CHEF'S CORNER...

With the Holidays coming along quicker than we might think Here is a wonderful fruity cake that will be a hit at any of the holiday gatherings. you won't go wrong with this one!

BUNDT PAN BOBKA

3 large eggs

2-1/4 cups all purpose flour 1/3 cup mixed candied fruits 1/3 cup sugar 1/3 cup raisins 1 envelope Fleishmann's powdered sugar rapid rise yeast 1/2 teaspoon salt **RUM SYRUP** 1/2 cup milk 1/2 cup sugar 1/4 cup butter or margarine 1/2 cup water

In a saucepan, combine sugar, water and extract. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly. In a large bowl, combine 3/4 cup flour, sugar, undissolved yeast, and salt. Heat milk and butter until very warm (120°F to 130°F).

Gradually add to dry ingredients. Beat 2 minutes at medium speed of electric mixer, scraping bowl occasionally. Add eggs and 1/2 cup flour. Stir in remaining

flour to make a stiff batter. Cover, let rest 10 minutes.

Stir batter down, stir in candied fruit and raisins. Turn into greased and floured 10 cup Bundt pan. Cover; let rise in warm draft free place until doubled in size, about 1-1/2 hours. Bake at 350°F for 30 to 35 minutes or until done. Before removing from pan, immediately prick surface with fork. Pour rum syrup over cake. Let it stand 10 minutes to allow syrup to be absorbed. Remove from pan, cool on wire rack. Sift powdered sugar over top.

1-1/2 cup olive oil (Berio

recommended) 2 tsp. dill weed 2 tsp. salt

1/2 tsp. white pepper 2 tsp. dry mustard (Coleman's)

1/2 cup cider vinegar

Add ingredients in the order given and shake well.

Suggested variations:

Add 1 tsp. marjoram or tarragon Add 1 tsp. powdered ginger Add lemon juice to taste Substitute about 1/5 of vinegar with wine vinegar or tarragon vinegar

Note: It doesn't do any good to add garlic to the dressing, because it is very quickly pickled by the vinegar. Garlic should be added fresh to the salad greens.



Dear Dancing Friends,

During this holiday season we are looking forward to enjoying the many scheduled dances with you. We are fortunate to have many dances available to us; the six new classes that started in September; and our callers, who are not only highly qualified, but who are working hard to keep clubs and square dancing active and fun.

Even though we have much to take pride in, we must recognize that we will be losing dancers who must be replaced. Seventy-five percent of our dancers are over 60 years of age. The relative age of our members makes it difficult to fill leadership positions in clubs and to attract new members.

We are grateful as presidents to have the help of all our clubs working through the Federation. We have recognized the problems we face, and we have developed and are continuing to develop programs to meet them. We are particularly excited by the enthusiasm generated by Randy Page, a Callerlab certified caller-coach from Danbury, Conn., who shared his experience at our recent Federation Day on November 2. Randy introduced a multi-cycle program seven years ago and built one of his five clubs from one square to where it is now dancing twelve squares.

With a multi-cycle program and innovative approaches to obtain prospective dancers, such as the contributions of dance parties and dance lessons for charity auctions, we are hopeful we will have new classes starting in January and in following months in addition to our traditional September classes. Two clubs are now gearing up to host dance parties and to start "new dancer programs" in January.



Our sincere best wishes to each of you for a joyous holiday season and a happy, healthy new year.



Promotion & Development Team

Last year the Rochester Area Federation of Western Round and Square Dance Clubs Inc. formed an ad hoc committee to develop a plan to promote square dancing in our region. Tom Chrzanowski is serving as team facilitator assisted by Diane Whitcomb, Jon West, MJ Ebenhack and others.

In May, the Promotion and Development Team reported to the Federation on their ideas for promoting and improving the image of square dancing. The team asked for and was granted funding to:

- 1. Set up a new website with a special page for new dancers www.SquareDancingRochester.org
- 2. Publicize a telephone number for interested parties to get square dance information (585) 227-7122
- 3. Print a recruitment/publicity brochure for all clubs to use
- 4. Print recruitment/publicity business cards
- 5. Obtain free and paid advertising in local newspapers
- 6. List all Club Open Houses in community Calendars.

All these ideas were implemented prior to September 2003.

It has become clear that the work of the Promotion

and Development Team needs to be ongoing. There is no silver bullet that will reverse the decline in the number of square dancers once and for all. Promotion and recruitment efforts must be continuous and take many forms. The next steps that the Promotion/Development Team is working on include:

- 1. Having a column in every issue of *Promenader* to keep dancers informed on what is being done and how they can help in promotion and development activities.
- 2. Instituting a multi-cycle system of new dancer classes.
- 3. Sponsoring community benefit dances (at the "new dancer" level).
- 4. Including certificates for "dance parties" and square dance classes in charity auctions.
- 5. Identifying a Promotion Coordinator for each club to work with the Federation Team.
- 6. Soliciting donations for a "Square Dance Promotion Fund."
- 7. Selling promotional polo shirts
- 8. Working with the Arts and Cultural Council for Greater Rochester to promote square dancing through their extensive channels.

Everyone can do something to promote square dancing — an activity that is so beneficial.

THE DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD

Your assistance is needed in selecting a person or couple for the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award, which is presented at Dance-O-Rama. The Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs, Inc., although it sponsors Dance-O-Rama, does not govern, sponsor or present the Daphne-Norma Award. It is governed by and presented by the award's Selection Committee. The committee needs you to nominate people you feel meet the criteria for the Award.

Award Guidelines

The leadership award was established in 1977 by John Fink and Frank Salvagio in honor of their wives, Daphne and Norma. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation for EXTENSIVE AND SUSTAINED LEADERSHIP OVER AN EXTENDED PERIOD OF YEARS in square, round or contra dancing. Leadership, service and motivation are considered when evaluating candidates for this award. A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may include (but are not limited to) years of dancing, cueing or calling; membership; committee service or officer role in any of the following: Square, Round or Contra club; Rochester Area Federation; Promenader; Dance-O-Rama; NYS Association or National Associations; promoting the activity through calling, cueing or teaching, and other leadership roles which benefit the community through the dance activity; and finally, the candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the dancing community. An individual or couple may win the award only once. The award may not be given if the Selection Committee unanimously agrees no one met the criteria. Anyone in the dancing community is welcome to nominate people for the Leadership Award.

Questions You Might Have

Q: Who is the Selection Committee? The award originators are permanent Selection committee members. But because the Salvagios are not active in the dance community anymore, Frank asked Walt and Sally Baechle to be permanent members on the committee. (Walt passed away on Oct. 3, 2000.)





Tim is a member of the Executive Committee of the Board of Governors of CALLERLAB, and Mike is a CALLERLAB executive also; which brings them together "officially," on many occasions. More important to us, they are both great callers, and we are indeed fortunate to be able to dance with these two outstanding people, right here in the Rochester area.

E-mail from Iraq — (Shawn Callahan)

EDITORS' NOTE: Caller Mike and Wanda Callahan's son, Shawn, is stationed in Iraq, and recently shared in an e-mail message some of the particulars of his experience. We are reprinting part of that e-mail here, and hope you will join us in praying for his well-being and safe return home.

Hey everyone,

Everything is going well here in Fallujah, Iraq...the place where all the action is in this country. We are in the heart of the conservative Sunni Triangle, where foreign terrorists, Islamic extremists, and former regime loyalists (FRLs) come together. The result is a lot of attacks on Americans. It's my job (and the job of the other intel analysts here) to try and find the people conducting and funding these attacks and either kill or capture them using the firepower of our trigger-pullers on the ground. We have a variety of intel assets here from Human Intelligence specialists, to Signals Intelligence to Imagery Intelligence and beyond. Luckily, I did a lot of the same thing in Afghanistan (just on a smaller-scale level), so I have some experiences to draw upon.

I am living in what is called the MEK compound. In 1996, Saddam Hussein invited a league of Iranian terrorists (the Mujahadeen E Khalq—MEK) to this place in order to train them to conduct an insurgency into Iran, should a war between those two countries begin once again. Now,

we have taken over the compound and kicked out all of the Iranian terrorists. There are a lot of bombed-out buildings here, as well as bomb shelters, tunnels, etc.

The quality of life/standard of living is OK for now. The biggest issue seems to be power. Everything runs on generators, some of which are Arab pieces of junk that break every 5 minutes. While all of the essential pieces of equipment run on American generators, the quality of life stuff (air conditioners, lights in rooms, etc) is hooked up to the other generators that never seem to work. Oh well. Things will improve. Food is OK for now. They do have a cantina here with Iraqis selling native food. A lot of it is actually really good and cheap (whole chickens cooked for \$4). The conditions that the food is cooked are less than sanitary, however, which is the reason I am getting over a stomach virus. I have eaten at the cantina about 4-5 times since I've been here. Luckily, we do have the luxury of showers, also, and I have been taking one every day or every other day. Showers are set up in tents, almost like Afghanistan.

In other news, Drew Carey is supposed to show up this afternoon. I hope all is going well there in the states. I wish I could be there to enjoy some of the cool weather. It is still about 105-110F here in the daytime (although it gets down to about 70F at night). Ok, gotta get going.

Angelo DeFelice Honored by Le Roy American Legion

Helping out whenever they could, they served as presidents and treasurers of Promenading Bees, and put on spaghetti suppers for the Bees for many years. They were also the subscription editors for the Promenader for 10 years. Angelo has been very active in the Boy Scouts and the volunteer ambulance in Le Roy.

The following is a reprint of an article which appeared in the Sept. 15 issue of the *Le Roy Pennysaver*.

35TH LE ROYAN OF THE YEAR

The focus of the American Legion Award Program is to recognize people who demonstrate the true spirit of Americanism, good citizenship and service to the community. Angelo fills all of these qualifications. He has lived in Le Roy for 37 years and has donated generously of his time and talents to the community. Starting in 1966 he was a Webeleos leader and a Scoutmaster. He received many awards for his ac-

tivities with the scouts such as The Wood Badge Training from Genesee Council BSA, the George Meany Award, a national award in recognition approved by the AFL CIO executive Council, and was Scout Master of Troop #22 for eight years.

In 1983 Angelo joined the Le Roy Volunteer Ambulance. Influenced by the Rev. Bernard Campbell he saw the need for volunteers. He took First Aid Courses and Driver Training. With the knowledge he gained in his five-year stint in the Air Force, Angelo became LVA's assistant maintenance officer as well. Over the 20 years he served LVA, Angelo took continuing education programs, served six years on the Board of Directors, 18 years of vehicle maintenance and spent many hours on other related duties. From 1986 to 1996 Angelo attended many meetings with LVA Explorer Post Activities and for the past 13 years he has worked the food booth for LVA at the Oatka Festival.

Angelo has been awarded many Driver of the Year Certificates and three times won the LVA Presidential Award of the Year. He has logged over 15,000 hours of service and has completed over 2,000 calls for transport to area hospitals.



Ken and Rita Tucker's "Secret" Recognition Dance






After Randy's presentation a dance was held called by CCR Callers

and a guest tip from Randy. We all enjoyed mixing and talking with area dance leaders.



Camping + Dancing = National Square Dance Campers Association

In the late 1950's a very active group of Wisconsin callers and dancers gathered fairly often to camp and dance together. Then in the early '60's a couple from New Jersey who attended one of their weekends casually asked if they could start such a group back home. After serious discussions the Wisconsin folks suggested forming a National Square Dance Campers Association, for combining the best of both activities - camping with dancing. Membership would be through autonomous chapters who would in turn annually choose national officers to conduct the overall business of this fledgling organization.

Barely had bylaws been adopted when in March of '65 the first chapter - #001 Garden State Campers of New Jersey was well underway. And in quick succession various chapters were formed in WI, MI, OH, IA and NY. Ironically the Wisconsin group, who had created the idea in the first place, were so slow in submitting their own application, they were the tenth chapter (#010) formed! Thus they called their group "Pioneers", since they were first with the idea.


When dancing campers in Ontario, Canada asked to join, the NSDCA decided to identify them by putting a "C" before their chapter number, thus the "Swing'N' Canadians" became #C-028. BY 1970 the NSDCA became a coast to coast organization when a chapter formed in California. Although the fledgling organization had a quarterly magazine, the NSDCA TIMES, devoted to the happenings and schedules of the camping weekends of its chapters, it also realized the importance of providing an event where the chapters could gather and become better acquainted with others in Canada and the United States who shared their love of combining camping and dancing. This annual International Camporee, which is held in the summer, has become a popular event. Their most recent one was held in Horseheads, NY. Oshkosk, WI is the site for 2004 with Hastings, NE selected for 2005 and Illinois in 2006. Non members are also welcome to come enjoy the fun and fellowship of combining both activities.

Currently there are chapters in 32 states and 3 provinces. It makes no difference what style of camping a dancer enjoys, they are welcome to become a member. Whether they are a tenter, have a pop-up camper, or any kind of RV they are welcome. Most chapters, as well as the International Camporee, are family oriented with children and grandchildren always welcome. Some members are full-time campers while others are only able to spend an occasional weekend camping and dancing. It makes no difference. Besides dancing, campouts usually include a myriad of other activities, including games and sports, tours and sightseeing, potlucks, crafts, shopping, eating out, celebrations, campfires, after parties, visiting with long time friends and meeting new ones....a time of fun and fellowship.

Guest campers are always welcome to attend our International Camporee. We'll gather in mid July in Oshkosh, WI. If you are interested write the General Chairman of this event Dick & Cathy McClure 1911 Juniper street, Green Bay, WI 54302-2311.
