

There was also a healthy smattering of "mature singles," that I think were interested in the big smash we are hosting here in Rochester this year too.


So, between Jeff's calling, Dorothy Griffith's cueing, and all the new and old friends we made, I would say 2006 is off to a good start! Hope yours is too.

Jim 'n Betsy

(Editor's Note: Jim and Betsy travel across the United States and around the world, dancing and promoting dancing They have been dancing about 20 years, and have attended nearly every National Convention since 1988. Their love of dancing has led them many places — France, Germany, Czech Republic, Austria, China and all over the USA. They lived full-time in San Jose, Calif. for many years. When they met, Jim was an angel and Betsy was a learner. They soon formed "Festival Photo" and attended many weekend festivals, taking photos and selling them. They read a lot of square dance publications and gradually realized that every area needs a publication. When friends Myrna and Fred Williams took over The Prompter in San Jose, Jim and Betsy offered to start a column about where they danced as they traveled. They have been doing it ever since. Each month they share their experiences and thoughts with square dance publications, both in the U.S. and abroad. We will include their notes whenever space permits. The following column has to do with square dancing in Russia.)

Eberhard Walz, a German dancer, went to caller school when he was 58 years old so he could go to Russia and introduce dancing there. That was over 10 years ago. He had some health problems for a while, but has returned in full force. He is now part of the German-Russian Friends Square Dance Club. What this group of Germans and Russians has accomplished and is accomplishing to spread square dancing to a region of the world where square dancing has never been is remarkable. There are now three square dance clubs

up and running in Russia: St. Petersburg, Petrosovosk, and Pskov. Eberhard wanted the first club to be in St. Petersburg, but no one there came forward to serve as leader until September of last year. Svetlana Stern, English teacher and English expert in St. Petersburg, stepped up and took the reins of the newly formed club. Although Svetlana had no square dancing experience, she was an experienced Russian folk dancer and greatly loves to dance. When Kenny Reese, renowned caller and caller-coach from Germany, brought a group of Germans to St. Petersburg on a square dance tour, she was the interpreter for the group. Svetlana saw how much fun the German dancers had and how they loved the activity, and she decided to learn to call and start the St. Petersburg club. Her calling experience was limited to about 10 minutes on microphone, working from a prepared script!

In June, Svetlana will travel to the United States to participate in the 55th National Square Dance Convention. Because her school is not out until early June, she should arrive in Texas about June 10 or 11. She will almost immediately plunge into the square dance activity in and around Livingston, Texas, where she will dance each night until June 15 when the "Trail Thru Caller College" will begin. This caller college is open to new callers and experienced callers. There are only 12 spots remaining and we expect them to be filled quickly.

At present, Svetlana and the St. Petersburg group are dancing to pre-recorded square dance tapes. She carefully transcribes the calls, teaches all of the moves, and then the members of the club dance to the tape. She has never experienced what it is like to dance with a really good caller who

"sight calls" an evening of square dance fun. Of course she will see that when she comes to Texas!



pens that while dancing, a situation arises where someone collapses or faints, and it may be difficult for the caller to see what has occurred. IT IS IMPORTANT, therefore, that all dancers familiarize themselves with the square dance method of dealing with this kind of situation. This method is called E.C.M.A.

E.C.M.A. is the abbreviation for Emergency Call for Medical Aid. This signal is designed for use by dancers

to notify the caller of a medical problem in their square. When such a problem occurs, important minutes are often lost in the frenzy of waving arms and explanations which cannot be heard or understood across a crowded dance floor. The method of an ARCHED CIRCLE will assure the fastest possible response time by medical personnel to an emergency on the dance floor. In this way, precious, perhaps lifesaving minutes, can be saved.

STEP ONE: When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends him/her.



ECMA

Emergency Call for Medical Aid

STEP TWO: Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This allows the injured person and attendant air and room.

STEP THREE: Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.

STEP FOUR: On seeing this signal, the caller or club representative will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.

This system was, according to his-

torical sources, first introduced at the 33rd National Square Dance Convention in Atlantic City, New Jersey, in 1977. It was their hope that callers across the country would take the time to explain the arched circle ECMA signal to their dancers and familiarize them with both the procedure and its purpose.

This is an important part of our being prepared in the event of an emergency.

Clubs — please familiarize your callers, members, and guests with this procedure.

- 1) Clubs taking part in Banner Stealing must register with the Rochester Area Federation and have at least one "Traveling Banner" to be stolen.
- 2) To steal a banner, the Stealing Club must have at least four couples who pay the visitors' fee. A representative must advise the Host Club's president at least 48 hours in advance. (If more than one club is going to steal a banner

the first club to notify the Host Club has preference.) It is the responsibility of the Stealing Club to safeguard the stolen banner and return it only to the owner's club.

- **3**) To retrieve your stolen banner, you must have at least four paying couples. To steal the Host's banner on the same dance night, you must have an additional four paying couples and notify the Host Club 48 hours in advance..
- 4) If a banner has not been retrieved within a reasonable time (three months of the dancing season), the stealing club is allowed to send no more than four couples, as (non-paying) guests, to return the banner. The owning club shall be notified a week in advance of the plans.
- **5**) Banner stealing and retrieving shall be restricted to regular scheduled dances only. Special dances with a guest caller are subject to approval, in advance, by Host Club's president.


