sprinkle with sugar.

Bake for 35-40 min., or until the top is bubbly and cake tests done. Serves 12.

CHEF'S CORNER...

December is upon us and many people are running around with hurried schedules. Here is a quick and tasty supper for those of you who are on the go for the holiday season. You can never go wrong stocking up on frozen shrimp, for meals like this as well as salads and appetizers.

QUICK TERIYAKI SHRIMP AND RICE

1 large onion chopped

1 clove of garlic crushed Extra virgin olive oil

3/4 lb. large shrimp, thawed, deveined, and cut in half

1 cup cooked rice

Teriyaki sauce to taste.



Heat frying pan over medium heat and add enough oil to cover bottom; swirl around sides. Saute onion and garlic until golden, add rice and shrimp. Saute for about 5 minutes or until shrimp are pink and opaque. This recipe yields 2 servings, can be calculated for more servings. Serve with teriyaki sauce on the side.



A veritable cornucopia of suggestions included more demos, more youth involvement, wider media coverage once a year, more joint club dances, outreach to former dancers, running some Eastern-type square dances to involve more people, coordination of class/club dance scheduling, and our favorite: make every class session a party!

We hope to begin to address the class-club scheduling question in this issue by publishing a list on page 5. Better coordination in the future could make available to new class members a different class/club event each week, rather that several in one week, or even on the same day, as is happening now.

A suggestion we received at the Nov. 3 meeting had to do with combining the Master Calendar and our Special Events calendar on page 3. Looking more closely at the matter, we realize that our publication schedule does not allow for as up to date recording of events as is necessary for planning committees. (Perhaps in the future, when we are retired, we might be able to operate a daily update on the Promenader page of our Federation website. But right now, that seems far off.) The best process right now is to be in contact with the Master Calendar keeper when planning, and publicize events in our pages when plans are complete. Our Calendar of Events is a handy reference for our readership on the dances of special interest to all.

THE DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD

Your assistance is needed in selecting a person or couple for the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award, which is presented at Dance-O-Rama. The Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs, Inc., although it sponsors Dance-O-Rama, does not govern, sponsor or present the Daphne-Norma Award. It is governed by and presented by the award's Selection Committee. The committee needs you to nominate people you feel meet the criteria for the Award.

Award Guidelines

The leadership award was established in 1977 by John Fink and Frank Salvagio in honor of their wives. Daphne and Norma. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation for EXTENSIVE AND SUSTAINED LEADERSHIP OVER AN EXTENDED PERIOD OF YEARS in square, round or contra dancing. Leadership, service and motivation are considered when evaluating candidates for this award. A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may include (but are not limited to) years of dancing, cueing or calling; membership; committee service or officer role in any of the following: Square, Round or Contra club; Rochester Area Federation; Promenader, Dance-O-Rama; NYS Association or National Associations; promoting the activity through calling, cueing or teaching, and other leadership roles which benefit the community through the dance activity; and finally, the candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the dancing community. An individual or couple may win the award only once. The award may not be given if the Selection Committee unanimously agrees no one met the criteria. Anyone in the dancing community is welcome to nominate people for the Leadership Award.

Questions You Might Have

Q: Who is the Selection Committee? The award originators are permanent Selection committee members. But because the Salvagios are not active in the dance community anymore, Frank asked Walt and Sally Baechle to be permanent members on the committee. (Walt passed away on Oct. 3, 2000.)

The most recent three recipients form the remainder of the committee. So currently, the members are John & Daphne Fink, Sally Baechle, and Bill and Joan Newman, Ed & Sybil Briggs, and Don and Marion Ellinwood.

Q: How do people get nominated? Anyone in the dance community can nominate a candidate. This is done by sending information about the candidate's qualifications

to the Selection Committee, in care of Bill and Joan Newman, 55 Snell Road, Geneva, NY 14456, by the end of February.

Q: What is the status of people previously nominated, but not selected? Candidates previously nominated generally stay in consideration for all future years. However, new or updated information should be sent. There is nothing wrong with sending in another nomination with current info.

- 1) Clubs taking part in Banner Stealing must register with the Rochester Area Federation and have at least one "Traveling Banner" to be stolen.
- **2**) To steal a banner, the Stealing Club must have at least four couples who pay the visitors' fee. A representative must advise the Host Club's president at least 48 hours in advance. (If more than one club is going to steal a banner

the first club to notify the Host Club has preference.) It is the responsibility of the Stealing Club to safeguard the stolen banner and return it only to the owner's club.

- **3**) To retrieve your stolen banner, you must have at least four paying couples. To steal the Host's banner on the same dance night, you must have an additional four paying couples and notify the Host Club 48 hours in advance.
- **4**) If a banner has not been retrieved within a reasonable time (three months of the dancing season), the stealing club is allowed to send no more than four couples, as (non-paying) guests, to return the banner. The owning club shall be notified a week in advance of the plans.
- **5**) Banner stealing and retrieving shall be restricted to regular scheduled dances only. Special dances with a guest caller are subject to approval, in advance, by Host Club's president.




Angels

For many years square dance classes have relied on angels to help fill out the squares so that all new dancers may have the opportunity to dance.

Angels also bring with them floor experience. New dancers may rely on the angel couple to pull them through the squares or a new move that is being taught. That is not the angel's job. The angel is supposed to be in the right place at the right time, with a smile.

The angel's duties do not include teaching or correcting students. There is one and only one instruc-


tor. That is the caller. The caller should be the one to instruct the new dancers on the calls. The caller should be the one to do



the correcting of the dancers having trouble. Class people will accept the caller's corrections but may take exception to someone else trying to tell them to turn around or move over. Many times an angel would like to reach out and turn someone around or push gently. That is not done.

Angels must always dance with a smile and give the class time to complete the new call. Remember...angels have the floor time and reaction time the new dancers do not.

Being an angel is like being a parent helping a child take its first steps. Angels are there to help them when they fall. Be kind and gentle and smile.
