Opinion...

There are a lot of neat things about square dancing. There is, for example, the physical challenge, the mental challenge and the satisfaction of matching wits, as it were, with a caller, who has to be both a leader and an entertainer. Then there is the social commitment that one makes, as there is the tacit agreement that you as an individual are willing to work together with an 8-person (usually) team: listening, helping and encouraging the others. This social intercourse has been the foundation of successful square dancing since day one.

To meet these objectives, relatively simple rules of etiquette have been acknowledged and accepted. Don't dance drunk, do introduce yourselves to those you haven't danced with yet, listen to the caller, and thank everyone before you leave the set, are a few. Common sense, common courtesy, not difficult or unreasonable, really.

Enter now with new technology in the form of the ubiquitous cell phone. This technology, with its proven value, at the same time seems to have brought out some primeval instincts not observed before — specifically in square dancing. That is, the complete disrespect for others to achieve your own selfish, immediate gratification. You are not cute and you don't have the right to flaunt this disrespect for others. We are not concerned with you being "plugged in." There is no way that you can competently follow, lead or otherwise execute the commands of the caller. Attempting to do any call with a phone in your ear is totally irresponsible.

Put the phone away, leave it outside, leave it in your purse or coat. You don't have the right to interrupt the flow. If you are "on call," put your phone on "vibrate" or "silent" mode, and check for messages between tips. There isn't much that can't wait for 5-10 minutes. If you need to respond more quickly than that, you must make a choice between monitoring your phone and square dancing. If the caller observes cell phone use in a square, he/she should stop the tip immediately and ask for a replacement dancer.

THE DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD

Your assistance is needed in selecting a person or couple for the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award, which is presented at Dance-O-Rama. The Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs, Inc., although it sponsors Dance-O-Rama, does not govern, sponsor or present the Daphne-Norma Award. It is governed by and presented by the award's Selection Committee. The committee needs you to nominate people you feel meet the criteria for the Award.

Award Guidelines

The leadership award was established in 1977 by John Fink and Frank Salvagio in honor of their wives, Daphne and Norma. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation for EXTENSIVE AND SUSTAINED LEADERSHIP OVER AN EXTENDED PERIOD OF YEARS in square, round or contra dancing. Leadership, service and motivation are considered when evaluating candidates for this award. A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may include (but are not limited to) years of dancing, cueing or calling; membership; committee service or officer role in any of the following: Square, Round or Contra club; Rochester Area Federation; Promenader; Dance-O-Rama; NYS Association or National Associations; promoting the activity through calling, cueing or teaching, and other leadership roles which benefit the community through the dance activity; and finally, the candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the dancing community. An individual or couple may win the award only once. The award may not be given if the Selection Committee unanimously agrees no one met the criteria. Anyone in the dancing community is welcome to nominate people for the Leadership Award.

Questions You Might Have

Q: Who is the Selection Committee? The award originators are permanent Selection committee members. But because the Salvagios are not active in the dance community anymore, Frank asked Walt and Sally Baechle to be permanent members on the committee. (Walt passed away on Oct. 3, 2000.)

The most recent three recipients form the remainder of the committee. So currently, the members are John & Daphne Fink, Sally Baechle, Bob and Lou Stevens, Tom and Liz Chrzanowski, and Ron and Dorothy Brown.

Q: How do people get nominated? Anyone in the dance community can nominate a candidate. This is done by sending information about the candidate's qualifications

to the Selection Committee, in care of Ron and Dorothy Brown, by the end of February.

Q: What is the status of people previously nominated, but not selected? Candidates previously nominated generally stay in consideration for all future years. However, **new or updated information should be sent**. There is nothing wrong with sending in another nomination with current info, and encouraging others to add their nomination.

- 1) Name and address of recommended couple
- 2) Years of dancing, calling and/or cueing
- 3) Club participation, offices held, etc.
- Participation in local organizations (both dance and other)
- 5) Participation in state organizations (both dance and other)
- 6) Participation in national organizations (both dance and other)
- 7) Other leadership roles (not only dancing but community service)
- 8) Miscellaneous information (anything else that might be relevant)

And be sure to include your own name, address and phone number (and e-mail, if you wish).

CLUB OFFICERS... If you schedule a national caller or major event opposite another club's already planned major event, you both lose! Please follow these steps when planning events:



Have you ever been on a committee or board that was trying to decide on the date for a big dance? You probably want to plan your event on a date on which another club does not already have a big dance scheduled. Otherwise, you risk having less dancers available to attend yours.

Here is what you need to do:

- 1. As soon as you have an idea of when you might want to have the event, and before you sign the contract with a national caller, or make any other commitments, CALL THE MASTER CALENDAR CHAIRMAN (Ken Georger, 585-247-7259).
- **2.** If the date is available on the Master Calendar, proceed to **MAKE YOUR ARRANGEMENTS**, and notify Ken immediately that it is all set.
- **3. SEND THE INFORMATION ON YOUR EVENT TO THE** *PROMENADER* for publication in the next issue on our **Calendar of Events**. The charge is only \$5, and the listing stays in until it happens! And the sooner everyone in our square dancing community knows about your event, the better your chances of success! So make it a point to list the event as soon as the arrangements are complete. 




