READER'S RECIPES...

If you have a recipe that has been especially enjoyed by a lot of folks, please feel free to share it with others on these pages. Here is one that was enjoyed at the Copy Cats Dessert Social/Swap Around on April 3. At this event, the men prepared the desserts. This very delicious one (from the October 2003 issue of *Bon Appetit*) was shared with us by George Ahn.

Rustic Apple Tart With Honey, Dates & Nuts

CRUST

1-1/3 cups all-purpose flour
1/2 teaspoon sugar
1/4 cup (1/2 stick) chilled unsalted butter, cut into 1/2-inch cubes
1/4 cup frozen solid vegetable shortening, cut into 1/2-inch cubes
3 tablespoons (or more) ice water
1/2 teaspoon apple cider vinegar

FILLING

3 tablespoons butter
8 small Granny Smith apples or any other New York state apples (about 3 pounds), peeled, cored, each cut into 12 slices.
2 teaspoons ground cardamom
1/3 cup plus 2 tablespoons honey

2/3 cup chopped assorted nuts (such as walnuts, almonds, and pistachios)
7 large Medjool dates, pitted, cut into matchstick-size strips.
1 large egg
2 tablespoons whole milk
3 tablespoons raw sugar
1 cup chilled whipping cream

FOR CRUST: Combine flour, salt, and sugar in large bowl. Add butter and shortening; rub in with fingertips until mixture resembles course meal.

Mix 3 tablespoons ice water and vinegar in small bowl. Pour over flour mixture. Stir and fork until moist clumps form, adding more water by teaspoonfuls if dough is dry. Gather dough into ball; flatten into disk. Wrap in plastic and refrigerate at least 30 minutes.

FOR FILLING: Melt butter in heavy large skillet over medium-high heat. Add apples and sauté until brown and almost tender, about 15 minutes. Reduce heat to medium; mix in cardamom. Pour 1/3 cup honey over and cook 1 minute.

Position rack in top third of oven; preheat to 400°F

Roll out dough between 2 sheets of parchment paper to 12-inch round. Remove top sheet of paper. Sprinkle crust evenly with nuts. Replace paper atop crust and roll to 13-inch round. Embedding nuts in dough (crust will be thin). In-

vert crust onto rimless baking sheet. Remove top paper. Spoon half of apple mixture over crust, leaving 2-inch plain border. Sprinkle dates over apples. Top with remaining apple mixture. Using paper as aid, fold outer edge of crust over apples (dough is delicate; press together any tears).

Whisk egg and milk in bowl. Brush edges generously with egg mixture. Sprinkle crust and apples with raw sugar.

Bake tart until crust begins to brown, about 15 minutes. Reduce heat to 375°F; bake until crust is golden brown, about 10 minutes longer.

Loosen tart from parchment paper with spatula. Cool on baking sheet until warm, about 45 minutes.

Beat cream and 2 tablespoons honey in large bowl until peaks form. Slide 9-inch diameter removable tart pan bottom under tart and transfer to platter. Serve with honeyed whipped cream.

Makes 8 Servings.

This quote from Henry Ford (who was talking about square dancing), seems appropriate: "Coming together is beginning; keeping together is progress; working together is success."

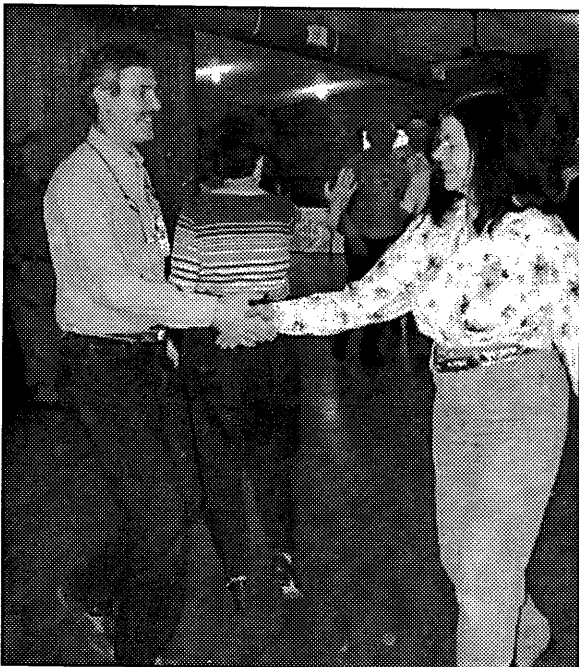

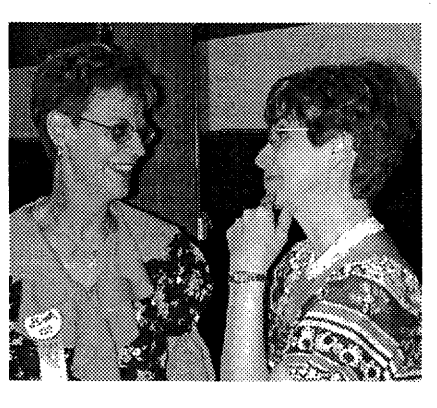
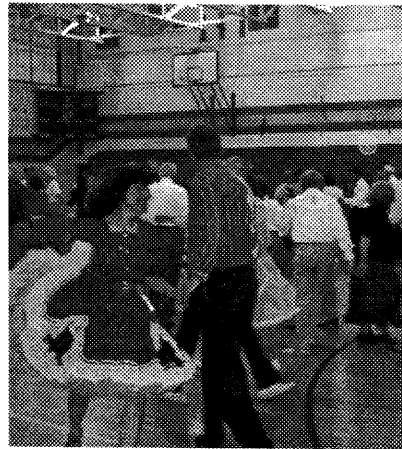
YOU OUGHTA BE IN PICTURES...

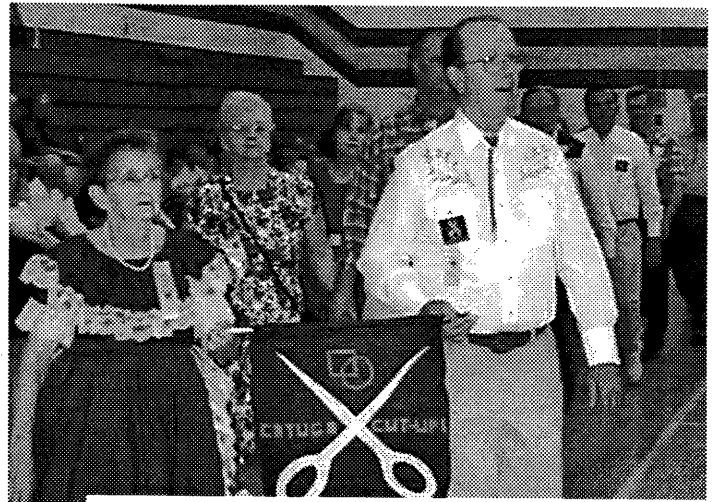
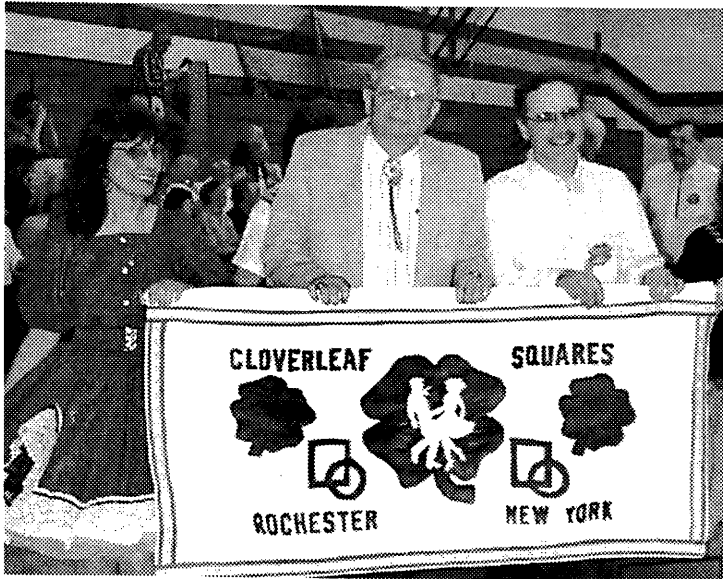

This award has come to be recognized as easily the most prestigious "event" in our area calendar, and thus always presented at our biggest get together: DOR.

Last year Gary and Alice Bubel were in the limelight, recognizing their contributions to dancers and dancing in our area. Thus, this year they had the honor of making the presentation to a very shocked, amazed, and I am certain pleased, Betty and Andy Ludwick.

Betty and Andy are of course the editors of this very magazine, and ultimately responsible for its timeliness, accuracy, aptness, and utility in keeping us all up to speed on "what's happening"! Of course they enjoy the loyal support of many of you in doing this; however, without their talents and hard work, we would clearly not enjoy the outstanding product that has now been recognized as exemplary nationally. That's great; but for you and me, it is what keeps us happily on our dancing toes, and "psyched" in addition to being just (ho hum) informed; thank you very much Betty and Andy.

Let me just take a moment to add that there is much more to Betty and Andy than you might be aware of: these two have been dancing for over 20 years, starting in 1981 with the Cloverleaf Squares, the Henrietta Friendship Squares, and the RF (Ron Fotch) Squares, and since the mid-'90s, the Country Twirlers. They have also held leadership roles in several of these clubs. Their round dancing started with Sylvia & Gordie Copeland and Mike & Linda Liberti, and then Bill Saintey's Merry-Go-Rounds, and now Alice & Gary Bubels' Boo Bull Rounds.

I should also point out that Betty and Andy's "bent to service" is not limited to square dancing; they have a long and continued history of service to their fellow man. While most of these undertakings have been done with an eye to obscurity, their light can not always be contained under a bushel: Working through the Diocese of Rochester, and bringing their special empathy and background skills for those seeking annulments within the Catholic Church, they developed a program of "Annulment Experience Weekends." These weekends married those with needs to appropriate resources to resolve the trauma and frustrations of seeming dead ends. These weekends were held throughout the area and as far away as Southern Tier cities.

Their affiliations with the Corpus Christi, Good Shepherd, and St. Joseph's parishes, where they have lectured, made banners, and otherwise "served," provide other outlets for their talents. Andy worked every Saturday for two years helping construct the Rogers House Restaurant. This project served as an arm of the Prison Ministry, and especially in rehabilitating released prisoners — helping them return to roles as productive citizens.

I have personally witnessed, first hand, the time and talent that these two people expend every publication cycle (and much in between), performing their "magic" to bring us the *Promenader*, you might just wish to take a moment to thank, congratulate, and enjoy the company of this fun-to-know couple.

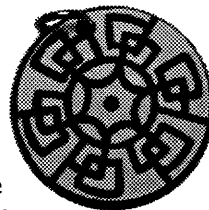

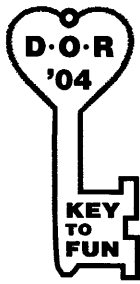

In Memoriam - Ernie Aglietti

Friends and fellow dancers, although deeply saddened with Ernie's passing, can just picture him at the front of the dance hall saying that everything is OK, to keep smiling, and to keep Becky dancing.

In Memoriam Mike Barnhart

Village Squares Host '50s Senior Prom

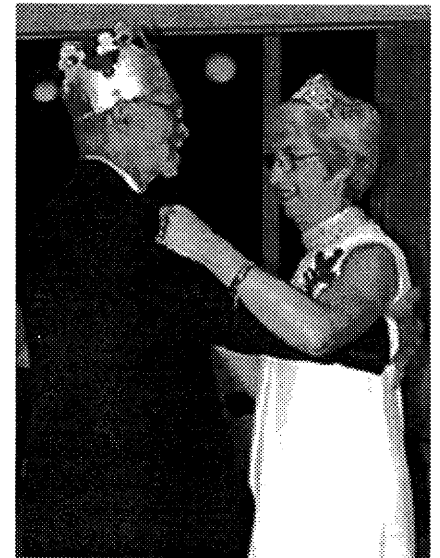

Editors' Note:

Many of our readers have expressed concern for Mike and Wanda Callahan's son, Shawn, who was stationed in Iraq. Thank you for keeping him in your prayers. The following is a copy of an e-mail which Wanda composed and which Mike shared with us right after Shawn had returned to the States:



Shawn Is on U.S. Soil!!!

Tuesday, April 13, 2004,

Shawn arrived to Pope AFB, NC, this past Saturday, at 1:30 p.m. His flight was an hour or so late but we were waiting in the warmth of 70 plus degrees with the sun beating down with glorious warmth.

He and about 200 other soldiers arrived to a jubilant round of family and friends cheering them on as they marched to the music of the 82nd Airborne military band into a warehouse decorated with banners, ribbons, flags from all fifty states, and an atmosphere that was flowing with anxiety and tears.

After a short "thank you" from their commanding officers, families ran to find their "soldier." It took me quite a few anxious minutes to find 'my son' as all these camouflaged soldiers looked exactly alike. I mistook Shawn from the back twice. Don't worry, I did not embarrass myself or anyone as I quickly looked before lunging to say hello. Finally, there he was! His shoulders were rounded holding a back pack and gear too heavy for the normal person. His skin tanned enough to warrant he does NOT need to go to the tanning booth. I think he grew an extra 5 inches while he was gone. I had to stretch to hug him around the neck and

let him know how much we missed him.

He was greeted by many other military personnel who had come home just weeks prior to him. So many officers and sergeants he worked with came forward to me personally and told me how they appreciated his work over in Iraq. One sergeant told me he would follow Shawn into war again. Another officer told me Shawn worked tirelessly for his men working upwards 18-20 hours many days. Another colonel said he was 'squared away'. That term is used in the military to depict someone who has his act together.

Mike flew into Raleigh from Portland that afternoon where he was visiting Patrick and joined us that evening for Shawn's first meal at the Outback.

The three of us celebrated Easter morning at the Lutheran Church in Fayetteville where Shawn worships. One of the women quickly came over to Shawn as we sat down. She gave him a hug and welcomed him home. As we spoke, it was reassuring to hear how this church (and especially this woman) use their ministry for the many young military men and women from around the country. She gave Shawn a small loaf of bread welcoming him home.

After church we went to the grocery store and bought the fixings of our Easter meal together - ham, potatoes, carrots. While I cooked, Shawn called AAA to jump his car battery. Shawn spent much of the afternoon re-opening his cell phone, his charge cards, sorting through six months of mail.

Shawn must now spend this week going into 'the office' for half-days. He will be coming home on leave for a few days and going to see Patrick in Portland too. Specific days when he will be in Rochester are still unconfirmed, but he is home, hallelujah!

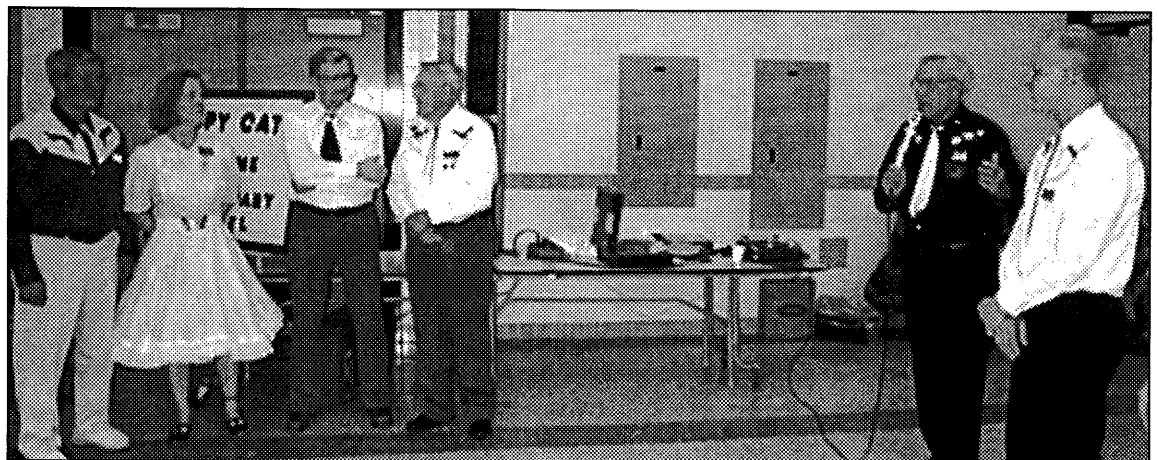

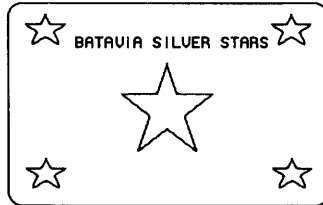

On June 10, Mike Herne will be our caller and Bill Howard our cuer.

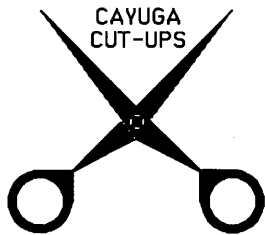
June 17 is T-shirt night and June 24 a dinner with singing calls.

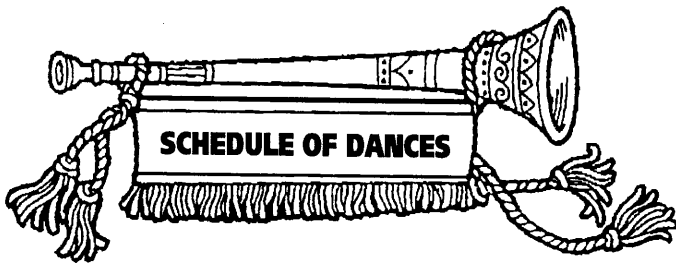
LEPRECHAUN TWIRL
