Silver Club Booklets

The **Silver Club** is a way of recognizing dancers who have danced to 25 callers/cuers at club dances.

These dancers receive the Silver Club badge dangle.

At least 15 of the 25 caller/cuer signatures must be gotten at dances of clubs affiliated with the Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs. A maximum of 10 callers/ cuers at non-affiliated clubs may be included. Dance-O-Rama callers/cuers may also be included.

The same caller or cuer

may be used more than once, as long as they are calling/ cueing at a different club.

When the required number of signatures are collected in a Silver Club booklet, it is shown to the

their reps, who will verify the names and authorize the dancer to wear the special Silver Club badge dangle.







In Memoriam - Cathleen Lesley Bock

September 3, 1946 - January 15, 2006

Cathleen Bock had an exceptional lifelong interest in square dancing that carried throughout her life and continued to grow as she showed a natural excellence in the square dance community as well as provided examples for others to follow.

As a teenager in the late 1950s, early 1960s, Cathy launched her interest in square dancing by joining the then Teen Twirlers where she actively promoted dancing by recruiting other young dancers, some of whom have stayed in square dancing even today. Her eagerness and enthusiasm in those early years was hallmarked by her participation in a square dance demonstration at the 1964 World's Fair in New York City.

As a young adult, in between her studies and duties as a nurse, and later a full-time mother, Cathy's involvement in square dancing could be measured by her multiple memberships in various clubs, including the Genesee Dancers, Cloverleaf Squares, Tecumseh Squares, and later the Copy Cats, Shamrock Squares, and Emerald Squares.

And through those years, Cathy established herself as a top quality dancer by setting the standard with her flare, poise, grace, and unmatched spirit. She had a way of making new class members feel at ease and was often asked to assist teachers during classes by demonstrating her noted style of dancing. She had a radiant way of instilling her special kind of spirit onto the dance floor where ever she danced, making both new and veteran dancers know square dancing is very much alive.

She impressed the square dance community with her wonderful, imaginative costumes which she hand made for her and her dance partner. Both at the dances and afterwards in public,

Cathy often presented herself as a true ambassador of the square dance community, always hoping to spawn new interest, eager to answer any questions. She graced our dances and our own costumes by sharing her talents for making handmade jewelry and generously, freely offering them to us.

All in all, Cathy's participation was always where it was needed most: behind the scenes and, of course, without solicitation. She was always there to help decorate, help clean up, treat us all with her fantastic fudge to die for, help out at classes, help out at picnics, engage in banner stealing, and maybe do a little matchmaking along the way. She made it a point to support other clubs by attending their dances and special events. And most recently, she attended private, remedial classes as an angel for those with a need for one-on-one help.

Her enthusiasm for dancing continued on even after the onset of her illness, by her participation in the 2003 and 2004 New York State Fair square dance demonstrations, the 2004 and 2005 Monroe County Fair square dance demonstrations and in the closing months of her life, by her attendance at A-1/A-2 lessons, by her attendance at round dance lessons, and with unfailing devotion, her serving as recording secretary for our Federation.

It was a lifelong involvement for Cathleen with her goal seemingly to better the square dance community, to keep it growing, and to keep it ever in the hearts of dancers everywhere. She will be sadly missed by all those who knew her, learned from her, set their example from her, promenaded with her, and by one in particular who was lucky enough to have been her dance partner.

End of an Era, Start of a New

For the past 30 years, the Florida Sunshine Festival has been one of the brightest stars in the "Square Dance Heavens": always staffed by the premier National Callers of the time; always well managed by John and Linda Saunders; and always held in sunny Central Florida in the wintertime — who would not want to be there! Like many of you that we have always met there, it has been the place to be the last weekend in January (this year the first week in February) — and of course, always held in the Grand Lakeland Civic Center — a facility equal in grandeur and size to any on the square dance circuit, including that of the now defunct Mid America facility in Nashville.

This year Vern Marshall and I measured the dimensions of the main Festival Hall, where the plus and rounds were held, and found it to be two-hundred feet long; and which I might add was packed to the rafters (so to speak), as shown in the picture taken shortly before the Saturday Night Grand Finale (when it was really packed!). Not to be out-done, the Advanced Hall was the same size, and while not "packed," always had 10 to 20 squares on the floor. The separate halls for rounds, where Phase III-Vs were taught and danced, and the DBD Halls were similarly adequate. There was also a C1 Hall, and there may have been others; however, if there were, we missed them.

I caught Kay Anderson giving a "knowing wink" as I captured a square of New Yorkers, including Dave and Lee

Morris and Chuck and Nancy Fuller — Kay's husband Andy must have been in there someplace too. I also corralled many of the New Yorkers present for a group shot before the Saturday Night Grand Red-White-and-Blue festival finisher started. Do you recognize any of them? Of course, there were many more there that I missed; however, so many would not all have fit in the picture anyway!

Tony Oxendine emceed the closing ceremony, honoring John and Linda Saunders, and also the long-time work of Art Springer, who is also ending his tenure with the group. The callers pictured here are: Tony, Jerry Story, Larry Letson, John Saunders,

Art Springer and Tim Crawford. Don Hanhurst and his pretty wife Loretta shown just below in the picture. Jerry Haag was not in the picture (he had been "under the weather").

Now for the good news: Tony Oxendine also took this opportunity to introduce the staff for what the Florida Sunshine Festival is now "Morphing" into, which is, "The Florida Winter Festival." The staff will be the same with the following exceptions: Exit Springer and Hanhurst; enter Deedee Daugherty. Saunders remains; however, without quite as much organizational responsibility as here-to-fore for him and Linda. The cuers will be Jimmy and Carol Grif-







fin and Bill and Martha Buck. Next year's dates will be January 25-27, as always, at the Lakeland Center. For questions, email johnnysa@aol.com (Hey, I thought they were retiring???).

Hope to see you all again soon. I just have to add that a group of us did also travel up to Lady Lake Florida to dance with Bob Stern and Loretta Hanhurst at our old stomping grounds. Is this a great country or what.
