CAMPING

Most sites have electric hookups. Modern restrooms and showers are available in limited numbers. There is a convenience store on site.

For the convenience of our campers, Convention Registration packets will be distributed at the campground starting Tuesday noon through noon Thursday. We will confirm campsite reservations but actual campsites will be assigned on a "first arrive, first served" basis. The campground will officially open Monday, June 23, but sites are available starting Saturday, June 21, for those attending ROUNDALAB, Callers School, early tours, etc.



FIRST AID




