
Grand Squares to Celebrate 50 Years

This spring, Grand Squares joins a rather elite group of Square Dance Clubs who have danced for 50 years. Following the lead of Genesee Dancers, the first square dance club in Rochester which was formed in 1957, a group of four couples decided to form a club in Lima. They held their first dance in March of 1961 in the basement of the Lima Town Hall and consequently named themselves the Lima Grand Squares. Members came not only from the Avon and Lima areas, but from as far away as Victor, Geneseo, Batavia and Wellsville. Their dance schedule included dinners, barbecues, socials, themed dances and costumed parties, as well as the square dancing, and Lima Grand Squares soon became known as the friendliest club around.

Since the basement proved too warm for summer dancing, it was decided to hold dances from June to September at a barn in East Bloomfield. When seeking a design for the club badge and banner, members affectionately

chose a picture of this structure for the club's identifying symbol and it remains so today.

Another change was on the horizon as the club wel-

comed in the new century. Several reasons prompted the search for a different dance location and in the fall of 2001, Roth Middle School in Henrietta became the club's new home. Our next change occurred in 2005 when Gary announced he was cutting back on regular dance commitments and we needed to secure another caller. Luckily Mike Callahan had Thursday evenings free and agreed to be our regular caller.

We can't claim to have any of the original members still dancing but we do have several present dancers who have memories of the way it was many years ago. I'll bet Ted and Barb Miller, Ray and Donna McCagg, Jerry and Helen Bischoping and Terry Irvine could tell you many a story. We will celebrate these memories by inviting any past members and any present dancers to join us on Thursday evening, May 12, at Roth Middle School for our Anniversary Gathering.

Donald H. Hunger passed away On November 17. 2010, at the age of 72. He is survived by his loving wife, Diane (Bentley) Hunger; five children; nine grandchildren; and three great-grandchildren. He was predeceased by his first wife, Rebecca (Mikulicz) Hunger.

Don was an avid square dancer for some 30 years, however, unless you belonged to his club, or were involved in the "doings" of the Rochester Area Federation, he might have been off your radar.

But, if you were also a skier, particularly at Swain, or into horsemanship in its many forms, or barefoot water skiing — yes, barefoot! Well, you get the picture. There was much more to soft-spoken Don Hunger than meets the eye!


We do have dancers in our midst that knew Don on the ski slopes and water skiing, such as Peter and Sally Emmel at the Village Squares. Their eyes light up when they talk about him. There are many others, too.

In the 1970s, Don was an active ski racer in the local "Masters" circuit (age-bracket racing for anyone over college age). He raced with a group from Kodak, competing

in slalom and giant slalom races all around Upstate New York, and was on the Ski Patrol at Hunt Hollow. Don was also active in the Huggers Ski Club, which ran numerous ski trips and also participated in races held from time to time at nearby areas like Brantling, Swain and Bristol. In those days Rochester-area ski club activities were coordinated by the Genesee Valley Ski Council. Don was an active member of the council, contributing to the leadership of organized skiing, just has he did more recently for square dancing through the RAF.

Besides serving as a Federation club rep, Don also spent many years as the Federation's Insurance chairman and webmaster, making sure our club insurance problems were solved, and maintaining an internet square dance connection for us all! And he was active for several years on the Dance-O-Rama Committee.

DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD Nominations Due Soon

Your assistance is needed in selecting a person or couple for the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award, which is presented at Dance-O-Rama. The Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs, Inc., although it sponsors Dance-O-Rama, does not govern, sponsor or present the Daphne-Norma Award. It is governed by and presented by the award's Selection Committee. The committee needs you to nominate people you feel meet the criteria for the Award.

Award Guidelines

The leadership award was established in 1977 by John Fink and Frank Salvagio in honor of their wives, Daphne and Norma. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation for EXTENSIVE AND SUSTAINED LEADERSHIP OVER AN EXTENDED PER-IOD OF YEARS in square, round or contra dancing. Leadership, service and motivation are considered when evaluating candidates for this award. A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may include (but are not limited to) years of dancing, cueing or calling; membership; committee service or officer role in any of the following: Square, Round or Contra club; Rochester Area Federation; Promenader; Dance-O-Rama; NYS or national associations; promoting the activity through calling, cueing or teaching, and other leadership roles which benefit the community through the dance activity; and finally, the candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the dancing community. An individual or couple may win the award only once. The award may not be given if the Selection Committee unanimously agrees no one met the criteria. Anyone in the dancing community is welcome to nominate people for the Leadership Award.

Questions You Might Have

Q: Who is the Selection Committee? The award originators initially functioned as permanent Selection Committee members. But because the Salvagios and the Finks are not active in the dance community anymore, Frank Salvagio asked Walt & Sally Baechle, and John & Daphne Fink asked Andy & Betty Ludwick, to be permanent members on the committee. (Walt passed away on October 3, 2000.)

The most recent three recipients form the remainder

of the committee. So currently, the members are Sally Baechle, Andy & Betty Ludwick, Eileen Okolowicz, Carl & Shirley DeGraff, and Mike & Ann Herne.

Q: How do people get nominated? Anyone in the dance community can nominate a candidate. This is done by sending information about the candidate's qualifications to the Selection Committee, in care of Eileen Okolowicz, by the end of February.

Q: What is the status of people previously nominated, but not selected? Candidates previously nominated generally stay in consideration for all future years. However, **new or updated information should be sent**. There is nothing wrong with sending in another nomination with current info, and encouraging others to add their nomination.

Please include as much of the following as possible:

- 1) Name and address of recommended couple
- 2) Years of dancing, calling and/or cueing
- 3) Club participation, offices held, etc.
- 4) Participation in local organizations (both dance and other)
- 5) Participation in state organizations (both dance and other)
- 6) Participation in national organizations (both dance and other)
- Other leadership roles (not only dancing but community service)
- 8) Miscellaneous information (anything else that might be relevant)

And be sure to include your own name, address and phone number (and e-mail, if you wish).

DID YOU KNOW? The Detroit River has its own Postal Zip Code (48222). The J.W. Westcott II is a boat that delivers mail to other vessels. It is regarded as the only ship in the U.S.A. that delivers mail to other ships as they are underway. Any mail addressed to members of a ship's crews that pass through the Detroit River can have mail delivered to the appropriate ship (mainly lake freighters) as they pass under the Ambassador Bridge. The postal station is located near the bridge on the U.S. side of the river.

VISITING MICHIGAN – FEATURING PICTURED ROCKS NATIONAL LAKESHORE, TAHQUAMENON FALLS & SURROUNDING AREA







Pictured Rocks National Lakeshore runs along the southern shore of Lake Superior between the towns of Munising and Grand Marais. It is a 72,000 acre park with 42 miles of lakeshore. Within the park, there are 17 beautiful waterfalls-most of which are a short to moderate hike from parking areas. The park contains rustic campgrounds, miles of hiking trails and breathtaking scenery. If you are planning on hiking thru the park, trails maps are available at the park headquarters in Munising. In the town of Munising is Pictured Rocks Boat Tours which travels along the cliffs of the park. It is a wonderful way to view these spectacular rock formations. Another boat tour which leaves from Munising is the Shipwreck Boat Tours. This is a glass-bottom boat which goes to three different shipwreck sites and other fascinating spots in Lake Superior. Reservations are recommended one day in advance for the shipwreck tour.




