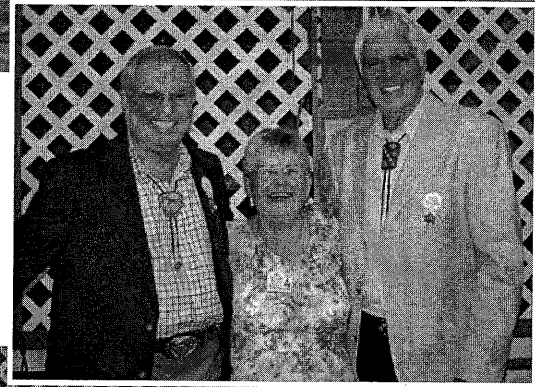
Make it next year and it's a safe bet that I will catch YOU, claiming the same thing.

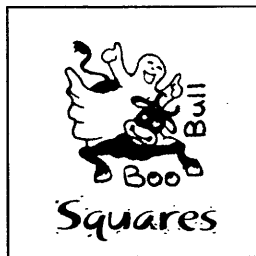
We are now teaching plus calls on Tuesday nights to all the new dancers that have joined us for the summer. Everyone is having a great time.

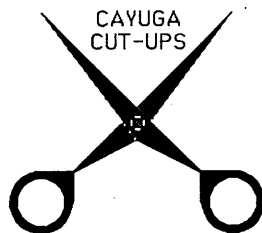

We will be having our Ice Cream Social on August 30 to say farewell to our summer location. Come out for a great night of dancing, socializing and of course — ice cream.

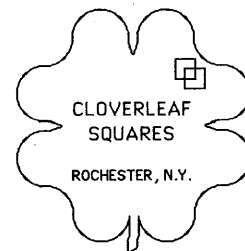
