# About the Iromenader...

This publication includes information to help Round and Square Dancers stay informed abut dance activities planned for Rochester, NY, and surrounding areas. It is divided into three parts:

2. The Club News section in-

# Promotion & Development Team

We have two new initiatives where we need the support of every dancer in the Rochester Area Federation. These new events are: A Community Dance (August 19) and a Casino Night (October 13).

The Community Dance is designed to introduce non-dancers to the fun and socializing of our activity. The night will include lots of dancing (beginning squares, rounds, contras, etc.), food, sing-a-longs and a bonfire. It's a lot easier to show how much fun we are with a large crowd. We need the help of all dancers to:

- Attend the dance and socialize with the non-dancers.
   Show them we are interesting and fun people to be around.
- Bring non-dancers to the dance. It's a non-commitment way to introduce the non-dancer to the fun and social aspects of our activity.

The objective of the Casino Night is to raise money for promotion as well as other Federation activities. As a federation, we have tried many free and inexpensive ways to promote square dancing. We don't need to tell any of you that our numbers are decreasing. To help get more dancers for all clubs, we want to increase our promotion efforts. This will cost much more money than we are currently spending on promotion. The first fundraiser that we are trying is the Casino Night. How can you and your club help?

### Jobs that are needed in each club are:

- One person to be in charge of promoting and selling tickets within the club and to club members' friends.
- A coordinator who will be in charge of acquiring prizes which will be used as auction items.
- Several folks who will be volunteer dealers (for 45 minute shifts) Training will be provided.
- EVERY CLUB MEMBER must attend, and we all must tell our friends to come with us!!

Dear Editors:

We are all concerned every year about attracting new dancers for our classes and we are very thankful when our club graduates a new class. We even have an area event each year (DOR) to honor our new dancers. Yet, do we really do our best to accept these folks in our club? In the past few years, I have seen something more and more often that really disturbs me, especially at class/club dances. The dance "tip" usually starts off with one or two round dances. Dancers that do the rounds are the more experienced dancers. As soon as the rounds are done, the round dancers hurry up and square-up, leaving the new dancers to fend for themselves, often not even being able to get into a square. When they do get in a square, it is by themselves which turns out to be a weak square simply because of a lack of experience. At this point I, as a caller, can mix the squares (which I often do) and sometimes get exasperated looks from the experienced dancers. Sometimes, I have to mix the squares 4 and 5 times an evening just so the new dancers get some experienced people in their square. I have seen new dancers unable to get into a square 3 TIPS IN A ROW and finally get disgusted and leave. Then the experienced dancers wonder why new dancers don't come back. DUH!!!!!

PEOPLE: It has been proved time and time again in our activity that dancers complete lessons and join clubs not for the dancing but for the SOCIAL ACCEPTANCE. ROUND DANCERS: Take ONE TIP an evening and dance with your new dancers, even better, invite them into your square. Remember what it was like, when you took lessons and how nervous you were and how you wanted to be accepted by the group. If you don't want to dance with new dancers, why bother to have a beginners' class??

# **Want to Know Where Your Friends Are?**




