





Take 390-N to Exit 20B on the left to merge onto 490 W toward Buffalo; Take right exit toward Spencerport/Brockport onto Rt-531 W; Then take the Rt. 259/Union St. (Spencerport) exit, turn right at end of exit ramp and proceed on Rt. 259 past the Rt. 31 intersection toward the Village of Spencerport (about a mile); Before the railroad overhead bridge, turn right onto Lyell Avenue (see DOR sign); Proceed about a mile until you see the DOR sign for the driveway to the parking lot.

From the West

Take 490-E toward Leroy/Rochester; Take Exit 7B to merge onto Rt-531 W toward Spencerport/Brockport; Then take the Rt. 259/Union St. (Spencerport) exit, turn right at end of exit ramp and proceed



on Rt. 259 past the Rt. 31 intersection toward the Village of Spencerport (about a mile); Before the railroad overhead bridge, turn right onto Lyell Avenue (see DOR sign); Proceed about a mile until you see the DOR sign for the driveway to the parking lot.

From the East

Take 490-W toward Buffalo; Take right exit toward Spencerport/Brockport onto Rt-531 W; Then take the Rt. 259/Union St. (Spencerport) exit, turn right at end of exit ramp and proceed on Rt. 259 past the Rt. 31 intersection toward the Village of

Spencerport (about a mile); Before the railroad overhead bridge, turn right onto Lyell Avenue (see DOR sign); Proceed about a mile until you see the DOR sign for the driveway to the parking lot.

Silver Club Booklets

The **Silver Club** is a way of recognizing dancers who have danced to 25 callers/cuers at club dances.

These dancers receive the Silver Club badge dangle.

At least 15 of the 25 caller/cuer signatures must be gotten at dances of clubs affiliated with the Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs. A maximum of 10 callers/cuers at non-affiliated clubs may be included. Dance-O-Rama callers/cuers may also be included.

The same caller or cuer may be used more than once, as long as they are calling/cueing at a different club.

When the required number of signatures are collected in a Silver Club booklet, it is shown to the Federation presidents or their reps, who will verify the names and authorize the dancer to wear the special Silver Club badge dangle.

Silver Club booklets will be available at D.O.R. Just ask at the registration table.

Mary swam for an hour before she came out of the water! Not bad for a gal 74 years young! On her 75th birthday, her family gave her a kayak. It became her favorite daily summer activity for the next 8 years.

Yes, Mary loved to share what she loved. And she knew the Cuba area very well since that is the area where she lived till she went off to college at Brockport. Her dad, a NY Judge, wanted her to go to a remotely located small school, but she held out for Brockport, which was close to the "Big City"! Because of Mary I learned about fabulous pancakes at the Maple Tree Inn, great Beef on Wick in Olean, country music jamming and square dancing in Allegany County, and the best locations for blueberry picking! And pie! From her skilled hands I learned to bake the best ever pie crust. Also how to kayak! Mary was a master teacher. She knew how to enjoy each and every day – and how to share it with friends!

In Mary's earlier school years, music was a daily part of her life. She learned to play the piano and also the trumpet – which led to playing in her high school band. Because of my musical interest, she returned to that love and was a willing partner for whatever type of musical concert we attended. Some were weird, some were heart-stopping, but she was always ready to expand her knowledge.

Mary was always ready to go square dancing – to a club/class dance at Copy Cats or a DBD dance with Bob Ellis. She was an eager, willing and capable partner. Mary managed to keep a positive spirit even though she was plagued with arthritis the past couple of years. When she was in rehab in late January we spoke about how things would turn around for her so she could have a good summer at Cuba Lake. Sadly it was not to be. I'm sure one reason for her outlook on life was her strong faith. Her church and her weekly Bible study classes were an everpresent part of her being. Now she is once again dancing with Dick in the heavenly dance hall to the great callers and live music of yore!

I was honored when she said we were true buddies. I will always miss my buddy and dear friend, Mary.

In Memoriam - Bill Newman

On February 14, 2011, Geneva and the Finger Lakes community lost Dr. Bill Newman, at the age of 79. Better known to his dancers as "Bill" or "Dr. Bill," he touched so many lives, in so many ways.

After interning at the Boston City Hospital, William H. Newman did military service as a surgeon in the Washington DC area, then came to Geneva in 1963 with his wife Joan, a former Boston nurse. As a vascular surgeon at Geneva General Hospital, he would run down from

Surgery to Emergency, and was particularly effective in critical vascular trauma and hemorrhage cases. In 1971, he was principal trauma advisor to the Emergency Medical Technician course when it began at the hospital.

Bill Newman was known as the Singing Surgeon, because he was singing in the operating room as well as in local theatrical productions. During a "Hospital Follies" at the Smith Opera House, his golden baritone voice filled the hall with "If I Were a Rich Man" from "Fiddler on the Roof." He also sang in choral groups and was a soloist at numerous weddings and community functions.

Bill loved golf, music, opera, and theater. But dance was his true passion, and he shared that passion with his wife, Joan. Together they were founding members of the "Geneva Friendship Squares," and Bill became the club's round dance cuer. He enjoyed teaching round dancing and offered classes at the Geneva Recreation Center, the Canandaigua FLCC, and the Seneca County Senior Center in Waterloo. At the same time, he held his own weekly classes at the American Legion and, in later years,



in Trinity Hall. Connie Williams remembers seeing Bill come in for a 4:30 p.m. lesson, dragging, having been on his feet in the operating room since 6 a.m.; after five minutes of music, he looked like it was 6 a.m. again! There was also the Newman "dance studio," the garage on Snell Road, where dances were learned and worked out so that they could be taught to others. In 2000, Bill and Joan Newman received the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award, recognizing "extensive and sustained leader-

ship over an extended period of years in round, square, or contra dancing."

In his youth, Bill Newman had been struck by lightning while fishing. He attributed to that boating accident the loss of motion he experienced in later years in one shoulder and in one hip. Despite his physical handicap, he wanted to stay active in a health-related profession, and was working part-time at the Geneva Wegmans pharmacy. Once, in the parking lot, someone asked us "Who is that elderly gentleman who can hardly walk?" And we were proud to say "That is Dr. Bill Newman. Can you believe it, he can hardly walk, but he still can dance! That is our Bill, mind-over-matter!"

We will miss Bill Newman's excellent dance instruction, both precise and patient. We will miss his sense of humor, his gentle ways, and his sparkling blue eyes. We will miss this generous and talented man.

In Memoriam - Dick Hinkle



Richard E. Hinkle, who managed Kmart stores in Niagara Falls and Buffalo and who, with his wife, Mary, led the Hinkle Round Dance Club, died February 21, 2011, in his Grand Island home. He was 79.

Born and raised in Hazleton, Pa., Dick began working as a teenager in his hometown at S.S. Kresge Co., parent company of

Kmart. He served in the Navy Reserve for eight years in his 20s.

A series of workplace promotions took Dick to Troy; Paterson, N.J.; White Plains; Hartford, Conn.; Scarsdale; and Syracuse. He moved to Niagara Falls in 1967 to open the Kmart store at Military and Packard Roads. He managed that store until 1978, then opened and managed the Kmart store on Hertel Avenue in Buffalo, where he won the company's Retailer Round Table award in 1981. He retired from the Hertel Avenue store in 1988.

Dick and Mary became active in the local round dancing community and in 1995 established the Hinkle Round Dance Club, whose dances attracted as many as 75 couples from as far away as Toronto. Their love of dancing took them around the world, and they danced on six continents, including at the Great Pyramid in Egypt and atop the Great Wall of China.

Dick was a member of the Town of Niagara Lions Club, the Town of Niagara Businessmen's Organization and the Niagara Falls and Grand Island Chambers of Commerce. He also served on the board of directors of the Society for the Promotion, Unification & Redevelopment of Niagara.

In addition to his wife, Dick is survived by two sons, and a stepson. A memorial service was held at Amherst Community Church in Snyder, N.Y.
