The Callers' Co-operative of Rochester had their first meeting of the season on September 11. After a short business meeting and planning for the year, Ron Brown gave us a very interesting presentation on callers' expenses. Did you know that callers who call 50 dances per year have to pay \$180.00 for a music license? Did you know that the cost of good (not the best) sound equipment is about \$2200.00, not including records? Did you know that almost half a local caller's yearly expense is transportation? Did you know that a caller who gets paid \$100.00 for a two hour dance and has two hours of travel (round trip) works for about \$16.00/hr. after expenses? Did you know that the records that a caller buys are now \$6.00-\$7.00 each? Club officers: Think about these things when it is new contract time for your club caller or class teacher.

Our October meeting will feature a session about calling for older dancers who know the calls but who cannot move quite as fast as they used to. Editors' Note: this suggestion was passed on to us by e-mail recently. We share it with you here.

RED FRIDAYS

Very soon, you will see a great many people wearing Red every Friday. The reason? Americans who support our troops used to be called the "silent majority."

We are no longer silent, and are voicing our love for God, country and home in record breaking numbers.

Promotion & **Development Team**

Make'em Welcome! by Jon West

Got a class this year? How are you going to keep them coming back? When the Promotion & Development Team first started meeting we analyzed the strengths and weaknesses of square dancing. We believe the most important things to new dancers are social interaction and having fun. A club that wants to keep its class coming back needs to make sure class members have fun and feel welcomed socially. Here are some ideas.

- 1. Have a couple (or two) to organize and supervise class activities.
- 2. Have refreshments at classes.
- 3. Introduce 50/50 for class sessions.
- 4. Make sure you have plenty of angels; a 1:1 ratio is great.
- 5. Mingle with the class, make small talk between tips.
- 6. Provide reassurance. Most new dancers get nervous about making mistakes (remember?).
- 7. Observe birthdays, anniversaries and other special events.
- 8. Do something different from time to time to break the monotony (ice cream night?)

I learned to dance in a small class (7). We had good angels and danced two squares almost all the time. When it came time to join the club, we already knew a dozen club members pretty well and it made the transition natural for us. Even so, three did not join or stay with the club. We found club dances weren't quite as easy-going and friendly as classes.

Don't forget last year's class. Hopefully, many of them have joined your club. Make them welcome. They are still insecure about their dancing ability and dread breaking down. Make an effort to dance and talk with them. Reassure them; after all don't we all make mistakes?

Watch out for cliques of both old and new dancers. People tend to gather with those they know best, but you can't build a healthy club without easy mixing of the membership.

Kick off the new season with a plan and grow your club.
