CHEF'S CORNER...

It's a difficult task writing a column for the April/May issue of the *Promenader* after hearing the weather forecast on TV suggesting that we are expecting perhaps the coldest day on record. The forecast is for temperatures in the single numbers and perhaps even as low as 10 degrees below zero! I looked through my files and came up with a real comfort food. Hold tight, here we go!!



CRAB AND MUSHROOM STROGANOFF

- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1/2 cup yellow onion, finely diced
- 1/2 cup red bell pepper, finely diced
- 1 clove garlic, minced (or to taste)
- 8 oz. mushrooms, sliced
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 1 cup low sodium chicken broth
- 1 tablespoon dry white wine
- 1/4 teaspoon dill weed
- 1/4 teaspoon salt (or to taste)
- 1/4 teaspoon ground white pepper
- 2 drops Tabasco sauce
- 1 cup light sour cream (or no-fat)
- 3/4 pounds of crab meat, flaked (or use imitation crab meat)
- 8 oz. egg noodles (or no-yoke noodles) cooked and drained

Preheat oven to 350F. In large skillet over medium heat, warm the oil. Add onions, bell pepper, garlic and mushrooms and sauté until tender, about 5 minutes.

Transfer to a 2-1/3 quart casserole dish lightly coated with vegetable spray. In the same skillet melt the butter. Stir in flour and continue stirring until bubbly.

Add chicken broth, wine, and seasonings and bring to a boil, stirring constantly until thickened, 2 to 3 minutes.

Remove from heat, stir in sour cream and crab meat. Add mixture to casserole dish and mix well. Bake, uncovered until bubbly, stirring once about every ten minutes. Serve over hot noodles, accompanied by warm crusty French bread.

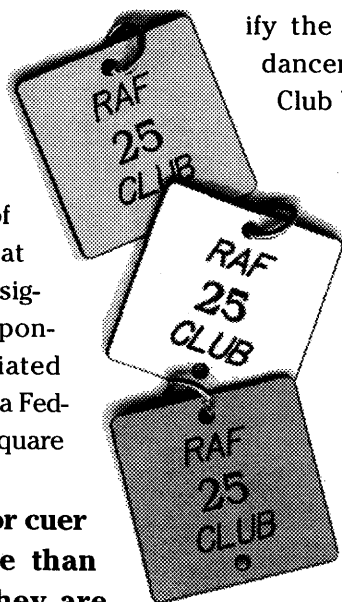

The same caller or cuer may be used more than once, as long as they are calling/cueing at a different club.

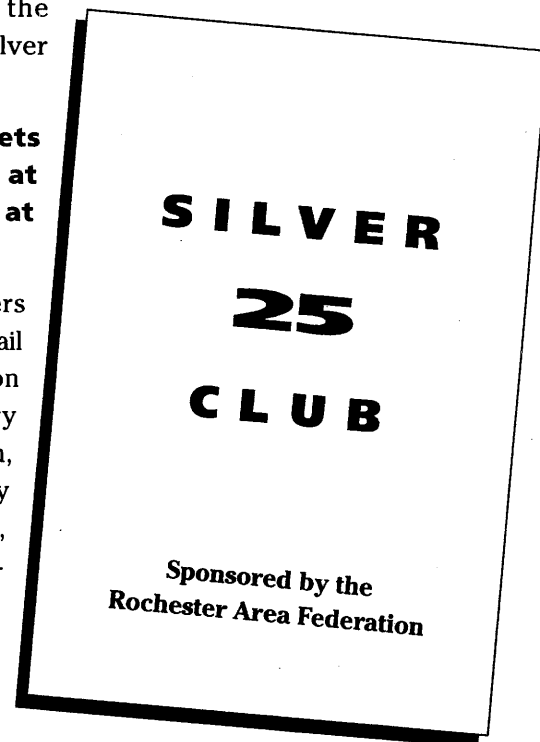
When the required number of signatures are collected in a Silver Club booklet, it is shown to the Federation presidents or their reps, who will ver-

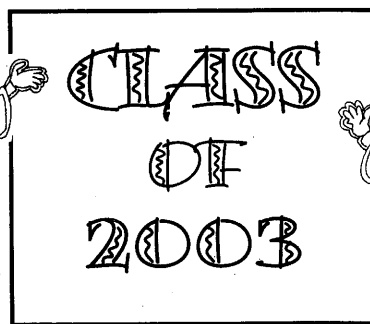

In Memoriam – Art Newcomb

Cloverleaf Squares wishes to note the recent passing of lifetime member, Arthur (Art) Newcomb on February 11, 2002, at age 94. Art took up square dancing and round dancing after the the 1980 death of his wife. Art will be remembered for his friendliness, kindness and sense of humor. He always had a twinkle in his eye, a ready smile and loved to yellowrock. He was a favorite of all the ladies. Cloverleaf Squares celebrated Art's 80th birthday with a belly dancer (which he thoroughly enjoyed). On his 90th birthday he was presented with a memory book with pages contributed by all the members.

Art has been an active member of Cloverleaf Squares for over 20 years, danced well past his 90th birthday and served as an angel for many new dancers. Besides dancing, Cloverleafs remember picnics and strawberry festivals at Art's home. Art attended many annual Singles Square Dance Conventions across the United States, often dancing until the wee hours of the night. He was a life member of the National Square Dance Singles.

Art was a walking history book — in fact, he wrote a book about his family's history which is at the Greece Public Library. He was born and lived in the same house — on the Greece Road that bears his family name — since 1908. It is the oldest home in Greece, built in 1835, and is surrounded by a 75-acre parcel which Art refused to sell to developers.

Each year the Greece Historical Society would hold its annual Strawberry Festival on Art's property, giving tours of the wonderful old home with much of its original architecture and furnishings. Following the public tours by Historical Society volunteers, Art would give private tours to friends which often included those in the square dance community. Highlights of Art's private tour included the \$10 doctor's bill for Art's at-home birth in 1908, a picture of Art and his wife when they were on the radio (Eastern square dancing), Art's basement full of antique tools, all in perfect order, and Art's journals. Art wrote in a journal daily (they filled a whole bookshelf) including by name everyone he square danced with each week.

Art resided in Rochester all his life. He worked for 46 years in the Printing Department at Eastman Kodak. He served on the Town of Greece Environmental Board for 10 years and was a charter member of the Greece Historical Society. Art is survived by two sons and daughters-in-law and four grandchildren.

Cloverleaf Squares did a demo at the Edna Tina Wilson Living Center where Art resided in early Nov. 2002. Although in a wheelchair, Art knew just where to place his feet and had a smile on his face.

Art Newcomb will be missed by the entire square dance community. A donation has been made in his memory to the *Promenader* by Cloverleaf Squares.

enough is how much better it is to include your club news and schedules right in the body of the e-mail, rather than in an attachment. **AVOID ATTACHMENTS IF AT ALL POSSIBLE**, because they occasion several extra steps each, which when multiplied by 21 clubs, can contribute to a time crunch when press deadlines loom. The simplest way to do this is to select the information in your document, copy it, and then paste it right in your e-mail message to us.

A question and answer period followed the presentation of our new heart-shaped Reporters' dangles. The shape was chosen because of the role reporters play in communicating information about their clubs to the square dancing community, which is vital to the heart and soul of square dancing. And the golden yellow color reflects the pages of our publication.
