

These dancers receive the Silver Club badge dangle.

At least 15 of the 25 caller/cuer signatures must be gotten at dances of clubs affiliated with the Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs.

A maximum of 10 callers/cuers at non-affiliated clubs may be included. Dance-O-Rama callers/

cuers may also be included.

The same caller or cuer may

be used more than once, as long as they are calling/ cueing at a different club.

> When the required number of signatures are collected in a Silver Club booklet, it is shown to the Federation presidents or their reps, who will verify the names and authorize the dancer to wear the special Silver Club badge dangle.

Silver Club booklets will be available at D.O.R. Just ask at the registration table.







Of course, the "Dance-O-Rama" is May 5, so the Copy Cats will not be holding a regular dance in Penfield, but we hope to see everyone at DOR.


