



DIRECTIONS TO DANCE-O-RAMA AT COSGROVE MIDDLE SCHOOL



From the South

Take 390-N to Exit 20B on the left to merge onto 490 W toward Buffalo; Take right exit toward Spencerport/Brockport onto Rt-531 W; Then take the Rt. 259/Union St. (Spencerport) exit, turn right at end of exit ramp and proceed on Rt. 259 past the Rt. 31 intersection toward the Village of Spencerport (about a mile); As you approach the village, turn right onto Lyell Avenue (see DOR sign); Proceed about a mile until you see the DOR sign for the driveway to the parking lot.

From the West

Take 490-E toward Leroy/Rochester; Take Exit 7B to merge onto Rt-531 W toward Spencerport/Brockport; Then take the Rt. 259/Union St. (Spencerport) exit, turn right at end of exit ramp and proceed



on Rt. 259 past the Rt. 31 intersection toward the Village of Spencerport (about a mile); As you approach the village, turn right onto Lyell Avenue (see DOR sign); Proceed about a mile until you see the DOR sign for the driveway to the parking lot.

From the East

Take 490-W toward Buffalo; Take right exit toward Spencerport/Brockport onto Rt-531 W;
Then take the Rt. 259/
Union St. (Spencerport)
exit, turn right at end of exit ramp and proceed on Rt. 259 past the Rt. 31 in-

tersection toward the Village of Spencerport (about a mile); As you approach the village, turn right onto Lyell Avenue (see DOR sign); Proceed about a mile until you see the DOR sign for the driveway to the parking lot.

NOTE: The CSX railroad bridge that spanned Union Street at the approach to the village has been removed.

Silver Club Booklets

The **Silver Club** is a way of recognizing dancers who have danced to 25 callers/cuers at club dances.

These dancers receive the Silver Club badge dangle.

At least 15 of the 25 caller/cuer signatures must be gotten at dances of clubs affiliated with the Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs. A maximum of 10 callers/cuers at non-affiliated clubs may be included. Dance-O-Rama callers/cuers may also be included.

The same caller or cuer may be used more than once, as long as they are calling/cueing at a different club.

When the required number of signatures are collected in a Silver Club booklet, it is shown to the Federation presidents or their reps, who will verify the names and authorize the dancer to wear the special Silver Club badge dangle.

Silver Club booklets will be available at D.O.R. Just ask at the registration table.

What Also Keeps the Budget Healthy

In Memoriam - Ray Leonard

Raymond V. Leonard Jr., age 90, a much loved and revered father and grandfather, passed away Monday, January 6, at his home in Canandaigua. He is survived by three children: Cheryl of Canandaigua, Richard (Peg) of Port Ewen, NY, and Robert (Olga) of Canadice. He leaves six grandchildren and five great-grandsons.

Ray graduated from high school in Russell, Kansas, and was a veteran of World War II, serving in the U.S. Submarine Services in the Pacific theater. He was a graduate of Brown University and was employed by General Electric as a nuclear engineer. Ray was a life member of the Submarine Veterans of World War II and a charter member of the National Association of Watch and Clock Collectors.

A long-time lover of square dancing, Ray danced with Bettie, his wife of 61 years, until she became ill. He then gave up dancing to take care of her. For several years, they wintered in Arizona, where there were many opportunities for dancing. After her death in 2005, he returned to Arizona because "I don't like cold weather," and resumed dancing.

In the spring of 2006 Ray headed back to Canandaigua to home and family. Still yearning to dance, he made inquiries and learned about an upcoming dance at Copy Cats where he could go as a single. Silver

Squares was invited to that same dance as Copy Cat guests. Anyone coming without a partner was handed a "solo" badge. Ray saw my badge, asked me to dance, and we became partners for the evening. I gave him a Silver Squares flyer suggesting he come sometime. He said he would, but due to the traveling distance, I thought that would probably not happen. However, he showed up the next Monday and became a faithful member of Silver Squares, dancing every April through September for the next eight years. He returned to his beloved Arizona every winter because "I don't like cold weather."

Ray turned 90 on November 16, 2013. His family threw a celebratory party for him in the Holiday Harbor Club House. Every member of his family was there. Some came from long distances, such as California, Chicago, and even a grandson from Egypt where he works for the World Bank. It was very much evident that he was dearly loved and revered by them all.

At his memorial service, the 23rd Psalm was used as a responsive reading. He told many people that while he was on submarine duty, he recited the Psalm every night before going to sleep. Now he is in the company of his Lord.
