



Square Dancing at the State Fair 2010



Bob has been the Senior Federation Representative for Cloverleaf Squares for many years. He started travelling in 2005 to promote the National Singles Dance-A-Rama that was held here in Rochester in 2006. Since then he has travelled extensively and danced all over the USA. He never missed a DAR after that and has been a state representative as well as one of Cloverleafs' delegates to Single Square Dancers USA, attending most of the board meetings at each





missed.



The club dances 8:30-9:45. The 1st half hour we review the two-step dances and then dance a variety of phase 2 & 3 dances.



Biography of Tim Marriner

Tim and his wife Donna reside in Rock Hill, SC where they enjoy their solitude amongst nature in their home on the edge of the woods. When they aren't traveling they are usually in the yard enjoying the outdoor retreat. Moss doesn't grow on rolling stones but it does on brick walk ways through wooded gardens.

Tim Marriner is not just a caller, he is an entertainer. Having performed in several jazz choirs in college, he has trained and developed many twists to his singing routines. His enthusiasm is overflowing!


Chapter 108, Southern Tier Wheelers

Dancers: It sometimes happens that while dancing, a situation arises where someone collapses or faints, and it may be difficult for the caller to see what has occurred. IT IS IMPORTANT, therefore, that all dancers familiarize themselves with the square dance method of dealing with this kind of situation. This method is called E.C.M.A.

E.C.M.A. is the abbreviation for Emergency Call for Medical Aid. This signal is designed for use by dancers

to notify the caller of a medical problem in their square. When such a problem occurs, important minutes are often lost in the frenzy of waving arms and explanations which cannot be heard or understood across a crowded dance floor. The method of an ARCHED CIRCLE will assure the fastest possible response time by medical personnel to an emergency on the dance floor. In this way, precious, perhaps lifesaving minutes, can be saved.

STEP ONE: When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends him/her.

Emergency Call for Medical Aid


STEP TWO: Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This allows the injured person and attendant air and room.

STEP THREE: Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.

STEP FOUR: On seeing this signal, the caller or club representative will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.

This system was, according to historical sources, first introduced at the 33rd National Square Dance Convention in Atlantic City, New Jersey, in 1977. It was their hope that callers across the country would take the time to explain the arched circle ECMA signal to their dancers and familiarize them with both the procedure and its purpose. This is an important part of our being prepared in the event of an emergency.

Clubs — please familiarize your callers, members, and guests with this procedure.
